





Lady and the Tramp (1955)

Directed by Hamilton Luske, Clyde Geronimi, Wilfred Jackson, music by Oliver Wallace

This is one of Disney's great animated classics — an extravaganza of color and music featuring a pedigree spaniel who angers two Siamese cats enroute to romance with the likable mongrel who champions her cause.

Released in 1955, *Tramp* was the first animated feature from Disney to make use of Cinemascope. The film is also noteworthy for its refreshingly realistic subject matter. Indeed, prior to 1955, films coming out of the Disney Studio had focused almost exclusively on fantastical locales — be it *Dumbo's* circus or *Peter Pan's* London. *Tramp*, on the other hand, utilizes an American city for its backdrop. This makes the film far more informal and familiar. Its success helped set the stylistic tone for many future productions.

Like many of Disney's great animated films, *Tramp* appears in theaters very rarely. It is, however, a home video hit of immense magnitude. Now, Blackhawk customers can own this cartoon classic at unprecedented savings. 76 min. Color. VHS Only VWD582

The Wizard of Oz (1939)

Eternally entertaining, critic Leonard Maltin described this MGM classic as being "just as good the fifteenth time as it is the first." Never has a truer statement been made. Sporting an Oscar-winning score and consistently stellar performers (several of whom, curiously, were not among the studio's starting line-up), *The Wizard Of Oz* literally pulses with Hollywood magic — an example of the MGM musicals at their grandest.

It is widely known, of course, that Shirley Temple (as Dorothy) and W.C. Fields (as the Wizard) were first slated to headline *Oz*.

Now, in retrospect, such casting seems incomprehensible.

Indeed, as we quickly approach the 50th anniversary of *Oz's* premier, one can't help but be struck by the film's artful simplicity and unaffected wholesomeness. Rarely has a single movie produced so many memorable lines and hummable tunes. Certainly, songwriters E.Y. Harburg and Harold Arlen deserve a lot of the credit. Responsible for songs like "Over The Rainbow" and "If I Only Had A Brain," the pairing made truly beautiful music under Victor Fleming's solid direction. High Noon (1952)

Gary Cooper, Grace Kelly, Lloyd Bridges, Thomas Mitchell, Katy Jurado, Otto Kruger, Lon Chaney, Henry Morgan, directed by Fred Zinnemann

Arguably the best Western of all time, *High Noon* is tautly structured and creatively conceived to inject suspense and subtext into a genre too often reserved for overly simple allegories of good and evil. Credit for the film's success must be shared at least three ways: Gary Cooper for his Oscar-winning performance, Fred Zinnemann for slick direction and author Carl Foreman for a narrative so hauntingly innovative that, after surviving it, you will never look at a ticking clock the same way again.

Nominated for a total of six Academy Awards (including best picture, screenplay and director), *High Noon* chronicles the final hours prior to Cooper's lone confrontation with a gang of vengeful killers. The townsfolk he's sworn to protect have abandoned him. Even stunning new-bride Grace Kelly threatens to leave if Cooper insists on defending his gutless constituents. Thus, the stage is set for a truly nerve-wracking countdown — as director Zinnemann cross-cuts rapidly between the local rails, a ticking clock and lawman Cooper's quietly resigned visage.

Unequaled in the annals of Western classics, *High Noon* combines lasting watchability with unparalleled, edge-of-the-seat suspense. The result is deeply entertaining and eminently collectible. 85 min. B&W VRP1800 Reg. \$39.95 Sale Price \$19.95



Shall We Dance (1937)



Much of the crew that brought us the wonderful *Top Hat* (and nine other Astaire-Rogers films before and after), reunited here to deliver yet another winning musical. Once again, Mark Sandrich ably directs America's finest dancing duo — amid charming Gershwin melodies like the Oscar-nominated "You Can't Take That Away From Me," "Let's Call The Whole Thing Off" and "They All Laughed."

Happily, Astaire and Rogers don't disappoint. After all, by 1937, America had come to expect perfection from its premier movie dancers. And while the premise in *Shall We Dance* is far from complicated, the choreography and romance are first-rate. Box-office response was awesome.

Beautiful to look at, and highlighted by great tunes, *Shall We Dance* is as enjoyable as any of the best Astaire-Rogers dance spectacles. It's a great film in a great series — highlighted by Astaire's pioneering technique and easy-going wit. Watching *Shall We Dance*, one can easily see how Astaire singlehandedly restyled song-and-dance movies. Eternally graceful, he is a joy to behold. 116 min. B&W VRP7730 \$19.95

By 1942, Roy Rogers had quietly succeeded Gene Autry as the undisputed King of the Cowboys. A big part of Rogers' appeal were Republic productions like *Sons of the Pioneers* and *Romance on the Range*. Now, these two films (along with six others) are available to Blackhawk customers as part of the Roy Rogers Matinee Double Feature Collection. Included is *Susanna Pass* (Dale Evans' comeback film after her marriage to Rogers in 1947) and *King of the Cowboys* (the only Rogers' Western detailing the singing cowboy's contribution to the war effort).

Citizen Kane (1941)

Orson Welles, Joseph Cotten, Everett Sloan, Agnes Moorehead, Ray Collins, George Coloursis, Dorothy Comingore, Ruth Chatterton, directed by Orson Welles

If there is any film that typifies landmark status, it must be *Citizen Kane* — consistently named the greatest American movie of all time by critics and audiences alike. And yet, few realize that *Kane* was a financial bomb in its first release. Disappointed executives at RKO responded by stripping a young Orson Welles of all creative freedom on his subsequent projects. The result was a sad number of forgettable follow-ups, many of which were ruined by inept editing behind Welles' back.

Of course, *Kane*, itself, remains a cinematic masterpiece. Looking back, it's clearly the triumphant debut of a filmmaker with great vision, power and scope. That Hollywood never learned to appreciate the genius of Orson Welles is truly unfortunate.

On its own merits, *Citizen Kane* has influenced countless directors by example — through novel construction and an innovative approach to cinematography and sound. The script is bold and uncompromising in its treatment of a newspaper magnate's life. As to whether the Kane character is, as rumored, based upon the life of William Randolph Hearst, that's hardly important. What is important is that *Citizen Kane* represents an undisputed pinnacle in American movie-making. It is, undoubtedly, the most collectible film ever made. 119 min. B&W. VHS Only VNO8002

Back To The Future (1985)

Inevitably, one's first reaction to Steven Spielberg's *Back To The Future* is the compulsive desire to see it again. The film is so chock full of comic genius and relentless pacing that every false ending leaves you praying for another. Hence, when the curtain finally falls, there is a combined sense of exhilaration and regret. How could two hours have passed so quickly?

The answer, to a large degree, is the deliciously on-target performance of Michael J. Fox. As a present-day teen whose trip through time lands him in the 1955 orbit of his pre-wed parents, Fox is right-on all the time. From pratfalls and double-takes to elaborate set-pieces and barbed one-liners, there is never a moment when we, as an audience, aren't completely enthralled.

Backing our elfin hero is a supremely well-crafted screenplay by director Robert Zemeckis (*Romancing the Stone*) and co-writer Bob Gale — not to mention a top-notch supporting cast, incredible special effects and a slick soundtrack featuring tunes by Chuck Berry and Huey Lewis and the News. A young Bette Davis received her sixth Oscar nomination for her role as a fragile Bostonian heiress who overcomes a neglected childhood, the demise of her cruel mother and unrequited love to blossom under the care of psychiatrist Claude Rains.

One of the most romantic films of its decade, *Now, Voyager* is further buoyed by Max Steiner's Oscar-winning score and a number of memorable scenes. Chief among these is Davis' parting line to lover Paul Henreid "Don't let's ask for the moon, we have the stars", plus Henreid's simultaneous lighting of two cigarettes for himself and Davis. The story is courtesy of Olive Prouty's novel. It focuses on Davis' transformation from a wounded spinster to a confident, giving woman. Indeed, it is Davis' acquired ability to give that furnishes our heroes with the only recourse for their forbidden love.

A joyous tearjerker in the classic sense, *Now, Voyager* is quintessential movie romance. Deeply touching and undeniably effective, the film also garnered an Oscar nomination for Gladys Cooper as Davis' cold-hearted mother. 117 min. B&W. VHS Only VMG1316

The cast of *Dark Victory* reads like a Who's Who of Hollywood mythos. Supporting Davis in her ultimately bittersweet portrayal of a dying playgirl are three stars who, in 1939, were all on the verge of huge successes: Humphrey Bogart (*pre-Maltese Falcon*), Ronald Reagan (*pre-politics*) and Geraldine Fitzgerald (*pre-Wuthering Heights*). As for Davis, she was nominated as best actress herein. *Victory*, itself, was a best picture contender.
