D. W. Griffith's
JUDITH OF BETHULIA
(1913)

with **BLANCHE SWEET, HENRY B. WALTHALL, MAE MARSH, ROBERT HARRON and LILLIAN GISH**

Judith of Bethulia was Griffith's first feature-length production, and one of his first films produced in California. It was filmed in the summer of 1913 at a reported budget of \$18,000. It ended up costing \$36,000—almost more than the directors of Biograph could endure.

Griffith wanted to produce long films—Biograph wanted to stick with one and two-reelers which could be produced at modest budgets. Legend has it that *Judith of Bethulia* was released a reel at a time, as a serial, to conform to Biograph's pattern of short films. This may well have been the case in certain territories served by General Film Company exchanges, but records do indicate that *Judith* was basically

distributed as the four reel feature which Griffith intended.

This biblical spectacle was a forerunner of *Intolerance* which Griffith was to make only three years later. It is being presented by Blackhawk in the original form in which it was placed in distribution on Nov. 24, 1913.

Work, Charlie's eighth film in the series by Essanay, was filmed at the Bradway mansion studio at 147 North Hill Street in Los Angeles. The studio exterior is briefly visible in scenes near the beginning and end of the film.

With Chaplin in *Work* are Billy Armstrong and Marta Golden as the husband and wife, Edna Purviance as the maid, Charles Insley as the boss, and Leo White and Paddy McGuire. The film is presented very much as it was when released by Essanay on June 21, 1915.

Clarence is a wealthy industrialist. Joyce is his daughter. One day Charley bumps into Joyce on a busy business street in front of a "fortune telling" scale. Joyce is really "shook" when the card she gets carries Charley's picture as the man she will marry. Moments later, Charley gets his fortune and—guess what—whose picture do you suppose is on his fortune card?

About this time we see Edwin Maxwell coming through a sanitarium gate. He walks in front of a limousine owned by Mr. Wilson and is unhurt, but is offered a ride into town. Clarence isn't going as far as Edwin's destination, so he instructs the chauffeur to take Maxwell wherever he is going. Then, guess who gets hit next? Charley is the victim. The chauffeur gives Charley one of Wilson's cards—Charley thinks Maxwell is Wilson. Maxwell takes Charley

to his address, where he operates the Elite House Haunting Corporation. Charley becomes a salesman and his first client—a real estate agent who sold the mansion to Wilson just the month before and who now wishes to get it back for the former owner—who'll double the price at which he sold it!

THE BLIND BEGGAR OF JERUSALEM

A Cathedral Films Production/A Blackhawk Films Release

The Blind Beggar of Jerusalem is the story of a young man, Jemuel, who has been blind from birth. Jesus' attention has been called to Jemuel by certain of his disciples. Without identifying himself, Jesus puts clay upon the blind man's eyes and tells him to "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam." This done, Jemuel sees for the first time in his life. But the Scribes and Pharisees hear of this, and look upon it as being a false claim. Nonetheless, Jemuel and his mother and father, are ordered to appear before the temple authorities, who try to tear down the story of how he regained his sight. Being unsuccessful in this, they banish Jemuel from the Temple.

Banishment from the temple is a heavy weight to bear, particularly for Jemuel's father. Jemuel decides to leave home rather than impose this burden on his father, too. But just as he is about to leave, his father returns home reporting that he has just heard Jesus speak, and the family is united in following the Master.

BLACKHAWK'S NEWSREEL

When, several months ago, we announced the availability of Edison's *The Great Train Robbery* in a part color version with those scenes originally offered in hand colored form on some prints which Edison sold in 1903 and 1904, we tried to emphasize that this coloring was primitive indeed. Many of you will be interested in a report recently received from Stan Oliner, Laramie County Librarian, Cheyenne, Wyoming, who wrote:

"We showed our 16mm. print of *The Great Train Robbery*, *At Sherman Hill on the Union Pacific* and a color-sound film obtained from the railroad last Thursday afternoon on a continuous showing basis in our local melodrama theatre. The entire presentation lasted fifty minutes, and we somehow managed to pack 700 people into this small, small theatre.

"The audience just went wild over the *Robbery* print. I used our p. a. system to read a portion of Mr. Eastin's column concerning the use of color in 1903. I regret that we did not hire a piano player, but it seems likely that this showing of train films in Cheyenne is going to become a regular event."

WHAT'S COMING IN SUPER 8?

With our release schedule of items in super 8 accelerating now at a rapid rate, we're happy to report that, following our initial super 8 feature release, *Judith of Bethulia*, announced in this Bulletin, we're preparing a super 8 version of *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* which will shortly be followed by *Intolerance* in super 8. Hopefully, *The Hunchback* will be ready for us to announce definitely in Bulletin No. 182 and *Intolerance* in Bulletin No. 183.

Other items that have been extremely popular in regular 8mm. on which super 8 editions are now in preparation are the four chapters of the biographical film on *Adolph Hitler* and the four chapters making up the general history of World War I, *The Great War*. Both of these will be coming along shortly.

COMING ATTRACTIONS

We have a number of feature films in various stages of preparation, and it appears that the next one to be released will be *D'Artagnan*, an adaptation of Dumas' *The Three Musketeers* which was produced and directed by Thomas H. Ince. This film was actually finished by Ince before the formation of Triangle but as it had not actually been committed to Mutual for distribution, Triangle purchased the film and placed it in release as one of their earliest subjects. The film stars Orrin Johnson, Dorothy Dalton, Walt Whitman, Rhea Mitchell and Louise Glaum.

In 1920, some months before Douglas Fairbanks' production of *The Three Musketeers* had its premiere, *D'Artagnan* was retitled *The Three Musketeers* and reissued by the Film Distributors League. Thus, this five-year-old film was in direct competition with the Fairbanks' version. Triangle sued Fairbanks, but critics took the side of Fairbanks, stating that his adaptation was more in the spirit of the times. The New York Times, a leading critic, admitted that Fairbanks played "a D'Artagnan Dumas never dreamed of", but chided Triangle for "attempting to defraud audiences". Such criticism points out how rapidly the art of the film advanced.

Rising to the defense, Ince pointed out that there could be no fair comparison with the million dollar Fairbanks film, as his 1915 version cost but \$15,000 to produce!

One of the most popular series of films we have issued is the six-chapter *The Golden Twenties*. Some of these chapters are already available in super 8, others will follow soon. Because of this, we have seized upon the opportunity to make available a similar film from the decade of the thirties, one called, *Life in the Thirties*, adapted, under license from McGraw-Hill Book Company, from an hour long NBC special of several years ago. This subject will be issued on two moderately long chapters, *The Coming of the New Deal* and *A Rendezvous With Destiny*, the first of which we expect to announce in our next Bulletin.

A quarterly publication of absorbing interest to everyone interested in the field of silent films is *Classic Film Collector*, a newspaper-tabloid type of periodical issued four times a year, published by Samuel K. Rubin, 734 Philadelphia Street, Indiana, Pennsylvania 15701. Its usual size is in the range of fifty pages, containing thousands of words of text and many illustrations. It is written by collectors—for collectors—and we recommend it. Subscription prices are currently \$3.00 per year for the United States—\$4.00 per year if mailed in an envelope. This story of the Revolutionary War was adopted from one written by Robert W. Chambers. It was produced by D. W. Griffith at the Griffith Studio at Mammoth, N. Y., with outside sequences filmed on the Shirley and Westover plantations along the James River in Virginia, and in Williamsburg—a decade before Williamsburg's restoration. It is presented in 8mm. form substantially as it was at the time of its initial release.

with LILLIAN GISH, RICHARD BARTHELMLESS and DONALD CRISP
Released in the spring of 1919, Broken Blossoms, the last of D. W. Griffith's supremely great films, is as tender and sensitive a production as "Intolerance" and "The Birth of a Nation" are spectacular, and Griffith's skill for using the camera to bare the hearts and emotions of his characters is at the best in this story.

From an era when movie-makers are said to have ended every film with a love scene, The Coward doesn't even really have a romance. The Coward is a Civil War production putting the stress on realism in what was very much an age of innocence, during the First World War. This film only serves to amplify the legend of producer Thomas H. Ince.

Here's one of the off-beat Western roles that was somehow typical of Bill Hart—the Sky Pilot whose wife is lured away from her rather drab existence by the dashing and debonaire operator of the town's saloon. However, there's nothing tame about the way Hart handles it. "The Disciple" was the first William S. Hart production made by Thomas H. Ince to be released as a Triangle Play in November, 1915.

EAST IS EAST (1916)

Florence Turner first appeared in the movies for Vitaphone in 1906. She became such a prominent member of the Vitaphone stock company that she was known as "The Missograph Girl". When Mutual Film Corporation was founded in 1912, Turner left Vitaphone to appear in Mutual movies. With the coming of the feature length film in the years just before World War I, her career reached its zenith in the series in which she starred.

East Is East was a most unusual film for its time, a production filmed by an American company in England—and during World War I, at that. Its theme is the usual rags to riches climb to success formula so very popular during the early years of the century.

In less than a year, so sensational had been Fairbanks' rise to popularity, he was one of the top stars of the screen. In 1917, the British Government asked D. W. Griffith to make a propaganda picture on behalf of the Allied War effort. "Hearts of the World" was the result. Filmed in both France and England, and completed in the United States, it proved to be one of Griffith's most popular films. And it brought to Lillian and Dorothy Gish, and to Erich von Stroheim, added impetus to their careers.

"The Perfect Clown" was directed by Fred Newmeyer, one of the top comedy directors of the period, who was responsible for most of the Harold Lloyd features of the 1920's. It went into distribution late in the fall of 1925. This feature is substantially complete, and representative of many comedy features of the mid-twenties and of Semon's work at that particular time. It will be a welcome addition to your collection.

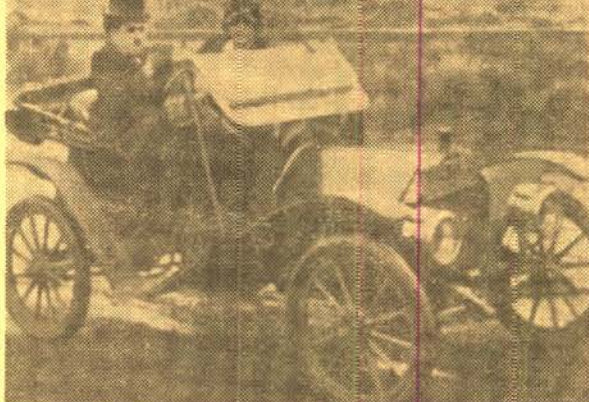

Charlie overhears the plot to destroy the ship... finds the dynamite and throws it overboard! Among the highlights are Charlie's antics in attempting to serve meals aboard the rocking ship.

The theme of a shanghai-himself is one that has been used many times in both fiction and films. The similarities—and the differences—between Chaplin's Shanghai and Laurel and Hardy's The Live Ghost make for interesting program pairing.

CHAPTER I—THE WAR CLOUDS BREAK

The first chapter of "The Great War" is devoted to background personalities and events of the period—the pomp, pageantry and parades that were the order of the day in Europe—the visit of King George and Queen Mary of England to Germany and the king's first cousin, Kaiser Wilhelm II, German Emperor and King of Prussia. (Nicholas II, czar of all the Russians, is also related to the Kaiser.)

But there are two camps—the Triple Alliance headed by the Kaiser and taking in Germany, Austria-Hungary and Italy; and the Triple Entente made up of France, Great Britain and Russia. And, on June 24, 1914, Archduke Francis Ferdinand, heir to the throne of Austria-Hungary, is assassinated.

Imperial Germany had become a power at sea—had developed the modern submarine—and its gun crews on surface vessels had been precisely trained. All Europe was like dry tinder—ready to explode—and the murder of the Archduke provided the spark. The attack on the west began with Germany's advance through little Belgium and in fourteen days the German armies had swept 250-miles.

CHAPTER III—1917: YEAR OF CRISIS

The American Expeditionary Force begins to move "over there." Inadequate weapon stocks at home force draftees to train with wooden cannon. U. S. Admiral Sims develops the convoy system for Atlantic crossings. The 1st Division disembarks on June 28, 1917, and begins its rail trip to French training locations. Disastrous attacks by the Germans in the early spring of 1917 have led to spot mutinies in the French army. In both the French and British Armies, casualties exceed replacement abilities. In the rainy fall of 1917, the trenches run in an unbroken line from Switzerland to the English Channel. Lenin overthrows Kerensky's provisional government in Russia. German and Allied losses mount—over half a million men are killed or wounded. Stubborn British defenses finally blunt the German attacks. On April 29, Ludendorff calls off the greatest offensive Germany had ever launched and mounting American manpower begins to weigh on the Allied side.

CHAPTER IV—THE YANKS ENTER

In this final chapter of "The Great War", the action begins in late May of 1918 when the French retreat at Chemin des Dames ridge—but the U. S. Marines move forward. U. S. youth and vitality encouraged the French. The airplane was a new weapon of war, and General Billy Mitchell commanded the greatest concentration of air power ever assembled. The air aces were Von Richthofen of Germany, Fonck of France, Mannock of Britain, Bishop of Canada, and Rickenbacker of the United States.

The Americans got their first real combat experience at Selcheprey and Cantigny. Losses are heavy—but the Big Parade is under way. Chateau-Thierry was the new milestone. Belleau Wood and Vaux were captured. French morale jumps. Pershing was cautious—estimating that the war might end by the fall of 1919 "with eighty U. S. divisions." The Germans failed at Amiens, August 8, 1918 was their "black day." Allied victories at Saint-Mihiel and the Meuse-Argonne net thousands of prisoners. And then on Nov. 11, 1918, the Armistice. Crowds throughout the Allied world give vent to an overwhelming emotional release. The A. E. F. starts home. And, at home, the heroes parade and the "War To End War" is over!

THEODORE ROOSEVELT

CHAPTER I—POLITICIAN AND PRESIDENT

A year after his marriage to a Boston debutante Teddy's aristocratic friends were shocked when he embarked on a career of politician. After the death of his mother and wife he sought escape in North Dakota as a cowhand.

Teddy resumed his career in politics as Civil Service Commissioner in Washington, D. C. He seized the opportunity to become a soldier and he and his Rough Riders became heroes of the war.

He was elected vice-president with McKinley. Theodore Roosevelt became President of the United States after the assassination of McKinley in 1901.

As Teddy covered the country in 1904 with an exhaustive schedule of speeches he was convinced that the American people would consign him to political oblivion.

Teddy was reelected by a landslide vote. Full of assurance he threw America into international politics.

At the end of his term he felt bound not to run again and hand-picked his successor, William Howard Taft. Taft carried the election with ease and Teddy went on safari in Africa.

But Teddy remained a popular hero.

In 1916, war was raging in Europe. President Wilson, reelected by a slim margin, pled for the American people to remain impartial. Teddy Roosevelt was convinced that Wilson was making a tragic error, and events soon proved that he was right.

July, 1918, just a few months before the end of the war Teddy's youngest son was killed in action. A pale and shaken Theodore Roosevelt was there to greet the doughboys when they came home.

January 6, 1919, Teddy died in his sleep. Franklin Delano Roosevelt, a distant cousin, said, "We know, yes the world knows, that Theodore Roosevelt was a great patriot and a great soul."

The two boys are still chasing, and the final sequence is a whirlwind finish at the beach, with the dramatic rescue of Louise's young ward (whom she got along with the dough, and Charley indignantly tossed to the waves. 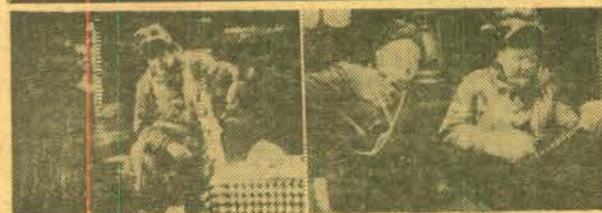

THE GREAT TRAIN ROBBERY

The Great Train Robbery is generally credited with being the first story motion picture. It certainly was the first film even to suggest what the art of the motion picture might become in later years. Here, for the first time, the unfolding of a story was captured through the lens of a moving motion picture camera. The editing of the film brought the innovation of cutting from scene to scene during the action for its narrative effect. And, the scenes were arranged to unfold the story—not simply spliced together in chronological sequence.

The original negative of The Great Train Robbery has been gone for many years—probably worn out as a result of countless printings. But Blackhawk's new version is authentic—and complete! And, in addition to being available in black and white, alternate editions incorporating in color several scenes that had been hand colored in the 35mm. print from which we made this conversion—one of a limited number of the earliest prints—are also available. These "color" scenes were laboriously done by hand to heighten the effect of gunfire, and costumes in some interiors. In the color version, a bit over one third of the footage represented by scenes is printed in Eastman Color.

An Italian "Cines" Production imported by George Kleime

In 1912, George Klein's "Kosmik Films" started to release an additional line of European films—those produced by "Cines" in Italy. "Cines" leaned heavily on the classics for story material. Critics and patrons alike applauded these films and Kleime prospered.

Richard the Lion-Hearted was adapted from the climax of Sir Walter Scott's famous novel, The Talisman. Compared with American films of 1912, it shows a distinct maturity which foreign producers had achieved, and which enabled them to retain a dominant position in the world market until the advent of World War I, when the American film took over.

You'll enjoy the chivalry of Sir Kenneth and the perfidy of Monserrat, as Richard the Lion-Hearted flashes across the screen just as it was first seen by nickelodeon audiences in the United States on August 31, 1912.

The longest serial or series film in the era of the silents was The Hazards of Helen, produced by Kalem from 1914 to 1917, running a total of 119 almost weekly episodes. While all of those films dealt with railroading, the activities of "the telegraph operator at the station down the line" were often rather superficially set against this background. But this episode is no routine chapter, for it deals almost as much with locomotives and trains as it does with the players.

And the locomotive most prominently in evidence is no ordinary locomotive, as any rail fan can attest. No. 3001 of the Santa Fe, star of The Leap From the Water Tower (along with Helen Holmes), was one of a series of ten that were, in 1914, the largest engines that had ever been built. No. 3001 started out in 1904 as Santa Fe's 2-10-2 No. 957. But the need for more power was so great that, in 1911, the Santa Fe had the Baldwin Locomotive Works construct ten 2-10-0 units which were assembled at Topeka onto ten existing 2-10-2's, part in the 900-series, built in 1904, and part in the 1500-series, built in 1905.

The action sequences in this film were photographed in the vicinity of Cajon Pass in California, while the major railroad yard scenes were taken at San Bernardino. The Leap From the Water Tower, ninth film in The Hazards of Helen, is presented here just as it appeared when first released by Kalem on January 9, 1915.

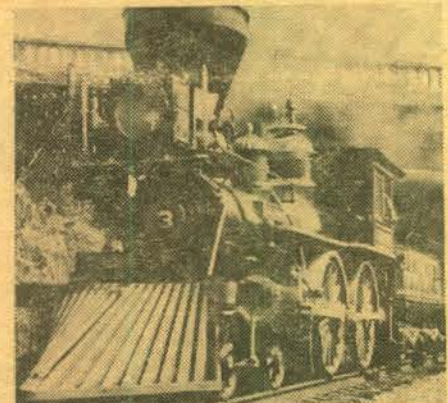

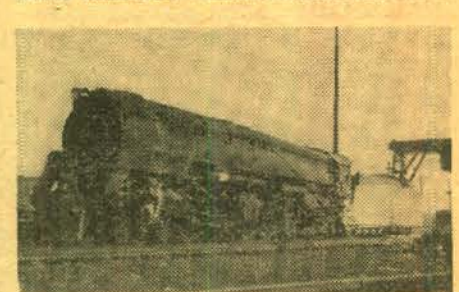

We travel through Los Reyes, Amecameca, Ozumba, Napahtla, and on to Cuautla. We highball through the high country, cross the classic masonry bridge at Dzumbra, travel in the shadow of Mount Ixtacubuatl, around long series of S curves and into the station at Cuautla.

Our return follows a diminutive narrow gauge freight. At Amecameca we spot an 1899 Baldwin-built narrow gauge 4-6-0 owned by the San Rafael Paper Co., and this old timer is badly leaking steam. Back in Mexico City our arrival coincides with that of our narrow gauge freight.

TROLLEY LINES AND ELEVATEDS OF METROPOLITAN NEW YORK

In the area of "elevateds" we see the yards of the BMT division, which, in Manhattan, is a subway system. Then we shift to the Third Avenue Transit System which ceased operation in 1955, and see a wide variety of equipment in operation at a number of locations.

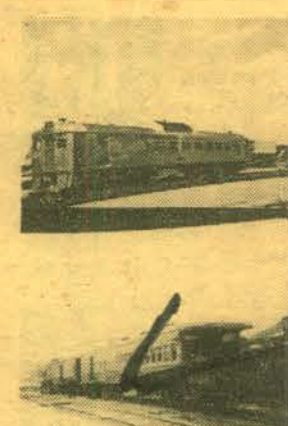
