**BERLIN:
THE SYMPHONY
OF A

(1927)**

With the single exception of NANOOK OF THE NORTH, Ruttmann's famous BERLIN is the most important and influential non-fiction film of the silent era. Even today, with its subject a world war and half a century away, BERLIN is brimming over with ideas about the expressive possibilities of film. It is so packed with energy and imagination that it still stuns viewers who discover it anew, and still inspires forty-five out of every fifty young filmmakers who see it into going out and producing an imitation.

At its simplest level, BERLIN creates an impression of the city from dawn to late at night. In what John Grierson called "smooth and lively tempo'd visuals," a train swings in from the suburbs, wheels, rails, details of engines, telegraph wires, landscapes and other simple images flow along in procession; the rhythm of the editing conveys the rhythm of the train click-clacking over the rails, causing viewers to feel, purely from visual cues, the experience of riding on a train. So it goes through the day: factories get under way, the streets fill, the traffic larkies. Noontime and lunch. Ruttmann contrasts the simple meals of workers, the elegant meals of the wealthy diners, and the huge meals of the elephants in the Berlin zoo. The city resumes work, but is brought to a halt by a rainshower in mid afternoon. There is a casual suicide at dusk; in the evening, it is cabaret, Charlie Chaplin, and a veritable geometry of dancing legs.

On the surface, then, BERLIN is about the city, but looking a little deeper, it is also about the art of film itself. That title THE SYMPHONY OF A GREAT CITY is not pretension, for in BERLIN Ruttmann breaks clean away from the movie tradition of stories borrowed from plays and novels, and creates tension and excitement not from the plot line but from his selection, arrangement and pacing of thousands of little observations.

One critic who realized this wrote that "Ruttmann's film could scarcely be used to guide a stranger arriving in Berlin for the first time. It summarizes far more the memories and residual moods of a traveller leaving that city. It nevertheless the film contains a characterization of the city, it is not in the shots themselves, but through their montage and rhythm." Like many a symphony in music, there is a "program" — a narrative element — to serve as a guide, but the deepest pleasure from BERLIN, is to be found from viewing it over and over again, and developing an appreciation of its melody, harmony, feeling and form.

Blackhawk's release is by arrangement with the original producer, and our prints are of finest photographic quality. A sound version, carrying the original synchronized score composed for the film by Edmund Meisel, is in preparation and will be released when ready.

THE MOTHER AND THE LAW

(1914)

with MAE MARSH
and
ROBERT HARRON

Immediately after shooting THE BIRTH OF A NATION, Griffith began on a short, simple picture, THE MOTHER AND THE LAW, in October, 1914. By January it had virtually been completed and he left Hollywood to oversee the New York premiere of THE BIRTH. His Civil War film proved such a success that Griffith began to believe in only gigantic productions. He decided not to release THE MOTHER AND THE LAW, but to include its footage in his four-part super-epic INTOLERANCE.

When Griffith returned to Hollywood in the Spring of 1915, he began to expand THE MOTHER AND THE LAW. By summer he had built the largest interior set yet made, for the ballroom scene, and had hired the State Militia and hundreds of extras to stage the strike. In the ensuing months he continued to improve THE MOTHER AND THE LAW, changing sequences and sometimes adding shots within episodes already done. Some of the sets were knocked down and rebuilt four or five times as Griffith continually reshot sequences.

After all this work, Griffith unfortunately had to trim his story so INTOLERANCE would not run so long. When his super-epic proved less than a financial triumph,

however, he removed the modern story reassembled the negative, improved upon its editing, shot a few new scenes (in 1918), returned the shots that had previously been omitted, cut a few that had previously been included, and issued the film separately in the fall of 1919. This picture wasn't an outstanding moneymaker either. When, later, more prints of INTOLERANCE were needed, Griffith cut up THE MOTHER AND THE LAW negative, trimmed it down again, and put it back in INTOLERANCE.

The story was taken straight from newspaper headlines of the day and is an expansion of the two-reel Biograph film THE REFORMERS, also released this month by Blackhawk. It is Griffith's trenchant comment on the do-gooders who interfere with the freedoms and rights of the people. The "uplifters" were based on John D. Rockefeller and his pious son who had tried to cleanse New York's vices; they also secretly owned a large share in two companies which ruthlessly cut workers' salaries, causing two particularly vicious strikes of the period. Griffith was a sentimentalist but no Puritan. He makes a good case for saloons, brothels, love and people's freedom to live their lives as they see fit.

Blackhawk's prints of THE MOTHER AND THE LAW were converted from a 1919 release print, but have been expanded with additional material culled from INTOLERANCE which Griffith omitted in 1919 because it would then have "dated" the picture (street views, and references to public taverns, for example). A few titles and shots referring to the Kaiser, again reflecting a 1919 attempt to "up-date" the film, have been cut out. The original release also had a happy ending, which Griffith himself later removed; we have respected his wishes by leaving it off, too.

Long overshadowed by INTOLERANCE, THE MOTHER AND THE LAW, has been unjustly neglected. It is the only film Griffith had the opportunity of improving over a five-year period and remains one of his most brilliant works, certainly his greatest achievement in editing. Never was his cutting more audacious, his pace so relentless, his acting so controlled, and his story so moving.

THE WANDERER (1913)

with HENRY B. WALTHALL, MAE MARSH,
LIONEL BARRYMORE, KATE BRUCE

The Biograph Company released THE WANDERER on May 3, 1913. The Spanish fantasy, filmed in San Fernando, California, compares the life of a wandering piper, played by Henry B. Walthall, who prefers "seeking the true flute note to the perpetual strife for gains," to the lives of a grasping merchant and a quarrelsome husband, played by Lionel Barrymore. Each time the piper's tune is heard, it brings tranquility and proportion to those whose lives are consumed by avarice and sin. In its theme, THE WANDERER makes a fascinating comparison with THE HOUSE OF DARKNESS, released the very next week by Biograph (and re-released last month by Blackhawk). Both films concern the soothing effect of music on disordered minds, although the idea is as old as when David played for Saul.

The New York Dramatic Mirror praised the drama, saying that "for those who invite the veiled symbolism, the mystic problem bordering on the modern fairy tale, there is an irresistible allurements in the picture," but feared "it is probable that much of the meaning and poetic beauty of the story will pass over the head of the average spectator."

THE WANDERER was one of the first films for which "the average spectator" could learn from Biograph the identities of the actors. It is also one of Griffith's last one-reelers, a piper's tune and a prelude to the symphonies he would soon produce.

THE REFORMERS (1913)

with MAE MARSH, ROBERT HARRON, WILLIAM
MURRAY, WALTER MILLER, CHARLES MAILES
and KATE BRUCE

THE REFORMERS, subtitled "The Lost Art of Minding One's Own Business," is one of the last films D.W. Griffith directed for the pioneer Biograph Company. Made in the same month as THE BATTLE OF ELDERBUSH GULCH and while the ambitious JUDITH OF BETHULIA was in preparation, THE REFORMERS is particularly interesting for its reflection on Griffith's social attitudes: his general distrust of crusading moral reformers, his hatred of hypocrisy, his faith in the good sense of the common man. Even more interesting, the theme and characterizations in this two-reel film are virtually identical to those of THE MOTHER AND THE LAW. Griffith's far more detailed and sensitive feature started the following year and also released as the modern day story in INTOLERANCE. This Biograph thus seems a short study for the later masterpiece, not only for Griffith as director, but also for the leading players, Mae Marsh and Robert Harron. The cast of THE REFORMER's also includes Walter Miller, Charles Hill Mailes and Kate Bruce.

The story concerns a prominent citizen who campaigns for mayor on a reform platform. Eager to root out vice and corruption in the community and uplift the lower classes, the candidate, supported by the League of Civic Purity, closes the saloons and vaudeville houses and clears the streets of prostitutes. Meanwhile, the crusader's own children fall victim of the vices of alcohol, bringing home to the zealous father the sad result of his own neglected responsibilities.

This film was restored from the original negative and the print quality is excellent.

This film, made from an original story by Lionel Barrymore, was designed to show the danger of the so-called Third Degree and the fallacy of relying implicitly upon circumstantial evidence.

Barrymore plays a substantial citizen with a jealous weakling for a brother, played by Henry B. Walthall. The two men quarrel over the younger brother's demand for money, and the weakling of a brother, who is more than half drunk, knocks his brother out and fears that he has killed him. At this moment, a reluctant burglar (Robert Harron), under the influence of an older crook, enters the house.

IN THE BORDER STATES (1910)

Like his masterpiece, THE BIRTH OF A NATION, IN THE BORDER STATES, features Henry B. Walthall as a Confederate soldier. True to the Griffith formula, the film presents a strongly knit family, threatens their survival, and after a well-paced chase, returns them to safety. Griffith started cross-cutting scenes to embellish the excitement of the chase in 1909, and he makes particularly good use of the device in this film, released on June 13, 1910. The story is by Stanner E.V. Taylor, who wrote many of the Biograph one-reelers (including D.W.'s first directional effort, THE ADVENTURES OF DOLLIE) until 1911.

MUSSOLINI'S DECADE OF PROGRESS

(1932)


This film was a special newsreel released to theatres on the tenth anniversary of Mussolini's ascent to power. Beginning in 1922, it shows Fascisti militants in picturesque regalia marching into Rome as Benito Mussolini is named premiere and becomes, overnight, virtual dictator of Italy.

Two segments of the film present exclusive interviews with Mussolini in which the Premier addresses the Movietone camera in English. One of these, the very first talking picture made abroad, expresses friendship to the American nation "from-a-de Pacifica to the Atlantic" and praises the wonderful energy of the American "peep." At the time of this film, Mussolini's English was very limited and he read his text from chalk boards held up out of camera range by the American Ambassador; but looking at the final result, Mussolini was impressed. "Let me talk through your machine once a week," he is reported to have said, "and I will need no other weapon." In the second interview, the Premier pledges himself to peace, saying that "Italy will never take the initiative in promoting war."

Also included in this film are scenes showing the aftermath of a 1926 assassination attempt, Mussolini starting a reclamation project, and Mussolini and the King at a Bersaglieri review. In the manner of early sound newsreels, only direct recording (without narration) was used for many scenes, and Mussolini's departure after his first call on the Pope, presented without elaboration but complete with footsteps, door slams and band music, provides an electrifying jump in immediacy when contrasted to the silent story with narration that immediately preceded it.

In 1932, many American observers did not foresee Mussolini as the fascist tiger or Italy as the adversary she was to become less than a decade later.

FILMING THE GREAT (1934)

"Adventures of a Newsreel Cameraman"

One of the newsreel's lasting contributions to twentieth-century culture was the de-mystification of rulers and celebrities who had in the past been seldom seen or photographed. This film, narrated by Lew Lehr, is a horn of plenty pouring out the famous people who had either been captured in some ceremonial function or had posed especially for the cameras of Fox Movietone News. Shown are the Kings of England, Siam, Belgium, Egypt, Norway, Sweden, and the ill-fated Alfonso XIII of Spain, who invites Americans to visit Spain "where there are very good roads now — you can go as fast as you like and have a jolly good time."

Also shown are Emperors of Japan, Manchuria, and Ethiopia; Kamei Pasha of Turkey; Mussolini, President von Hindenburg with Chancellor Adolf Hitler; ex-Kaiser Wilhelm and his son, the former Crown Prince, who blames the Depression on the Treaty of Versailles; and Queen Wilhemina of the Netherlands. The film ends with scenes of President Franklin Roosevelt visiting our air base in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, described in the narration as "a remote possession", and with scenes of the President sailing with his four sons.





In the early years of the movies, trains and railroads were a favorite subject for action dramas. Trains were the fastest things on wheels and train robbery and train wrecks were front page news.



A FATAL SWEET TOOTH is a story of the basest corruption imaginable—a constable who steals to support his incurable craving — for sweets. He hatches a clever plot to pin a honey theft on his assistant. The object of his larceny also happens to be the father of his assistant's best girl, and the assistant, blissfully unaware of the plot, manages to save the day and win the girl, all with the help of a bear and the Keystone Cops gone rural.

You will find this film typical of the light hearted but sometimes heavy-handed ridicule which Keystone was so adept at dispensing.

There are some comic encounters in the police station, where the stenographer "vamps" the desk sergeant, and the two girl friends, who hate each other, are confined to the same room.

Perhaps the principal interest in this film is the appearance of Lon Chaney's famous director, Tod Browning, as the boss. Eddie Dillon, an ex-Biographer, both directs and plays the steno's boyfriend, and Fay Tinchler was a well known comic actress of the time.



Essanay Period

Here was the time that Chaplin began to come into his own. With more time devoted to the preparation of his films, his talent became even more in evidence and there was less and less dependence on slapstick. Almost all of his Essanay films were two-reelers (most of them are or will be available from Blackhawk) and were more painstakingly produced. But so high had his popularity skyrocketed in 1915 that Mutual was able to sign him away from Essanay in February, 1916, at salary and bonus totaling \$670,000 for a year.

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


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

KID'S AUTO RACE (also known as **KID AUTO RACES AT VENICE**) is quite amusing. On short notice, Mack Sennett used to dispatch his actors and crew to improvise their comedies in the foreground of parades or races or whatever might be happening around Los Angeles. This time, the Sennett funnymen mingled with a crowd gathered to view a kiddy-car contest at Venice, then a fashionable seaside resort.

Filmed in just 45 minutes, there are no pretensions here, and the gags (there's hardly a story) all revolve around a camera-happy Chaplin, purposely, endlessly running out to obstruct the photographer's view of the kiddies racing down an incline in the background. Wandering into camera range, Chaplin invokes the ire of photographer, crew, and cops, who get quite a workout showing this hammy pest out of the way.

As only Chaplin's second comedy, there's but slight nuance to his character, yet Chaplin is outrageous and amusing all the same. Chaplin as nuisance is crude, yet undeniably funny. Miraculously, the little tramp costume, created for this film, is virtually complete with all accoutrements: close-fitting coat; bamboo

cane, oversize trousers borrowed from Fatty Arbuckle, long, enormous shoes belonging to Ford Sterling, the toothbrush mustache trimmed down from one of Mack Swain's, and a derby hat loaned by Minta Durfee's father. With but slight modification, the outfit would remain essentially unchanged for the next thirty years.

Less impromptu, but with more of the same kind of fast acrobatic slapstick was **A BUSY DAY**, with Chaplin in dame masquerade (the first of three such films) as a militant suffragette who catches "her" husband (Mack Swain) flirting with another woman. Chaplin both wrote and directed. It was his fourteenth screen appearance. Supposedly taking place at a harbor festival, the location was the San Pedro Harbor, and you'll catch glimpses of U.S. Navy ships in the background.

These twin subjects are both funny and historically interesting, the prints are sparkling, with original titles, and the price is right (they sell for \$27.50 apiece in 16mm elsewhere). How can you go wrong?





BLACKHAWK'S NEWSREEL

RAILROADS IN THE NEWSREELS

During the 1920s, the railroad was still the most romantic form of mass transportation and the newsreels pictured for posterity many of the newsworthy happenings involving the railroads. We're thus hoping, over the next several years, to issue a number of releases in a series which we plan to call "Railroads in the Newsreels" and our first release carries the tentative title, "When Steam Powered the Railroads."

Each of these releases will probably carry six or eight items from the newsreels of World War I to the end of the silents, and there will be some later coverage from the era of sound, particularly reporting on the coming of the streamliners. But there is much more footage from the sound era in the form of unedited stories, and we expect to have some complete films on the subjects of the New York Central, Pennsylvania and the Union Pacific — complete with synchronized sound.

But as a starter, the first issue

has several historic items of more than routine interest to the rail collector. The first is the contest between steam and electric power on the Virginia Railway. Two approximately equal trains of coal were being brought through the mountains on parallel tracks. One with three huge Mallet (2-10-10-2) steam locomotives, one at the head, two as pushers. The other by two of the new electrics, one at the head, one behind. The electrics won without any trouble, and our film shows it being done.

Another item shows many scenes of the Boston & Maine's new 2-8-4 Berkshire-type locomotives — a number of scenes including a prevue press performance of three of them being run alongside each other on parallel tracks.

The third item is one of the Pennsylvania's Horseshoe Curve — part of it done in the mid-twenties — part of it from a Ford Educational Weekly of World War I time. At any rate, you'll see triple headers at work boosting trains over the grade, and all sorts of interesting train activity at this favorite hunting ground for train

watchers. Watch for the first issue soon!

BLACKHAWK "STUFFERS"

Since our initial announcement last month about the subscriptions — by first class mail — of our Blackhawk stuffers, we have literally have deluged with remittances. The first announcement was for subscriptions of ten mailings of Standard 8mm for \$1.00 — or ten mailings of Super 8 for \$1.00 — or ten mailings of 16mm for \$1.00. This is the formula at which these subscriptions are still being offered in this issue of the Bulletin.

It now appears that our computer will do better by us. And perhaps in the next issue of the Bulletin we can offer a subscription that will deliver the lists of formats that you want, not just on a rigid ten issue basis, but for any reasonable period of time.

Also, the computer may make far more flexible the matter of doubling up formats. Instead of being limited to the separate subscriptions, if as an example, you are interested in Standard 8mm and 16mm, the computer can handle both, sending a new one of either format the moment they are available or, when the two formats are available at the same time, sending you both in a single mailing, counting only as one unit of your subscription rather than two.

And, the computer will enable us to carry some symbol on your subscription label indicating that

this mailing is the last of your subscription — in effect warning you of the need to renew if you wish your subscription to continue.

But for this month, subscriptions continue on the original basis. We expect by next month to be able to announce the change. And when the change is made, all present subscriptions will automatically switch over to the new system without any adverse effects for our subscribers.

SENATE BILL S. 3107

Some months ago in this column I alerted all Blackhawk's collector friends the threat posed to the issuance and collecting of even copyrighted sound films by the proposed Senate bill S.3107 which would inflict substantial penalties for the "counterfeiting" of any recordings — without clearly defining the sound tracks of motion pictures.

Fortunately this bill died in committee with the passing of the last Congress. But if there is any new threat, we'll let you know.



ALICE ON THE FARM

(1925)

When Walt Disney left Kansas City for California in 1923, he had a bankruptcy case behind him and possessed nothing but \$40 and a prototype for a new cartoon series.

After convincing his brother Roy and assorted relatives to come up with working capital, Disney found a New York distributor named Charles Mintz who was willing to pay \$1500 apiece per cartoon subject (Disney's working costs were about \$500 per reel), and "ALICE IN CARTOON LAND" was born.

Disney's ALICE was inspired by the then popular OUT OF THE INKWELL series which the Fleischer Studio was producing. In this series, Fleischer's animated Koko the Clown character would pop off the drawing board and find adventure and mischief in a live action real world. Disney decided to reverse this process and put a real little girl into an animated world.

The process was simple enough and from 1924 through 1926 while the ALICE series was produced Disney used a number of neighborhood children as actors, first photographing the simple actions of ALICE against a white backdrop, then superimposing this image over a simplified





That portion of the Boston & Maine which stretches west from Boston to Troy and Mechanicsville, N.Y. was, until the early years of this century, the Fitchburg Railroad. It has since been operated as the Fitchburg Division of the Boston & Maine.


The Hoosac Tunnel was originally thought of as a canal tunnel in 1819, but was ultimately built as a railroad tunnel between 1851 and 1876 at a cost of \$8-million to \$20-million — no one actually knows. In all, 139 lives were lost in its construction. Its building saw hand drills and black powder give way to pneumatic drills and nitroglycerine blasting. The first train was run through the tunnel on Feb. 9, 1876. Although it has a ventilating shaft of 1028 feet, it was electrified in 1911. Fires were banked and entire trains drawn through the tunnel by electric locomotives. The Boston & Maine had six electrics, generally teamed in two sets of three.

But our film shows steam locomotive activity on many parts of the B&M Fitchburg Division. 2-6-0s, 4-6-2s, 2-10-2s, 2-8-4s — as well as the electrics at the tunnel.

"Pioneer Planes, Pilots and Daredevils" is one of the most significant and certainly one of the most absorbing compilations that it has ever been Blackhawk's privilege to place in distribution. For all the years we have been working with early films, we never dreamed that some of the bits of history we are able to bring you ever existed, or if they did, ever survived the years. Not that all the film is perfect — there is some decomposition in evidence in a few of the scenes, and much of it suffers from being removed from the original negative — duped — in the days when film stocks and techniques left much to be desired. But the over-all result is amazing, and here's just part of what you'll see...

Two early French tow gliders, one a Voisin-Archdeacon and the other a Voisin-built Bleriot Model II shown crashing on the Seine River, Paris, France, 1905.

Two early French Aeroplanes. Charles Voisin flying 80 yards, Paris, 1907, and Henri Forman who flew one kilometer in 1908. Both lacked adequate control.

The Wright Brothers, successful since 1903, giving the first public demonstrations of controlled flight, as we know it today, in France, Italy and the United States.

The first movies ever made from an aeroplane as it flies over ancient Roman Aqueducts in 1908.

Orville Wright, Fort Myer, Va., within sight of the nation's Capitol. Portly President Taft, an onlooker, at this trial of an aeroplane that was to qualify for the start of what was to be the Army Air Corps.

With control problems solved, aviation comes of age in 1909. We see Louis Bleriot, who made the monoplane famous, flying the English channel although still on crutches from a previous smash-up.

Bleriot is returned to France aboard a French warship. Pilot Hubert Latham, who failed in his attempt, joins Bleriot in a parade car.

The world's first air race winners — Glenn Curtiss with his 8-cylinder pusher biplane and Louis Bleriot in his 8-cylinder monoplane, Model XII, at Rheims, France, in the winter of 1909.

1910 to 1914 — aviation's exhibition era. Here daredevil Lincoln Beachey, who was the first to loop-the-loop in America, salutes the grandstand at Iowa State Fair at eye level, then contests Eddie Rickenbacker in a 5 lap plane-car race.

We don't want to forget the intrepid inventors, ever seeking to improve the aeroplane. One we show we call "The Original Cropduster" — a combination of biplane and chopper that didn't ever get off the ground.

The planes built from 1914 to 1918 were an assorted lot, but under the impetus of World War I, there were great strides made in aviation.

The war surplus Curtiss "Jenny" spawned a whole new breed of post-war daredevils. We see Jersey Ringle whose aerial circus included 10 Jennies and 20 pilots. Included is one of their daredevil stunts — the transfer from one plane to another in midair.

All of this and much more you'll see in "Pioneer Planes, Pilots and Daredevils."

FOOLISH WIVES

(1922)

A RECONSTRUCTION OF THE
ORIGINAL FILM BY AND WITH
ERICH VON STROHEIM

After a few years of being an assistant to D.W. Griffith and a portrayer of Cruel Huns during the War, Erich von Stroheim talked Universal's Carl Laemmle into letting him direct and act in his film, BLIND HUSBANDS (1919). His second film, THE DEVIL'S PASSKEY, was also successful, and Stroheim was given a blank check for his first really big effort, FOOLISH WIVES.

Stroheim wanted to depict the confused milieu of post-war Europe in a realistic fashion, tracing all through the actions of a bogus court and his seductive, corrupt ways. The plot concerns a Russian emigre adventurer and two of his mistresses posing as his cousins, who lease a villa on the sea near Monte Carlo. When a special American envoy accompanied by his young wife comes to confer with the Prince of Monaco, the imposters are anxious to meet and cultivate them. The "count" very nearly seduces Mrs. Hughes, first in an old hut where they are forced to take refuge from a storm, and later in the tower of his villa. The tower is set on fire by his maid, whom he has also seduced, and as the "count's" escapades begin to unravel, he prepares to flee. First, however, he pays a last visit to his counterfeit, Ventucci, where he violates Ventucci's feeble-minded daughter. She is his last victim, for Ventucci kills him and deposits his body in a sewer. The Hugheses are reconciled.

Stroheim was understandably worried about being removed from this unusual venture in the midst of production, so he made himself the star actor and shot all his key scenes first, leaving his backers no choice except to continue with him through to the end or to begin all over again at prohibitive expense. But Laemmle liked Stroheim and supported the venture to the amount of \$1,103,736.38. The vast Monte Carlo set proved more expensive than Griffith's Babylon although much of the cost was for almost unobservable details, such as real plate-glass windows. Ultimately, an electric sign over Broadway spelled the director's name "Stroheim" — this film established the reputation for extravagance which helped cripple his career — but although FOOLISH WIVES lost money, its artistic success established Universal as a major studio.

WILD AND WOOLLY

(1917)

with DOUGLAS FAIRBANKS



WILD AND WOOLLY is one of those rare and delightful films which has lost none of its wit, bounce or style, despite the fact that it is more than fifty years old. Indeed, if we had to choose just one Fairbanks film that not only typified the star's own ebullient character but also could be shown without a word of explanation to a 1975 audience, WILD AND WOOLLY would undoubtedly be our choice.

In this wonderful satire, Deug lives a double life: son of the railroad magnate Collis P. Hillington, and an unwilling employee in his father's New York office, he is also "a nut on the west" who uses saddles for chairs, sleeps in a teepee erected in the living room of his father's Fifth Avenue mansion, and lives in a fantasy of the wild and woolly which, even in 1917, had been dime novel stuff for forty years. The inhabitants of Bitter Creek, Arizona, seeking funds for a rail sour to modernize their progressive little town (the filming location was the drowsy suburb, Burbank, California) call on magnate Hillington who sends his son to investigate.


The citizens of Bitter Creek decide to take an appearance which will match Jeff's ideas, but the joke turns serious when a genuine holdup and Indian attack

take place. Jeff, the butt of the joke, becomes the hero, and his singlehanded capture of the whole hostile tribe was sufficiently memorable to have been used by Roger Youngson in his wonderful anthology film Days of Thrills and Laughter.

Alistair Cooke, who rediscovered Wild and Woolly in 1940 after it had lain twenty years in obscurity, wrote at that time that the picture "is a satire on Westerns, but as a particular statement of Fairbanks' humor it is also a generous ribbing of his own battle. What he managed to do in these early comedies was not to create a positive Western character but to suggest a new view of the city clerk anywhere — as a comic imprisoned youth with a plucky eye on his early emancipation.... The audience can identify itself with those dreams of a life "away from it all" and forget the doom of their fading in the reward of a Fairbanks last reel."

—The following review of *Nanook of the North* reproduced below was written by Cecile Starr. It originally appeared in *The Saturday Review of Literature* and is here reprinted by kind permission of the author.

Robert Flaherty's *Nanook of the North* is now available for 8mm purchase. However you look at the film — as one of the all-time classics in motion picture history, as one of the great grandparents of the present-day documentary film, as a striking photographic achievement, as an exciting romance of life in the Arctic, or as an epic tale of man against the elements — one thing is certain: *Nanook of the North* is a wonderful film, and Robert Flaherty is a greater man for having made it.

The history of this film is only one small chapter in the remarkable history of Flaherty himself. It has been told and written a number of times, and I shall do my best to summarize it here. Flaherty, according to all accounts, was a man of remarkable wit and warmth, unconventionality, and stoutheartedness. He began working as a mining engineer and explorer, and on one of his early ventures into the Arctic took a camera to record what he saw. The film he brought back from this trip was subsequently destroyed by fire from his own cigarette. The loss was not mourned, however, for Flaherty found that he had taken a series of unrelated shots — "a scene of this and a scene of that." But it was enough to make him decide to go back and make a really good film about Eskimo life.

Flaherty's first concern was for financial aid, and after having been turned down by a number of potential backers, he finally succeeded in interesting a Paris fur company, Revillon Freres, in financing his trip and his film. The Eastman Kodak Company showed him how to develop and print his film as he shot it so he could see the "rushes" as he worked.

Once having reached the Arctic, Flaherty, with his heavy and cumbersome equipment which often had to be carried over long portages, found the hardships formidable, and on several occasions he almost froze to death. He spent another year with the Eskimos, and in spite of the bitter cold and the primitiveness of the life, there is reason to believe that he loved every minute of it.

When he returned to New York, he had a film the likes of which had never before been seen. And within the next few years it was seen and loved by people all over the world. It has been said of *Nanook*, as of the old British Empire, that the sun never sets on it. Perhaps this is an overstatement. But now that 8mm distribution of *Nanook* has been announced — fifty-three years after the first release of the film — it seems unlikely that its popularity will ever diminish.

Good humor is the keynote of the film, despite the grimness of the setting. Everyone seems to be playing jokes on everyone else. There are so many little jokes, in fact, that sometimes it is hard to tell where they begin and end. In the introductory scene, for example, who can help laughing when about a dozen happy men, women, and children crawl out of the top of what seems to be a bottomless kayak? And who is kidding who then later at the trading post Nanook bites into a phonograph record which he grinningly has mistaken for a new kind of canned food? After trading his furs for civilized products he presumably had no interest in (practically no equipment or clothes for food from the outside world appear in the rest of the film), Nanook sets off in the same jovial manner for a new year of catching fish through ice holes, hunting furbearing animals, building magnificent one-night homes, outwitting and outpulling walrus, and in general providing for his family and his dogs as well as a man can be expected to, circumstances being what they are.

There is beauty in *Nanook of the North* — real beauty seldom equaled on the screen: the faces and postures of the people and animals; the skilled hand at work on an igloo; the peaceful dogs rolled up into snowy roundnesses on a stormy night; expanses of snow, hills and valleys, light and shadow. And there is drama such as only a skilled artist can convey: hunting, eating, and sleeping; the training of the child to take the place of the father; the fierceness of starving huskies; the limp, dead seal; the code of the walrus; the menacing sky; the magnitude of the place and the occasion.

As long as films can be preserved, and longer, this film will live as a master-unique in motion-picture history. But my word is not enough; here are the words of other reviewers: "It contains more beauty, drama, suspense and excitement than a dozen average films." "Every shot is composed with the eye of an artist." "Nanook is filmmaking as we had almost forgotten it — a sequence of moving pictures telling their own story through the eye." "What gives *Nanook* its astonishing vitality? — the secret is something in Flaherty himself..."

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
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While in Los Angeles recently, we had the privilege of visiting with Sol Lesser. The film career of this vigorous octogenarian producer/distributor/exhibitor reaches back to 1907 and includes, as producer, more than one hundred films beginning with *The Last Night of the Barbary Coast* in 1913, extending through innumerable Tarzan pictures, the Eisenstein/Sinclair *Thunder Over Mexico*, the classic *Our Town*, our own release of *Oliver Twist*, and *Yankee Doodle In Berlin*, which is a Mack Sennett feature comedy due for release next month through Blackhawk.

Mr. Lesser's energy would tire many men one-fourth his age. Today, his thoughts are still for the future of the film industry—the long-range future at that. But in a gesture of western hospitality, he reminisced for a couple of hours, giving us a letter which he had saved for more than fifty years and which has never before been published.

The letter concerns *Oliver Twist* and was written on January 10, 1923, by Henry Dickens, aged son of the author of the 1838 novel on which the film was based. "I am not a great cinema fan myself, preferring as I do the theatre as a means of dramatic representation," writes Mr. Dickens. "But I have on occasion derived very great artistic pleasure from some of the films I have seen. Amongst these I can, without hesitation, include *Oliver Twist*."

"The general tone of it was excellent as it fully expressed the spirit of the book and the meaning and intention of the author, while the telling of the story was very skillfully done."

"Jackie Coogan was undoubtedly somewhat small for the part but he stood out throughout the play as a wonderfully interesting and pathetic little figure. The characters are all well thought out; the only criticism I have to make is that I thought its Nancy was far too refined. Nancy was, after all, a woman of the people in appearance and feeling, with a warm heart and good instincts but rough."

"I am glad to be able to convey to you the pleasure which this film gave me."

YANKEE DOODLE REMEMBERED

As one might infer from the title, *Yankee Doodle In Berlin* was Mack Sennett's own *Shoulder Arms*—a zany contribution to American morale in World War I. Blackhawk's conversion from two 35mm nitrate prints started about a year ago, and in that time we've screened it for quite a number of friends, all of whom find it amazingly funny. When it was new, however, *Yankee Doodle* was a "problem picture" inasmuch as it was not ready until four months after the Armistice, when war films were a drug on the market.

To energetic Sol Lesser, peacetime was no deterrent. He contracted with Mack Sennett for a personal appearance tour by six Sennett Bathing Beauties, and in New York the audience was so eager for pulchritude that they not only viewed the film along with the ladies, but actually pushed the box office across the outer lobby of the theater in their surge to buy tickets!

After this smash success, Lesser set up six travelling companies for *Yankee Doodle*, each with one authentic and five ersatz Mack Sennett Beauties. With six companies on the road, he made a bundle (which, we are sure, he invested very wisely). Thus were our classics Lesser's frolics.

FILMEX

Oliver Twist is a retrospective choice for exhibition in the Los Angeles International Film Exposition (FILMEX) to be held in Century City beginning March 13th, so our Southern California friends will have the chance to preview it for the price of a ticket. FILMEX has also selected a program of eleven D. W. Griffith Biograph shorts restored by Blackhawk, to be shown with live musical accompaniment.

BIOGRAPHS NOTED

The Biograph restoration project has been attracting considerable notice in the film community as a result of the screenings held by The Museum of Modern Art to celebrate the Griffith centennial. Vincent Canby, writing in *The New York*

Times of January 23rd, said that "after watching more than six hours of the Biograph shorts I've become convinced that they are a taste worth cultivating for important reasons in addition to the obvious historical ones. . . . The necessary truncating of plot detail, the tight physical locale of interior sets (we never see more than three sides of any room), the need to establish character immediately, resulted in a kind of cinematic shorthand that, at times, makes these films look like a different art form from the features. Time and space limitations transformed people, places and objects into symbols of a purity and classicism that we've never had since."

In *Newsweek* magazine for February 3, Charles Michener wrote in a similar vein that "a sampling of the shorts—many of which have not been publicly seen for 60 years—reveals that during his years at Biograph, the greatest innovator in the history of movies created not only the grammar of film, but many small masterpieces of indelible poetry and timeless appeal."

TALK OF THE TOWN

Here is news of an unusual publication about Griffith that will appeal to both collectors and teachers of film. Vlada Petric, Luce Professor of Film at Harvard University, has completed an authoritative shot-by-shot analysis of the Biograph film *A Corner In Wheat*, which he regards as Griffith's greatest short. Four hundred copies of Professor Petric's study have been printed and are available, while they last, from the University Film Study Center, Box 275, Cambridge, MA 02138 at \$2.50 each postpaid.

Another article which will fascinate some Blackhawk customers appears in the current issue of *Sight and Sound*, the international quarterly of film published in London by the British Film Institute. Robert C. Allen writes on *Traffic In Souls*, the sensational 1913 feature which we restored and re-released in 1973.

Three final bits of intelligence: Anthony Slide points out that Florence Turner, one of the great stars of the pre-feature-film period, appears as Buster Keaton's mother in *College*; another correspondent advised us some time ago that Milton Berle plays the newsboy in *Tillie's Punctured Romance*, a fact now confirmed by Berle's just-published autobiography; and a Biograph film which we distributed several years ago as *The Wanderer* turns out, to our embarrassment, actually to be a different Griffith film, *Olaf: An Atom*. The real *Wanderer* will step forward later this year.

RECENT RELEASE

NERO OR THE BURNING OF ROME

(1909)



Arturo Ambrosio, who produced this film, established Italy's first motion picture studio at Torino in 1904. Ambrosio regarded motion pictures as a serious art rather than a novelty and declared his aim was "to produce the most impressive, most realistic, and technically perfect pictures within the bounds of human ingenuity and genius." When *Nero* his most famous film, first appeared, it was hailed as "the most marvelous picture in the world."

With enormous advance publicity, 342 prints were made for simultaneous release in Europe and America. Sixteen-page souvenir programs were distributed at the showings, and in the wake of its success followed by scores of grandiose Italian historical pictures which left their mark on the work of Griffith and De Mille.

"These spectacles were impressive," wrote two French historians who remembered them a generation later. "Portly operatic tenors in togas, stout matrons waving olive branches or giving the Roman salute, little legionnaires running at a trot, howling mobs raising or lowering their thumbs provided the constant ingredients. Roman orgies, a positive rain of blossoms, and the games were but a prelude to the inevitable splendors of the finale in which a whole cardboard city blazed merrily under the calm gaze of a paunchy and bemocked emperor as dignified as a bishop."

In the case of the blaze for which *Nero* is famous (both on and off the screen), the original film was tinted red. *Moving Picture World* described it as possessing "such a marvelous realism of effect that as we sat and watched the colored part of the film, we seemed, as it were, to hear the cries of the victims." Inspired by their enthusiasm, this tinted section has been reproduced on color stock in Blackhawk's excellent quality.

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



Mr. D.C. Lyle Vain of Baltimore, Maryland wrote as a result of that comment. He has given us his permission to quote his letter — which appears below:





A TOTAL LOSS (1916)

Starring **BEN TURPIN**

Cock-eyed Ben Turpin, one of the screen's first slapstick comedians, entered show business as a member of Sam T. Jack's Burlesque Company, Chicago. Then he toured in vaudeville eleven years until, returning to Chicago in 1907, he became a technician at the new Essanay film studio.

Ben did not stay long behind the scenes at Essanay. After a successful test, he played comedy roles for the studio, but it was not until Charlie Chaplin cast him in his first Essanay comedy HIS NEW JOB (released February 1, 1915) that Ben achieved public and critical acclaim.

A TOTAL LOSS, previously called DOCTORING A LEAK, was produced by the Vogue company and released by Mutual on September 17, 1916. Appearing with Ben is Rube Miller, a comedy director and former Keystone funny man, who had worked as a clown in all the major American circuses.

Ben, who was cross-eyed by nature and nurture, discussed the bumps and bruises of his slapstick style in MOTOGRAPHY on December, 5, 1914: "It all means money to me. Everytime I get smashed out of shape, I am just so much more valuable for my oddity."



DODGE YOUR DEBTS is the first and only comedy that has ever been available to collectors featuring Harold Lloyd's older brother, Gaylord. Chaplin, Keaton, and Charley Chase all had brothers who tried work in films, and so did Harold Lloyd. In 1921, Hal Roach signed Gaylord Lloyd for a short-lived series of films for Pathe, and DODGE YOUR DEBTS is one of only five entries produced.

The Gaylord Lloyd characterization here is more like his brother's old Lonesome Luke than anything else. He wears a little mustache, a top hat, no glasses, and he's brash and quite world-wise, all unlike the patented Harold Lloyd glass character.

In DODGE OUR DEBTS, Gaylord plays a bill collector with plenty of nerve, but not enough muscle to deal with debtor Moose-head Mike. Fortunately, Big Bad Mike has a pretty daughter, which makes Gaylord's task interesting, though no easier. After getting bounced around by burly Mike a few times, Gaylord tries to enlist support from the local constabulary. Instead, he winds up a marked man frantically pursued around town by both Moose-Head Mike, his grubby toughs, and Hal Roach's roadshow edition of the Keystone Cops. It all culminates in a gargantuan brick throwing melee — will Gaylord get the delinquent payment? or the girl? or just another brick in the face?



MANHATTAN MEDLEY (1932)

From the Fox "Magic Carpet of Movietone"



Fox having produced in Walter Ruttmann's BERLIN the greatest of all symphonies, the company perhaps deserved to win first place in the race of film-makers who were eager to perform the same treatment on New York. For though the form was no longer new by the time this little film was made, MANHATTAN MEDLEY is a clever, lovingly-made and impressive work which was obviously a labor of great love for its anonymous director.

Like its progenitor, the film traces life on the island from early morn to late at night, finding in the ethnic pockets and the business mainstream of the city those common elements which unify and give flavor to our most colorful metropolis.

Although the form and rhythm of the film are responsible for its charm and its content, native and even expatriate New Yorkers will find little shivers of recognition running up their spines at shots of chorus lines rehearsing at the Roxy, Brooklyn Bridge at sunrise, Automats, hot jazz in Harlem and Jewish peddlers on Hester Street.

The music score, especially compiled for the film by Louis de Francesco, adds another whole layer of early thirties nostalgia in the sound versions.

Over the past two months we have been preparing more-or-less monthly editions of three listings of used Standard 8mm, Super 8, and 16mm prints that are available, and then inserting these two or three page long listings in each appropriate Blackhawk shipment and envelope going out. We have also had one such piece listing some items that we have purchased on close-out, available for but a fraction of their original retail prices. Collectively, these are of limited availability, one of a kind, or used print listings that were formerly carried in the regular Bulletin — which we oversold to such a degree that we were making more enemies than friends. If we have but one used print, and receive ten orders for it, we're bound to make nine collectors unhappy, which we don't want to do!

Inasmuch as the "Stuffers" listing is presently received only by collectors who place an order, or who specifically request the stuffer, demand has been reduced to a point which equates with supply. This method has been working out very well, disappointing far fewer customers than the former Bulletin offerings, and connecting customers with films in a far greater number of cases. So, we believe we are ready to expand the circulation.

What we are doing is to discontinue the promotion of subscriptions to the Blackhawk Bulletin. But we will continue to offer them to all who want them. The fact that used listings are largely removed from the Bulletin, and special close-outs are included only when stock is available in great

depth, makes subscriptions to the Bulletin of less appeal than formerly — although not completely so.

As a starter we offer **FIRST CLASS MAIL SUBSCRIPTIONS** only to the three new series of stuffers. They will be issued at irregular periods, once a month, more or less, when there is a sufficient amount of material to offer. Golden signed him for a role in a serial concept he had sold to Pathe early in 1918. Leah Baird and Sheldon Lewis were supposedly the box office attractions.

Golden wrote in a strong part for Hutch, whose star was launched skyward as a result. Fan mail poured in demanding to see more of the darling young man and Pathe immediately ordered another Golden-Hutchinson collaboration. For the next four years, Hutch proved to be the hottest male property on the serial screen.

As for the serial that brought him to fame, it was written, directed and produced by Golden and fits into the topical or "preparedness" format. All the classic serial elements were used, from stolen invention to cliff-hanging endings. But in story, Wolves of Kultur, was contemporary with the times

RECENT RELEASE**ACE OF ACES,
THE STORY
OF EDDIE
RICKENBACKER**

The rules of fate never applied to Eddie Rickenbacker. His family had lived on the wrong side of the tracks, and grinding poverty produced a kid who was tough, stubborn and rebellious. When his father died, Eddie left school and became the family breadwinner. He found a job in a shop that produced those newfangled gasoline buggies.

Our film traces his career. The Wright Brothers became his heroes. But first he had to learn all there was to know about cars. He drove in the first 500-mile Indianapolis Race at age twenty-one. By 1916 he stood third among the speed kings but he gave it all up to become an aviator pilot in World War I. First he was a driver for General Pershing's staff, then through the aid of General Billy Mitchell, America's first great advocate of air power, Eddie became an officer and in no time he was one of the great aces of the Army Air Force.

After the war, he became a builder of automobiles — the first car to have four-wheel brakes. A position as divisional sales manager for General Motors led to an opportunity to get back into aviation in the 1930s when he bought out G.M.'s ownership in Eastern Airlines.

In 1942, Rickenbacker was tapped for an important mission to MacArthur in the Southwest Pacific. His plane wandered from its course, ran out of fuel and crash landed in the sea. For twenty-four days, eight men were adrift on three life rafts — almost without food or water. One man died, others were close to death. Then rescue. Two weeks later Eddie resumed his mission and then, home to Washington and a hero's welcome. Eddie Rickenbacker. Ace of Aces!

PARCEL POST CHARGES

A phone call to your local post office will get you information as to your zone from Davenport, or you can estimate it on the basis of distance as given in the table below. READ BEFORE YOU ORDER

Blackhawk Films' prices do not include postage. Shipping weights are given with each item and you can compute the approximate total weight and postage charges by referring to the postage table given below. While weights of a single shipment to virtually all post offices in continental United States are limited to 40 pounds, shipments to the states of Alaska and Hawaii may run as heavy as 70 pounds. These two states are in the eighth zone, and Blackhawk customers can approximate the correct postage to remit by figuring 18¢ per pound for each pound over twenty. The same formula applies to all U.S. Territories and Protectorates.

Some larger and heavier items, because of size and weight, are not mailable and will thus be shipped to you by express or freight, you paying the transportation charges on delivery. A TRIP TO THE MOON (1902)
by **GEORGES MELIES**

Georges Melies, a talented conjurer, was the first man to realize that film could be used to create illusions unfettered by logic or probability. Refused a camera by Lumiere, he constructed his own equipment and a month later opened the first public cinema in the world at the Theatre Roubert Houdin, Paris.

All the fantastic possibilities of the Lumiere invention were grasped by Melies, who produced nearly 4000 films between 1896 and 1914. Melies himself financed, wrote the script, designed the tableaux, planned the tricks, painted the sets, directed, and appeared as the principal character in this, his most famous work and the first great international success in the history of film.

A TRIP TO THE MOON begins at a Congress of Astronomers, with the President explaining his plan for the journey: he and five colleagues will be shot off in a projectile shaped like a large bullet. After a visit to the construction workshops, where the gun to fire the vehicle is cast before their eyes, the scientists are launched amid much ceremony, and they disappear into space. Here, quoting an original catalogue description, "the moon is visible at a distance. The shell coming closer every minute, the moon magnifies rapidly until finally it attains colossal dimensions. It gradually assumes the shape of a living grotesque face, smiling sanctimoniously."

The shell pierces the eye of the moon, and the astronomers stretch out for a fitful sleep on the lunar landscape. Stars with human faces, comets, and Saturn in his rings appear in the sky. Snow falls and the scientists descend into a crater for warmth. Again quoting the Lubin catalogue, "The astronomers arrive in the interior of a most curious grotto filled with enormous mushrooms of every kind. One of them opens his umbrella in order to compare its size with a mushroom, but the umbrella suddenly takes root and, transforming itself into a mushroom, starts growing gradually, attaining gigantic proportions."

Attacked by strange moon men, the scientists flee back to their shell which, thrown off the moon, plunges back to earth and lands in the depths of the sea "amongst the debris of ships, marine plants, corals and fishes of all kinds." But the projectile is hermetically sealed, so it bobs to the surface and is towed to shore.

The original prints of A TRIP TO THE MOON included five scenes of celebration after the astronomers' safe return. These scenes, lasting about one minute, were missing from the original print from which Blackhawk's copies are taken, and apparently do not survive elsewhere. The film comes to a logical conclusion as it is, however, and otherwise seems fully complete. Picture quality is the best we have ever seen on this particular subject. The sound versions have been stretch printed for projection at 24 frames per second; the optical work is smooth and the sound versions lock as good as the silent ones. The track consists of piano accompaniment newly recorded and edited from piano rolls made in the late 19th century.
