





## BATHING GIRLS---THEN AND NOW





# 16mm. SOUND PRINTS

## IMPORTANT! Read This Before Ordering.

We have included in this listing of used films, a number of listings of brand new prints on which we have only one or two prints of each title. New prints are indicated by the letters SDN in the code numbers; used prints are shown by the letters SUD.

We usually have only a few used prints of a title — sometimes only one. This means that within two or three weeks after the mailing of this catalog, more and more of these used titles will be sold out. Keep this in mind when you order. If you don't see what you want yourself, give us an alternate list of titles. We'll never send an alternate list if your top choices are already not in stock. But remember — we can't sell what we don't have — and the used prints we offer are in great demand.

This section was the last part of the catalog to be printed. It was off the press only one or two days before the general mailing of the catalog was made. At the time it went to press, prints of all the subjects listed were in stock, ready for shipment. Normally, within two or three weeks after mailing, 50% of those titles will have been sold.

As to the length of 16mm. films — cartoons average about 250 feet to a reel; most one-reelers run 300 to 350 feet. Two-reelers usually run about 650 feet and longer subjects normally average not less than 300 feet to a reel. All films of one reel length and over are supplied on reels.






