Griffith's departure from the Biograph Company, A TIMELY INTERCEPTION is a fairly silly story of a financially hard-pressed family saved by discovering oil while digging in the back yard: however Griffith transforms it with his loving treatment of the simple characters. From the first shot of Lillian Gish and Bobby Harron seated by a forest stream to the final traveling shot of them in a carriage headed for their wedding, Griffith weaves a tapestry of tender emotions, subtly revealed. When Gish and Harron first learn they can marry, Lillian pulls Bobby behind a door to give him a kiss, as it the camera were too public an eye for such an intimate moment. When Gish learns she cannot marry because of money problems, she moves behind this same door to weep. This distant or indirect portrayal of strong emotions is basic to Griffith's style. In this Bulletin, you'll find that we have a series of new numbers assigned to approximately 170 of our old established titles.
Actually, the films that will be delivered under these new numbers are identical to those we've been offering. All that has been changed is the number.

You might wonder about the "why" of all this number changing.
The explanation is simply this. When we make a silent edition of a 16 mm film, a standard 8 mm film
or a super 8 mm film, the copying materials are normally identical. It helps us, then, to have the original copying materials stored under a number which cross refers to the various versions which can be made from those copying materials.
If this is not clear, here's an example.
If you'll look at our Laurel and Hardy listing, you'll see that BIG BUSINESS is offered in three versions (standard 8, super 8 and 16 mm silent). Our prefix numbers are different - but the last four digits on each of these versions are the same - " 1262 ". That enables us to know that we will find whatever copying materials we need to make negatives for any one of these three versions filed under the number " 1262 "
All of this explanation is simply to let you know that our number changing does make sense and that, when you order, you will receive the same film with the same quality which you have always obtained from Blackhawk Films.

## SUPER 8 MAGNETIC VS. SUPER 8 OPTICAL SOUND

 Super 8 optical sound has been in existence for several years in the United States and for a longer period in Europe. We've been getting inquiries from persons who have been asking why we don't offer it and: "Wouldn't it be cheaper?"In the United States Super 8 optical sound has been used for some time by industry, but their needs are far different from the average individual. Their film presentations are usually largely narrated films with voice being the important thing - music secondary. Optical sound has worked out very well for many of these applications - less well for others.

But Super 8 optical sound has not worked out at being any less in cost, and it poses several rather important limitations. The first limitation is the effect of wear. Scratches, dust and dirt are far more obvious than on 16 mm and a Super 8 optical track that begins to pick up such abrasions sounds like a worn 78 -rpm phonograph record. Further Super 8 optical covers not nearly the range of Super 8 magnetic, so that the music range is very limited on Super 8 optical.
On top of this, Super 8 optical offers no recording ability. Every individual who makes Super 8 talking films uses Super 8 magnetic, and anyone who has Super 8 film may have it magnetically striped and record their own narration. Super 8 optical offers no such opportunity.
So, we do not think Super 8 optical sound is something that we'll be offering in the forseeable future. We don't really see how it holds any advantage for anyone.

## AİR MAIL SUBSCRIPTIONS <br> TO THE BLACKHAWK BULLETIN

Since we indicated two months ago that we would no longer promote air mail subscriptions to the Blackhawk Bulletin because of going to "stuffers" for our limited availability listings, and further giving subscribers the opportunity to cancel these subscriptions and apply them on subscriptions to the new "stuffers", we've had quite a number of our friends write us to do just that - only they had no air mail subscriptions to the Bulletin currently active.
Somehow, some of these persons must have thought that it took a subscription to get the Blackhawk Bulletin. It does not and it never has. Anyone who wants to receive the Blackhawk Bulletin may simply write us of his desires, and we'll send him four of the next six issues, third class mail, and not charge him a cent.
If he becomes a customer within this period, he will get third class mailings of each month's issue of the Bulletin for the next twelve months - and this twelve months is up-dated every time he sends us an order. But if we've had no order, he gets only every other Bulletin for the second year, every third Bulletin for the third year, and every fourth issue for the fourth year. But these are distributed by third class mail, which takes from several days to two or three weeks to get delivered in the Continental United States. So, if any person - customer or prospect - wishes to get faster delivery, he has been able to get an air mail subscription which has brought the bulletin to him in just a day or two after it is printed. This air mail distribution is no longer being promoted by us in view of all the limited availability items being withdrawn from the Bulletin. They now are covered by stuffers except in cases where we have a stock of limited availability items in some depth.
If you're interested in knowing about limited availability items, see information elsewhere in this Bulletin as to how you can subscribe to receive these stuffers by first class mail.

## PIPE ORGAN MUSIC TRACKS

This time around, Blackhawk is offering a trio of new releases with rich, wonderful theatre organ scores: BARNEY OLDFIELD'S RACE FOR A LIFE, PUSS IN BOOTS, and OLIVER TWIST. Over in his celumn, David Shepard covers the full background and details of how, why, and where the job was done. The task was no easy one. But let's say a few words here about by whom it was done. The gentleman's name is John Muri. It's worth repeating in bold letters, JOHN MURI. Now, if you haven't heard the name before, keep on reading anyway.
John Muri is old enough and good enough to have played the mighty theatre organs that accompanied the great silent films before the advent of sound. We're all the better for it today. He loved playing for the silents back then, and he still loves playing for them these days. It shows, too, because everyone enjoys listening to John Muri, and he's busier today at pipe organ programs and concert engagements around the country than ever before.
Luckily for all of us who admire Mr . Muri, he is ready and able to play any organ, anywhere, anytime. We were together for a television program two years ago, and John was hastily plucked down in front of an electric organ in a TV studio and asked to improvise a
score for a silent Our Gang Comedy he'd never seen before. What's more, he had to improvise the score while he was on the air, looking at the film (and a distracting circular insert of himself!) on a tiny TV monitor. Who knows how he did it, but the score was tremendous so good, in fact, that one friend had a tape made of it, to use as a standard track to accompany silent comedies!
At a film convention in 1970, John Muri played an absolutely thundering Wurlitzer Organ for us at a 35 mm closed screening of a two hour epic feature picture. This time conditions were ideal, and again, so was the musical accompaniment - just a magnificent sound. So much so that the experience was one of the most moving and memorable of my life. Which either tells you something about the kind of life I've led, or means thatJoha Muri is quite an artist Since so many others were profoundly touehed by the experience, it probably means that Mr. Muri is indeed one singular artist.

Seeing that film, and hearing that marvelous, textured score was the first time I fully realized how tremendously exciting silent films could be, and really should be. There was no dialogue, but this
man at the keyboard was fully simulating or complimenting every visual we'd see on the screen. There was no need for dialogue, crowd noises, sound effects, canned applause, canned laughter, or anything else, for that matter. All would have been superfluous and disruptive. Whatever the mood on screen, whatever was happening, John Muri could somehow duplicate it with the sounds this mighty instrument was emitting. Light and lilting when need be, powerful and reverberating other times. It showed great sensitivity. We didn't believe we weren't also hearing sounds that precisely matched what we were seeing.
Justa couple of weeks ago, while screening our scored print of OLIVER TWIST, with John's powerful, distinctive theatre organ track, the whole feeling came back to me. It fused together the three requisites to fully enjoy the silents at their best: a superb print, of a fine subject, with a vibrant, affecting musical score. We're glad Blackhawk can offer you al! three.
When your print of BARNEY OLDFIELD'S RACE FOR A LIFE or PUSS IN BOOTS, or OLIVER TWIST (particularly) arrives, it's a safe bet you'll join the appreciative band of movie buffs grateful to John Muri for his marvelous work. We're all in his

## SUBSCRIPTIONS FOR THE NEW BLACKHAWK "STUFFERS" LISTINGS: USED 8 mm , Super 8 , and 16 mm - AND SPECIAL CLOSE-OUT PURCHASES.

Over the past two months we have been preparing more-or-less monthly editions of three listings of used Standard 8mm, Super 8, and 16 mm prints that are available, and then inserting these two or three page long listings in each appropriate Blackhawk shipment and envelope going out. We have also had one such piece listing some items that we have purchased on close-out, available for but a fraction of their original retail prices. Collectively, these are of limited availability, one of a kind, or used print listings that were formerly carried in the regular Bulletin - which we oversold to such a degree that we were making more enemies than friends. If we have but one used print, and receive ten orders for it, we're bound to make nine collectors unhappy, which we don't want to do!

What we are doing is to discontinue the promotion of subscriptions to the Blackhawk Bulletin. But we will continue to offer them to all who want them. The fact that used listings are largely removed from the Bulletin,
and special close-outs are included only when stock is available in great depth, makes subscriptions to the Bulletin of less appeal than formerly - although not completely so.
As a starter we offer FIRST CLASS MAIL SUBSCRIPTIONS only to the three new series of stuffers. They will be issued at irregular periods, once a month, more or less, when there is a sufficient amount of material to offer. Sometimes one may be issued in only three weeks after the previous one, sometimes four to six weeks. Normally, Standard 8 mm is one stuffer, Super 8 is another, and 16 mm is a third listing. Subscriptions by FIRST CLASS MAIL are offered on each or all of the three series, any combinations of ten FIRST CLASS MAILINGS for $\$ 1.00$.
In short, if you are interested (for example) in Standard 8 mm , $\$ 1.00$ will get you the next ten issues of the Standard 8 mm listing. The same for Super 8 and 16 mm . You can request any combination on a single subscription.

Thus, if you are interested in
both Standard 8 mm and Super 8 , we'll code your subscription accordingly, and if both are available on the same date, it will subtract only a single mailing from your subscription. The same for Standard 8 mm and 16 mm - or Super 8 and 16 mm - or all three. You'll get a mailing when a new "stuffer" is issued in which you have expressed interest - or if two - or all - are available at the same time, you'll get them all for a single issue deduction from your subscription.

Also, we find that we're occasionally making a stuffer for
some specialized types of films. We don't consider these sufficiently broad in their appeal to send out individually on a subscription. but we'll include a copy with the new mailing of a stuffer of that format, whenever it is ready within the next week or two.

## World War I Releases

The films of World War I document not only the rise of the American film industry to domination of all the world's screens, but also the development of the movies as a powerful propaganda weapon. Before the United States entered the war on April 6, 1917 , domestic newsreels like Blackhawk's Mutual Weekly No. 105 brought military maneuvers and technologies to America's doorstep, while the new feature films successively reflected attitudes of neutrality, pacifism, preparedness and involvement. Immediately after our own declaration of war, the government enlisted the aid of private film producers in selling the war effort. These three new Blackhawk releases offer a fascinating review of the attitudes of those days, and each in its own way is a compelling film whether because of spectacle, humor, or downright simple charm. In addition to these three titles, we especially commend to you The Heart of Humanity, previously released by Blackhawk and per haps the most outstanding single propaganda drama to survive from the war years.

## YANKEE DOODLE IN BERLIN

(1919)
with FORD STERLING, BEN TURPIN, MARIE PREVOST, MAL ST. CLAIR, BERT ROACH and EVA THATCHER

YANKEE DOODLE IN BERLIN stands alongside Chaplin's SHOULDER ARMS as one of the finest comedies of the First World War, yet is has received little acclaim. In part this stems from its first release, in March of 1919. Four months after the Armistice, war films were a glut on the market and producers were being urged to "use other than war characters and avoid scenes of human destruction." Although YANKEE DOODLE IN BERLIN is propagandistic in its dismantling of the German High Command, to Sennett the War was iust another place to loose Ford Sterling, Ben Turpin and Marie Prevost in an endless battle against storyline and sanity. As much as anything. YANKEE DOODLE parodies the serious propaganda films which flooded wartime screens with "Hun" atrocities and depraved spies. Its director, F Richard Jones, was later responsible for the Mabel Normand feature MICKEY, for Douglas Fairbanks' THE GAUCHO, and for Ronald Colman in BULLDOG DRUMMOND. Although only six, actors received billing on the screen and in the original advertising, the film features virtually the whole Sennett troupe: Mal St. Clair, Bert Roach, Eva Thatcher, Eddie Gribbon, Edgar Kennedy, Chester Conklin. Charlie Murray, Tom Kennedy, Kala Pasha, Mack Swain, Baldy Belmont and Heinie Conklin. Bothwell Browne, who plays the American hero Bob White, was a famous female impersonator of the period. He steals the Kaiser's war plans by dressing in feminine togs and seducing him, then signals the key information to a telegraph operator disguised as a scarecrow in the cornfield adjacent to the palace! Although some decomposition in the nitrate preprint shows on the screen in Blackhawk's copies, image quality is generally quite good and the film itself is extremely funny.

## CIVILIZATION $_{\text {(1916) }}$

Historically, CIVILIZATION is a very important film. It has been credited with contributing importantly to Wilson's reelection as President in 1916 on the slogan "He Kept Us Out of War;" as a peace propaganda film. CIVILIZATION was more important than any other production prior to ALL QUIET ON THE WESTERN FRONT.
Advised by the military, the King of Wredpryd (pronounce it) embarks on a brutal and quite unnecessary war, without the support of his people. The women of Wredpryd organize a great peace army which includes the fiancee of Count Ferdinand, a military inventor upon whom the King greatly relies. She disturbs Ferdinand's conscience sufficiently that, when in command of a submarine, he refuses to sink a passenger ship carrying contraband. The crew mutiny and the submarine is destroyed in a spectacular sequence; after a long illness during which Ferdinand, delirious, encounters the Spirit of Christ and visits hell, he recovers and preaches peace in the very shadow of the palace. The furious King condemns Ferdinand to death, but the Spirit of Christ takes possession of his body and leads the King out to see, firsthand, the ravages he has called forth. Thie King experiences a change of heart and abandons the war.
The submarine sequence was no doubt suggested by the sinking of the Lusitania; the soldiers of Wredpryd wear familiar spiked helmets. But it is probable that producer Ince was not as serious about the content of CIVILIZATION as he was about competing with the new elaborate Griffith films THE BIRTH OF A NATION and INTOLERANCE.
Ince's battle scenes, crowd movements, and elements of spectacle are magnificent, being inferior to Griffith's only in lack of pattern and absence of integration into the film as a whole. CIVILIZATION suggests Griffith too in its religious motivation, its use of allegory, and its didacticism, although its story is weaker and its characters less well defined than in either of the Griffith epics. Oddly, both Griffith and Ince seemed willing to put their art to the service of war and peace alike. Less than two years-after the pacifistic INTOLERANCE, Griffith made a prowar film, HEARTS OF. THE WORLD; CIVILIZATION itself was "rearranged" in May of 1917 "with new titles and inserts of the American flag, etc., as well as President Wilson's great message to Congress"! The Blackhawk copies of CIVILIZATION were abridged from a 1931 reissue, but include all the spectacle scenes, as well as the 1916 title texts. In September of 1918, the Fox Film Corporation released a group of eight films designed to "educate the American people in every phase" of the First World War. These films ranged from a dramatic feafure about secret German diplomacy to a documentary entitled WHY AMERICA WILL WIN THE WAR, based loosely on the life of General Pershing. Included among them was a single comedy, SWAT THE SPY, which featured Fox's popular and terrifically appealing child stars, Jane and Katherine Lee. Distributors were advised to advertise the film as a "comedy and not a war play." The palatial home of Andrew sheldon provides a meeting place for a whole hostef German spies-operating under the orders of Sheldon's butler Karl Schmidt introduced in a title as an agent of the "Imbeerial German Government." Eachnight after dinner, Schmidt gets out a solemnily. draped portrait of the Kaiser while the servants sit about and conspire. But it is only a reel from the time Jane and Katherine discover the treachery to the time they have trimmed the Kaiser's picture with lettuce leaves, hit it in the kisser with a fruit pie, and routed the spies to a dozen, simultaneous, embarassing ends When weighed against the heavy-handed propaganda of films like THE KAISER, THE BEAST OF BERLIN, the gentle slapstick of SWAT THE SPY offers a happy balance of message and laughter.

Georges Melies, a talented conjurer, was the first man to realize that film could be used to create illusions unferfered by ogic or probability. Refused a camera by Lumiere, he constructed his own equipment and a month later opened the firs pubtic cinema in the world at the Theatre Roubert Houdin, Par is.
All the fantastic possibilities of the Lumiere invention were grasped by Melies, who produced nearly 4000 films belween 896 and 1914. Melies himself financed, wrote the script, designed the tableaux, planned the tricks, painted the sets, directed, and appeared as the principal character in this, his most famous work and the first great international success in the history of film

One of them opens his umbrella in order to compare its size with a mushroom, but the mbrella suddenly takes root and, transforming itself into a mushroom starts growing gradually, attaining gigantic proportions.
Attacked by strange moon men, the scientists flee back to their shell which, thrown off the moon, plunges back to earth and lands in the depths of the sea "amongst the debris of ships, marine plants,

In this fifteen chapter release over the next fifteen months, Blackhawk achieves what many of you would have wished for - a choice example of the silent serials in a form to bring the maximum enioyment today. This will be an answer for many of you. Some of you actually remember the silent serials in the peak years of their prosperity --to others, the silent serial is only a legend. In our offering the THE WOMAN IN GREY, the silen serial truly comes to life.
What we have done, first of all, is to skillfully edit down to a uniform length of 450 -feet, each of the fifteen chapters. (Don't be alarmed, this abridging is only the cutting out of extraneous walking around which many serials utilized to build up footage - the finished abridgement is absolutely true to the full chapter, but makes possible its acquisition at a considerable saving.) The first chapter, however, contains an historical introduction which fades out - as does the music - and may be included or eliminated, as you wish. You pay no premium for this added footage on the first chapter.
Then, after abridging, we have scored each chapter from authentic nickelodeon piano rolls - which out nickelodeon the nickelodeon itself, for we have been able to cue in various selections for differing periods of ime, whereas the nickelodeons simply played through each 10 -minute piano roll. The result is very convincing.
Henry G. Sell and Arline Pretty filled the lead roles, with capable but unknown actors in the supporting roles. While Sell was best known at the time for his work with Pearl White in The Fatal Ring and The Lightning Raider (Pathe serials of 1917-18), Miss Pretty was the real drawing card.


A veteran screen actress (she began at Universal in 1913), Miss Pretty rose to stardom at Vitagraph in 1916 17, an ascent climaxed by her role in The Secret Kingdom, a Grustarkian serial whose locale alternated be ween the mythical kingdom and the American West. She had also been Douglas Fairbanks, Sr's., leading lady n one or more of his films of the late teens. As a result, she was reasonably well known by screen fans.
Actually, the house chosen to portray the Amory estate is as much a star as any of the human actors. Its sliding wall panels, mysterious staircases inside the walls and other trick devices brought into play by the story line lent themselves well to the eerie feeling sought by the writers, and certainly made access by the villian considerably easier.
The end result is a highly enjoyable and most representative example of the silent serial at its very best reappearance week after week to see how the future, and audiences shared that faith at the boxoffice by their reappearance week after week to see how the heroine survived.

## MUSIC FOR SILENTS

Silent films were virtually never shown in silence. A footnote to Edison's Kinetoscope Catalog of 1894 offered "specially selected musical records for use on the Kinetophone for nearly all the films in the foregoing list. Price each $\$ 1.50$." One function of the early movie music was practical: it drowned out the mechanical sounds made by the exposed projectors. The narrative structure of the films themselves was sometimes so crude that the exhibitor would jurn balladier to explain the action.
Music served similar functions in the studios, where it was first used to counteract the noise of two or three other films being made on the same stage, and later to help actors sustain their moods. "I had Danny Borzage play his accordian softly," remembered John Ford. "Everyone did that in those days. It sounds fatuous now, but it really helped.'
In theatres, balladiers and piano pounders gave way to pipe organs and pit ensembles, and metropolitan picture palaces of the twenties offered musical backgrounds played by disciplined orchestras of symphonic dimensions
The functions of silent film music were to add instrumental color to the visuals, to develop the characters and ideas in the film, and to support the film rhythmically. Film music is thus "programme music," but of a special kind: film music is an accompaniment adapted to the sense of the incidents shown on the screen. Silent film directors were usually uninterested in altering the editing or structure of their films to fit musical requirements. This necessitated composing around a whole set of climaxes and incidents which were, from a composer's point of view, arbitrarily placed and difficult to work into a sensible musical pattern.
Other problems which faced composers of silent film music included (first and foremost) a lack of time to work. They were lucky if they could obtain four weeks to write enough music to comprise a small opera. Also, the preparation of a composed score was expensive; and to the production companies, it often seemed an unnecessary expense.
Thus, the bulk of the silent films produced were scored with borrowed music; or as the language of the time had it, were "illustrated." The general scheme of illustration was charmingly explained by British film music composer William Alwyn who recalled his first day in the pit in a letter to Sight and Sound:
"In front of me on the music stand was a thick stack of music; 'Poet and Peasant' and 'Zampa' were in the better class, but a general stand-by was the works of a certain Kela Bela, whose music seemed to me even then a combine prodigality with the commonplace to a quite remarkable degree. There was, of course, a mixed bag of sentimental favorites and an album of specially composed film music designed to meet any known situation. Also on the desk was a piece marked Theme which I was told ... to keep separate from the rest and at a given signal from the leader to abandon whatever I was playing and dive abruptly into this special theme.

At last after much furtive tuning and whispering, we were all ready and ... off we started on the first piece on the desk. I was just beginning to get under way when another signal from the violinist left me stranded ... as my teacher expertly and rapidly whipped over the pages ... and off we went again at a different tempo and so on until the next signal... The essential link in the performance was the pianist who bound this hotch-potch of music together with his rapid modulations and improvised chords.
Large orchestras, of course, used composed bridges between selections, and expert conductors like Hugo Riesenfeld, David Mendoza, Erno Rappe and William Axt were able to incorporate subtle ideas of psychology and characterization into their musical illustrations. The process was made somewhat easier by the development of stock film music, which began in 1913 with three votumes of San Fox-Moving Pieture Music, titled according to the situation described (0) riental Scene, European Army Maneuvers, Explosion or Fire Scene, Burglar or Sneaky Music) and composed by J.S. Zamecnik. In 1919, Guiseppi Becce compiled his encyclopedic Kinothek consisting of thousands of pieces composed by himself and other cinema conductors stirred in with snippets taken from Massenet, Puccini, Rachmaninoff, Schubert, and Tschaikowsky, all classified according to precise dramatic mood.
Economics and suspicion being what they are in the film business, prints seldom arrives at theatres until the day before the first performance. This meant the conductor would have to screen, time and study the film, assemble his selections in parts, rehearse continued on next page
the orchestra and give the first performance, all in one sleepless night. It is not surprising under these circumstances that even wellintentioned musicians who tried, for example, to steal all the accompaniment for a particular film from Debussy or Grieg or Tschaikowsky to perserve some unity of style were forced to draw on Zamecnik
At Blackhawk, we are taking a variety of approaches to authentic-sounding "silent movie music" in scoring our releases, but one thing we are not doing is adding the same music track to more than one production: each of our films has music carefully and individually chosen to fit it.
Our "illustrated" scores draw upon three libraries of existing music. Blackhawk has secured a collection of piano rolls perforated in the 'teens for the Picturoll Company of Los Angeles and designed especially for movie accompaniment. We have recorded each roll at several different tempi on a Mason \& Hamlin grand piano with Ampico attachment, and Bill Lindholm, who is a trained musician on Blackhawk's production staff, edits these pieces in quite ingenious ways to follow screen action. The Woman in Grey has been scored entirely with Picturolls according to a leitmotiv approach in which each character is assigned a musical theme, so that aural continuity as well as story continuity exists from one chapter to the next. Blackhawk's second library consists of orchestral recordings made by the Gennett Company of Richmond, Indiana, in the late ' 20 's. These pieces, too, were intended expressly for scoring silent pictures and are being edited and synchronized like the piano roll recordings. The Major Mood Music library, which is more recent than the Gennett library but is still old enough not to sound out-of-period with silent movies, is being edited to fit certain films by a California filmmaker and collector, Thom Eberhardt. Thom's score for You're Darn Tootin' (to pick just one example soon to be released) turns a good, workmanlike Laurel \& Hardy into a comic masterpiece of the first water.
When a composed score is available to us, we record the original music. For our upcoming release of The Silent Enemy, a wonderful feature film on Canadian Indians, Paramount Pictures loaned from its vaults the manuscript of the original score by Massard Kur Zhene, and that is the music John Muri recorded on the pipe organ for us. Similarly, the original score by Edmund Meisel will be used for Berlin: The Symphony of a Great City.
John Muri and Gaylord Carter are among the handful of great, great organists who are able to combine their own composition and sheer improvisation to exhilarating effect. When John Muri recorded Oliver Twist, Foolish Wives, Puss In Boots and Barney Oldfield's Race for a Life on the $3 / 19$ Ediphone-Wurlitzer at the since-shuttered Rialto Theater in Indianapolis, he had a pile of his own compositions on the music rack, but his scores were created as the pictures were rehearsed and taped.
We want you to know, too, that Blackhawk is taking a great deal of trouble to secure the finest possible sound quality on its release prints. 8 mm is a magnetic process throughout, but 16 mm optical tracks have traditionally been a needle's eye through which a great deal of sound simply would not thread. Film Technology Company has worked out a special optical sound transfer process for us, using a non-standard negative stock and variable density recording, which offers 2000 cycles of flat high-end response beyond what is normally available on 16 mm film, and this process is being used by us for any basic sound track which is good enough to warrant it. The Muri tracks released this month are particularly fine in their sound quality
One problem in tracking silent films is, of course, the need to choose either to run certain films unreasonably fast by screening them at sound speed, or to "stretch-print" them, adding one-third to their length (and their price). Blackhawk is experimenting with Super 8 magnetic and 16 mm optical tracks which are recorded and intended for projection at silent speed. Using the Film Technology transfer process, we believe our sound fidelity at silent speed will virtually equal the sound fidelity of standard transfers at sound speed, so that scored releases which demand projection at silent speed will sound as good, look better, and cost less than if it were necessary to resort to optical "stretch" printing. We will probably have some experimental releases in the months ahead, but in the meantime we would welcome your reaction to the idea.

## BERLIN: THE SYMPHONY OF A GREAT CITY (1927)

Directed by Walther Ruttman; Produced and Photographed by Karl Freund for Fox Film-Europa

With the single exception of NANOOK OF THE NORTH, Ruttmann's famous BERLIN is the most important and influential non-fiction film of the silent era. Even today, with its sublect a world war and half a century away, BERLIN is brimming over with ideas about the expressive possibilities of film. It is so packed with energy and imagination that it still stuns viewers who discover it anew, and still inspires forty-five out of every fift y young filmmakers who see it into going out and producing an imitation
At its simplest level, BERLIN creates an impression of the city from dawn to late at night. in what John Grierson called "smooth and finely. tempo'd visuals," a train swings in from the suburbs. Wheels, rails, details of engines, telegraph wires, landscapes and other simple images flow along in procession: the rhythm of the editing conveys the rhythm of the train click-clacking over the rails, causing viewers to feel, purely from visual cues, the experience of riding on a train. So it goes through the day: factories get under way, the streets fill, the traffic tangles. Noontime and lunch: Ruttmann contrasts the simple meals of workers, the elegant meals of the wealthy diners, and the huge meals of the elephants in the Berlin 200. The city resumes work, but is brought to a halt by a rainshower in mid afternoon. There is a casual suicide at dusk; in the evening, it is cabaret, Charlie Chaplin, and a veritable geometry of dancing legs.
On the surface, then, BERLIN is about the city; but looking a little deeper; it is also about the art of film itself. That title THE SYMPHONY OF A GREAT CITY is not pretension, for in BERLIN Ruttmann breaks clean away from the movie tradition of stories borrowed from plays and novels, and creates tension and excitement not from the plot line but from his selection, arr angement and pacing of thousands of little observations. One critic who realized this wrote that "Ruttmann's film could scarcely be used to guide a stranger arriving in Berlin for the first time. It summarizes far more the memories and residual moods of a traveller leaving that city. If nevertheless the film contains a characterization of the city, it is not in the shots themselves, but through their montage and rhythm." Like many a symphony in music, there is a "program" - a narrative element - to serve as a guide, but the deepest pleasure from BERLIN, is to be found from viewing it over and over again, and developing an appreciation of its melody, harmony, feeling and form.
Blackhawk's release is by arrangement with the original producer, and our prints are of flawless photographic quality. A sound version, carrying the original synchronized score composed for the film by Edmund Meisel, is in preparation and will be released when ready.

MUSSOLINI'S DECADE OF PROGRESS

#### Abstract

This film was a special newsreel released to theatres on the tenth anniversary or Mussolini's ascent to power. Beginning in 1922, it shows Fascisti militants in picturesque regalia marching info Rome as Benito Mussolini is named premiere and becomes, overnight, virtual dictator of Italy. Two segments of the film present exclusive interviews with Mussolini in which the Premier addresses the Movietone camera in English. One of these, the very first talking picture made abroad, expresses triendship to the American nation "from-a de Pacifica to the Atlantic" and praises the wonderful energy of the American "peep." At the time of this film, Mussolini's English was very limited and he read his text from chalk boards held up out of camera range by the American Ambassador; but looking at the final result, Mussolini was impressed. "Let me talk through your machine once a week," he is reported to have said, "and I will need no other weapon." In the second interview, the Premiere pledges himself to, peace, saying that "Italy will never take the initiative in promoting war Also included in this film are scenes showing the aftermath of a 1926 assassination attempt, Mussolini starting a reclamation project, and Mussolini and the King at a Bersaglieri review. In the manner of early sound newsreels, only direct recording (without narration) was used for many scenes, and Mussolini's departure after his first call on the Pope, presented without elaboration but complete with footsteps, door slams and band music, provides an electrifying jump in immediacy when contrasted to the silent story with narration that immediately preceded it. In 1932, many American observers did not forsee Mussolini as the fascist tiger or Italy as the adversary she was to become less than a decade later.

The review of Nanook of the North reproduced below was written by Cecile Starr. It originally appeared in The Saturday Review Literafure on January 6, 1951, on the occasion of the 16 mm release of the film with added music and commen It is here reprinted by kind permission of the the Blackhawk Bulletin version to tie in with the 8 mm silent version release.

Robert Flaherty's Nanook of the North is now available for 8 mm purchase. However you look at the film - as one of the all-time classics in motion picture history, as one of the great grandparents of the present-day documentary film, as a striking photographic achievement, as an exciting romance of life in the Arctic, or as an epic tale of man against the elements - one thing is certain: Nanook of the North is a wonderful film, and Robert Flaherty is a greater man for having made it.
The history of this film is only one small chapter in the remarkable history of Flaherty himself. It has been told and written a number of times, and I shall do my best to summarize it here. Flaherty, according to all accounts, was a man of remarkable wit and warmth, unconventionality, and stoutheartedness. He began working as a mining engineer and explorer, and on one of his early ventures into the Arctic took a camera to record what he saw. The film he brought back from this trip was subsequently destroyed by fire from his own cigarette. The loss was not mourned, however, for Flaherty found that he had taken a series of unrelated shots - "a scene of this and a scene of that." But it was enough to make him decide to go back and make a really good film about Eskimo life.
Flaherty's first concern was for financial aid, and after having been turned down by a number of potential backers, he finally succeeded in interesting a Paris fur company, Revillon Freres, in financing his trip and his film. The Eastman Kodak Company showed him how to "develop and print his film as he shot it so he could see the "rushes" as he worked.
Once having reached the Arctic, Flaherty, with his heavy and cumbersome equipment which often had to be carried over long portages, found the hardships formidable, and on several occasions he almost froze to death. He spent another year with the Eskimos, and in spite of the bitter cold and the primitiveness of the life, there is reason to believe that he loved every minute of it.
When he returned to New York, he had a film the likes of which had never before been seen. And within the next few years it was seen and loved by people all over the world. It has been said of Nanook, as of the old British Empire, that the sun never sets on it. Perhaps this is an overstatement. But now that 8 mm distribution of Nanook has been announced - fifty-three years after the first release of the film - it seems unlikely that its popularity will ever diminish.

Good humor is the keynote of the film, despite the grimness of the setting. Everyone seems to be playing
jokes on everyone else. There are so many little jokes, in fact, that sometimes it is hard to tell where they begin and end. In the introductory scene, for example, who can help laughing when about a dozen happy men, women, and children crawl out of the top of what seems to be a bottomless kayak? And who is kidding who then later at the trading post Nanook bites into a phonograph record which he grinningly has mistaken for a new kind of canned food? After trading his furs for civilized products he presumably had no interest in (practically no equipment or clothes for food from the outside world appear in the rest of the film), Nanook sets off in the same jovial manner for a new year of catching fish through ice holes, hunting furbearing animals, building magnificent one-night homes, outwitting and outpulling walrus, and in general providing for his family and his dogs as well as a man can be expected to, circumstances being what they are.
There is beauty in Nanook of the North - real beauty seldom equaled on the screen: the faces and postures of the people and animals; the skilled hand at work on an igloo; the peaceful dogs rolled up into snowy roundnesses on a stormy night; expanses of snow, hills and valleys, light and shadow. And there is drama such as only a skilled artist can convey: hunting, eating, and sleeping; the training of the child to take the place of the father; the fierceness of starving huskies; the limp, dead seal; the code of the walrus; the menacing sky; the magnitude of the place and the occasion.
As long as films can be preserved, and honger, this film will live as a master-unique in motion-picture history. But my word is not enough; here are the words of other reviewers: "It contains more beauty drama, suspense and excitement than a dozen average films." "Every shot is composed with the eye of an artist." "Nanook is filmmaking as we had almost forgotten it - a sequence of moving pictures telling their own story through the eye." "What gives Nanook its astonishing vitality? - the secret is something in Flaherty himself..."

## FOOLISH WIVES

(1922)

A RECONSTRUCTION OF THE ORIGINAL FILM BY AND WITH ERICH VON STROHEIM

After a few years of being an assistant to D.W. Griffith and a portrayer of Cruel Huns during the War, Erich von Stroheim talked Universal's Carl Laemmle into letting him direct and act in his film, BLIND HUSBANDS (1919). His second film, THE DEVIL'S PASSKEY, was also suecessful, and Stroheim was given a blank check for his first really big effort, FOOLISH WIVES.
Stroheim wanted to depict the confused melieu of post-war Europe in a realistic fashion, tracing all through the actions of a bogus court and his seductive, corrupt ways. The plot concerns a Russian emigre adventurer and two of his mistresses posing as his cousins, who lease a vilta on the sea near Monte Carlo. When a special American envoy accompanied by his young wife comes to confer with the Prince of Monaco, the imposters are anxious to meet and cultivate them. The "count" very Monaco, the ims. Hughes, first in an old hut where they are forced to take refuge from a storm, and later in the tower of his villa. The tower is set on fire by his maid, from a whom he has ast pisit to his counterfeiter, Ventucci, prepares to fiee. where he violates ventucci's reeble-minded daughter. She is his last vicrim,
Ventucci kills him and depositshis body in a sewer. The Hugheses arereconciled.
Stroheim was understandably worried about being removed from unis unual venture in the midst of production, so he made himself the star acior and shof all his key scenes first, leaving his backers no choice except to continue with him through to the end or to begin all over again at prohibitive expense. But Laemmle liked stroheim and supported the venture to the amount of $\$ 1,103,736.38$. The vast Monte Carlo set proved more expensive than Griffith's Babylon although much of the cost was for almost unobservable detalls, such as real plate-glass windows. Uitimately, an electric sign over Broadway spelled the director's name "Stroheim" - this film established the reputation for extravagence which helped cripple his career - but although FOOLISH WIVES lost money, its artistic success established Universal as a major studio. preparation and will be released when ready.

## READ BEFORE YOU ORDER

Blackhawk fims prices do not include post age. Shipping weights are given with each total weight cand postage charges by referring to the postage table given below. While weights of a single shipment to virtually alt post offices in continental United States are timited to 40 pounds, shipments to the states of Alaska and Hawaii may run as heavy as 70 pounds. These two states are in the eighth zone, and Blackhawk customers can approxi mate the correct postage to remit by figuring 18 C per pound for each pound above twenty. The same formula applies to all U.S. Territories and Protectorates.
Some larger and heavier items, because of size and weight, are not mailable and will thus be shipped to you by express or freight, you paying the transportation charges on delivery. In general, shipments of size and weight requiring express or freight transportation will not be forwarded on a C.O.D. basis.

    (2) We've discovered new, sharper 35 mm preprint material, which means our 6 mm and 8 mm reduction coples are of even better qualify than before.
    (3) We're using all of the originalinsertor parrative titles, including one title not existing in any 35 mm preprint material previously available to Blackhawk (meaning all existing prints are by definition not complete). In other words, we've scrapped the text titles that were made over by Blackhawk, in favor of these newly re-discovered original inter.titles, which had not decomposedlike-alltheothers. (4) Most important (for many of US), we have, at great expense, blocked out the small M-G-A lego within the original thaintitle-corets and replaced it with our own trademark; so that from now on, Blackhawk prints of TWO TARS will carry the original Hal Roach Studies main and and production credit titles! And that's new worth telling a friend about! (There'li be a Free Wheeling column next month with more discussion about original titles, why we cannot use the Metro trademark, and so on. Please hold back your letters til then!)
