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

# **LOWELL THOMAS** REMEMBERS OPENER

Restricted to United States and Canada

Do news cameras tell the truth? Does their presence affect the events they have come to record? What were the factors in the production of our twice-weekly newsreels? Lowell Thomas gives us some interesting answers, and shares some professional secrets with us in the Opener of his series, "Lowell Thomas Remembers". In the early days of newsreels, camera equipment was bulky and cumbersome. Camera crews set up their cameras, and filmed what passed before them — all very well for a parade that would pass a fixed spot, but otherwise-unsatisfactory. So some events were staged for the cameras, Lowell Thomas shows-us-a-specific example from World War I newsreel footage. Actors were hired, outfitted, and filmed in a re-enactment of a charge "over the top". The event had actually happened, but the cameras were not mobile enough to catch the action. The re-enactment was then included in films of front-line action, and shown in movie theaters to audiences eager for live coverage of the war. In the Opener, Lowell Thomas and the producers of his series help to put the newsreel in historical perspective. Strengths and weaknesses, moments of greatness and moments of fallibility, the newsreels were no different from the TV news programs of today. The newsreels included represent a record of honest, often dangerous newsgathering. The small bits of fakery, the occasional manufactured incidents in no way diminish the historical value of our look backward in "Lowell Thomas Remembers".

# **LOWELL THOMAS** REMEMBERS 1923 Restricted to the United States and Canada

Lowell Thomas traces the varied effects of the automobile, from the first traffic light in Newark, N.J. (built at a cost of \$20,000) to the construction of the Holland Tunnel, a forty million dollar miracle of engineering. Newsreel comeramen followed installation workers down with the caissons for the Tunnel, and high up to the

workers down with the caissons for the Tunnel, and high up to the towers of the partially-completed George Washington Bridge.

Organized auto races soon became annual sports events. The most famous, and most highly competitive, was the Indy 500, started in 1920. The first year's winner was a four-cylinder Frontenac, achieving an unbelievable 88 miles per hour!

Cross country races became popular, and you'll see one beautiful Packard on a remarkable trip — changing a tire without stopping (you'll have to see it to believe it!) and refueling in motion. The innocent beginnings of the dominant influence in our economic development, the motor car, were documented by the Movietone cameramen for newsreel audiences of the twenties — and now for us. now for us

**LOWELL THOMAS** 

1921, as Lowell Thomas remembers, was not so very long ago. American occupation troops of World War I returned from Europe, some with French and German wives, but all with a new awareness of life outside the United States. The shock suffered by black soldiers on their re-entry to American culture, from their occeptance as uniformed soldiers to their relection as United States citizens, became another facet of our national problem. Massive unemployment, with the highest percentage of unemployment among blacks, triggered demonstrations by members of the black population. Demonstrations became riots. Newsreels of 1921 picture re-emerged Ku Klux Klanners in white hoods and sheets, organizing to protect America from blacks and catholics with the avowed intention of keeping America "pure". President Harding, having campaigned for a "return to normalcy", pledged non-discrimination to all the unemployed.

# **LOWELL THOMAS** REMEMBERS 1927

The big story of 1927, perhaps of the decade — and still America's special legeno — was the Lone Eagle's flight from Curtis Field, Long Island to LeBourget. Movietone newsreel cameras, equipped with direct sound, recorded the echoes of his straining engine as The Spirit of St. Louis lumbered down the muddy runway. At Le Bourget, cameras filmed the enormous crowds waiting to greet hm and captured their shouts of joy. During his 33½ solitary hours in flight, the young mail pilot became a hero. A tamiliar story, but Lowell Thomas brings us some fresh insights: Lindberch's concern over having no visa in a foreign country; his legitimate worry about the safety of his plane — the fabric ripped from the wings and fuselage of The Spirit of St. Louis as souvenirs, even his flight log gone. his flight log gone

Lowell Thomas remembers two other major stories of 1927 that divided Americans on the domestic front; the attempt to enforce Prohibition, and the Sacco-Venzetti Case.

# **LOWELL THOMAS** REMEMBERS 1929

Black Tuesday, October 29th, 1929 was the day of the stock market crash. In retrospect, Lowell Thomas says "your guess is probably better than mine" about the cause. Movietone newsreel cameramen filmed interviews with economic experts, men like E. C. Forbes, who attributed the crash to speculation on borrowed money, buying an margin, and unsound business practices. Investors in airplane production, confident that small airplane sales would soon rival automobile sales, had lost their shirts four months previously. Strikes and demonstration by union workers, fearful of ignored the control of industry were met grudgingly, and big business attached the "communist" lobel to labor groups. Lowell Thomas remembers the shock waves that hit the U.S. in 1929, and shares Movietone newsreels that recorded the effects.

Fannile Brice, greatest of the Ziegfeld Follies stars, sang for Movietone newsreels of 1929. Her unusual voice and expressive face startled capricious New York audiences, and are just as entertaining today in our 47 year old newsreel film.

You will see FDR playfully whip up Convention delegates in his nomination acceptance speech, displaying the political skill that was to become the despair of the Republican Party.

Republican President Hoover, already identified with the Great Depression, became a sitting duck for the opposition after the well-documented Veterans' March on Washington, When 20,000 iobless World War I veterans marched on Washington hoping to mobilize economic assistance, they found full military force mobilmobilize economic assistance, they found full military force mobi-

Movietone Newsreels preserved a poignant event in 1932 — an interview with the anguished Charles and Anne Lindbergh, pleading for the return of their kidnapped child. # LOWELL THOMAS REMEMBERS 1933

Camera crews in the United States, in Europe and in Asia re-corded news events in 1933 that were to alter the course of history. Two dominant personalities came to tremendous power in the Western world: Hitler in Germany and Franklin Roosevelt in the United States, each of them fully aware of the potential of the cam-

The small Island nation of Japan had embarked on a wild The small Island nation of Japan had embarked on a wild course of aggression, spreading west to China. First Manchukuo, then the bordering province of Jehol faught with the invaders. The Great Wall of China became a familiar sight to American moviegoers as Fox Movietone's cameras recorded border skirmishes. Excellent newsreel clips show close-ups of the troops as Lowell Thomas shares his recollections. A watch tower shattered by bombardment, the Chinese and Japanese adversaries bundled against their common enemy, the piercing cold, ice boats being propelled toward shore along frozen waterfronts — all appeared as evidence of front line camera work. Matsuoka, Japan's delegate to the League of Nations, walked out of the League, refusing to accept censure for Japan's aggression.

# OWELL THOMAS REMEMBERS 1936

The 1936 Olympics, staged in Nazi Germany, were heralded as a showcase for Third Reich athletic superiority. Instead of Aryan Olympic achievements, however, audiences cheered and newsreel cameras recorded the astonishing performance of a black American, Jesse Owens, who won four gold medals and set long-standing records. The Olympics then, as in 1976, were unpredictable.

The emotional speeches of King Edward VIII of England, of Emperor Haile Selassie of Ethiopia, and President Roosevelt of the United States are landmarks of the historical year of 1936—and ones you will not want to miss.

Howard Hughes, recluse and mystery man of the last two decades, is remembered by Lowell Thomas as a tall, handsome, young pilot who circled the globe in 1938. At Floyd Bennett Fleid, Movietone newsreel cameramen filmed the youthful Hughes climbing into the cockpit of his twin-engine Lockheed Lodestar, oblivious of crowds and cameras. Thanks to newsreel reporting, you are able to see a remarkable gilmpse of America's mystery man before his disappearance behind his own iron curtain.

In Europe, Lowell Thomas reminisces about Hitler's occupation of Austria and the Sudetenland; and Prime Minister Chamberlain's "peace in our time" speech. Hitler's visit to Mussolini in Rome aroused fear in Europe, and ("Ims of military parades with goosestepping Roman legions did nothing to alloy that fear.

Lowell Thomas and Movietone News recall all these events and more, in this tumultuous year of 1938.

The second year of World War II brought invasion and betrayal to the countries of Scandinavia. German films of Denmark's
abject surrender to the invincible Nazi war machine: and official
films of German warships invading the vulnerable arm of the
North Sea between Norway and Sweden, the Skagerak, were sufficlent proof of Hitler's determination to dominate all of Europe.
The "peace at any price" Chamberlain was out, and pugnaclous Winston Churchill in, as wartime leader of the British Empilre. Lowell Thomas remembers the terrible bombing of Coventry,

# **LOWELL THOMAS** REMEMBERS 1942

Restricted to United States and Canada Lowell Thomas calls it ''1942, the year of the war'', and his recollections take us to battle scenes in the Pacific, the Sahara, the Mediterranean, and to embattled Russia. President Roosevelt, speaking to newsreel cameras, warned Americans "We are in danger of invasion of our mainland for the first time in the history of the United States". Off Cape May, New Jersey, a U.S. Warship was torpedoed; and on the Pacific coast, a California Oil Refinery was shelled from a Japanese submarine.

Lowell Thomas remembers many events that were never pub-licized. He shares one well kept secret, filmed and documented by cameramen and newsmen — FDR's 1942 tour of war plants in America. He and a few cabinet members and advisors visited San Diego; Willow Run outside Detroit (where he was photographed with Henry Ford); and the Chrysler tank factory, observing in each plant the accelerated wartime production.





Here was the time that Chaplin beam to come into his own. With more time devoted to the preparation of his films, his talent became even more in evidence and there was less and less dependence on slapstick. Almost all of his Essanay films were two reelers (most of them are or will be available from Blockhawk) and were more painstakingly produced. But so high had his popularity skyrocketed in 1915 that Mutual was able to sign him away from Essanay in February, 1916, at salary and bonus totaling \$670,000 for a year.

Triple Trouble

We have received many comments and suggestions from our customers regarding some of the price increases that recently went into effect. We, too, at Blackhawk are disturbed by the ever increasing prices that have been occurring in our economy and obviously in our marketplace. As an example, in the past 20 years, sales taxes have increased over 500%; income taxes have increased over 900%; postage rates have increased over 300%; propcreased over 900%; postage rates have increased over 300%; property taxes have increased over 300% and during this same time at Blackhawk we have been able to keep the pricing of our product below a terrible 200% increase, which on average has approximated 10% a year. Every cost inherent in running a business has had terrible inflation in the same past 20 years which probably doesn't need any pointing out to you our customer as you go to the food stores and your other daily activities each and every day. 



From nearly the first moment it was shown in December of 1914, THE BIRTH OF A NA-TION changed the history of motion pictures. It established the idea of film as a serious art form, established criffith's methods of movie storytelling as the basis of film technique, established friffith's methods of movie storytelling as the basis of film technique, established the director as the principal creative figure in filmmaking, and established film as a force for effective propaganda. Commercially, THE BIRTH OF A NATION was the first film to be presented as a legitimate stage attraction (the best seats cost \$2), with specially composed music performed at each screening by a large orchestra. THE BIRTH OF A NATION aroused a storm of controversy. Liberals and socialists condemned it, and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People was able to force certain cuts in the film. Theatrical showings of it were picketed as recently as 1973. Thus historically, THE BIRTH OF A NATION demonstrated that movies, no less than literature or traditional theatre, could become the subject of serious social, political and ideological discussion. In this way it brought film into a position of influence in the social life of the American nation.

If meladrama and controversy made THE BIRTH OF A NATION famous, it is its artistry that makes it last. After Griffith's death, the crific James Agee wrote that "the most beautiful single shot I have seen in any movie is the battle charge in THE BIRTH OF A NATION. It seems to me to be a perfect realization of a collective dream of what the Civil War was like, as veterans might remember fifty years later, or as children, fifty years later, might imagine it.

THE BIRTH OF A NATION has been in litigation since 1969, but in the last six years a great deal of additional footage on the film has come to light. And in the months ahead we will begin reconstructing a version considerably longer than even the "Official" version of 1915, whi

"Why is a company like Blackhawk in a place like Davenport, lowa?," our visitors frequently ask. A partial answer is that the long road to Super 8 home movies began in this city when ten Davenport businessmen backed Swedish immigrant magician Alexander Victor in establishing the Victor Animato-Graph Company in April of 1910. The Animato-Graph was a film and projector system designed for home use. Our local newspaper reported that the Animato-Graph "promises to revolutionize the motion picture business... as it will enable any person to take the motion pictures, develop and print them, and reproduce them on a screen in a simple manner and at small cost. It gives promise of making the motion picture machine as common and popular in the home as the phonograph". The Animato-Graph eschewed hazardous nitrate film, its images being arranged in a spiral on a flat glass disc. 'Why is a company like Blackhawk in a place like Davenport, loin a spiral on a flat glass disc

In 1912, Eastman Kodak finally suc-In 1912, Eastman Kodak finally succeeded in developing acetate, or "safety" film. Thomas A. Edison soon introduced a "Home Kinetoscope" using safety film 22mm wide which carried three images side by side, each about the size of a present-day Super 8 frame. Edison offered films from its rich backlog, which reached back to 1894, although the 22mm picture quality was not good.

Other manufacturers introduced

Other manufacturers introduced "home movie" systems using 17.5mm film, but as this width was achieved by the slitting of standard nitrate stock, 17.5mm quickly achieved the status of an outlaw after film blew up in clubs, schools, lecture halls, and even churches.

A better safety film system also intro-

A better safety film system also intro-duced in 1912 was developed in France by Pathe Freres, a firm which had dominated the French film industry since the turn of the century, and which had a formidable backlist of film subjects to offer in the new

28mm gauge. Soon Alexander Victor joined forces with Pathescope, which marketed the with Pathescope, which marketed the 28mm outfits in this country. Legislatures were induced to modify fire laws to recognize safety film, and in 1918 the Society of Motion Picture Engineers responded to Victor's pleas to adopt 28mm as the standard non-theatrical film size. Victor decided a continuous reduction printer to ard non-theatrical film size. Victor designed a continuous reduction printer to make 28mm prints from 35mm negatives and gave it to the industry free of patent restrictions. Vitagraph, World, Essanay, Kleine, Triangle, Metro, Kalem, and Paramount were among the pioneer companies to Join Pathe in selling 28mm prints of their film subjects. Unfortunately, safety film, even though less was required, was twice as expensive as nitrate; and few of twice as expensive as nitrate; and few of twice as expensive as nitrate; and few of the film subjects themselves were suitable for use in schools, churches and institutions. In six years, Victor built only 2,102 of his "Safety Cinema" projectors. Still, a surprising quantity of 28mm prints survives today, all of them free of nitrate decomposition and most of them in good condition. Blackhawk's laboratory has the nearly-unique ability to make high-quality 16mm duplicates from original 28mm prints, and AMERICAN ARISTOCRACY, HIS PICTURE IN THE PAPERS, and all of our PERILS OF PAULINE chapters among many others, were reproduced from 28mm materials. In Canada, 28mm lingered on until 1937, and among the later silent films found there is SHOOTING STARS (1928), Anthony Asquith's first feature and a delightful comedy-drama about ture and a delightful comedy-drama about

making silent movies.

Two years after 28mm was introduced,
J. G. Capstaff of the Eastman Kodak Research Laboratory, began to photograph
movies with a special experimental camera, developing the results by the so-called reversal process which gave the camera film back as a print finished for projection film back as a print finished for projection rather than as a negative. Because reversal films offered finer grain than the negatives then available, tests were made with smaller picture areas than the 35mm standard of the time. Various apertures such as 1/4, 1/6 and 1/8 the 35mm size were tried, and it was finally decided that a picture 1/6 the standard size was the smallest that could be relied upon for good results. This worked out to a frame 10mm by 7.5mm which, with 3mm on each side allowed for the perforations, gave a film 16mm wide with 40 frames to the foot. By 16mm wide with 40 frames to the foot. By the latter part of 1922, development work had reached the point that the Cine-Kodak process was scheduled for marketing the

process was scheduled for marketing the following year.

Here in Davenport, Alexander Victor quickly began design and fooling for a 16mm hand-crank camera and companion hand-crank projector, conceived for home use. Victor's equipment was the first 16mm cine machinery ever put on the market, advertised for the first time in the Davenport DAILY TIMES for August 11, 1923. A complete outfit cost one hundred dollars, and 203 of them were actually sold during 1923.

Victor had the 16mm Field to himself

Victor had the 16mm Field to himself for six months before Eastman took a dou-ble page in THE SATURDAY EVENING POST to announce its Cine-Kodak camera and projector. Six months after that, Bell

Howell announced the first springwound motor driven 16mm camera and an occompanying Filmo projector. Both com-panies were as determined as Victor to make a success of 16mm and their available resources greatly exceeded those of the Davenport firm. To provide attractive films for home showing, Eastman's Koda-scope Libraries obtained rights to rent and sell 16mm prints of current and recent features produced by Paramount, Fox, Warner Brothers, First National Pictures, and a number of smaller companies. Bell & Howell offered a wide selection of Uni-

& Howell offered a wide selection of Universal's popular features and westerns for sale in 16mm to home users and libraries.

The legacy of the early 16mm libraries is to be found in private film collections and archives all over the world, for the scattering of prints which survives from these early years often constitutes the sole testing to the constitute of the search with the search of important film miles. these early years often constitutes the sole archival record of important film milestones from fifty years ago. Blackhawk's laboratory has two custom-built printers designed for exceptionally high-quality copy work from 16mm originals, and among other films, THE HUNCHBACK OF NOTRE DAME, CHARLEY'S AUNT, and BARNEY OLDFIELD'S RACE FOR A LIFE were restored from early 16mm reduction prints. As a practice, however, duction prints. As a practice, however, Blackhawk does not copy from 16mm un-less its master print was reduced directly from the camera negative with excellent results, and unless the film itself is of ex-ceptional interest.

In the 1920's 16mm was an instant if small-scale triumph. It is still a growth in-

Steady progress in reversal image quality made it possible to consider a film even smaller than 16mm. Pathe introduced a 9.5mm film in 1923 which offered duced a 9.5mm film in 1923 which offered excellent quality and remained popular in Europe until very recent times; but even though the narrower film promised greater economy than was possible with 16mm, costs of manufacturing, packaging, handling and processing remained the same whatever the film width. In order to realize a cost reduction comparable to the film size reduction, it was necessary to use existing 16mm equipment as far as possible. size reduction, it was necessary to use existing 16mm equipment as far as possible. Eastman Kodak therefore decided to use a double-width 8mm film which could be made, packaged, photographed and processed in 16mm form but then slit down the center and spliced end to end for projection. Cameras and projectors for 8mm film were introduced by Kodak in August, 1932, and what we know today as "Standard 8mm" increased rapidly in popularity, especially after the introduction of Kodachrome in 1935. Super 8, which in the last few years has supplanted Standard 8mm, was developed to increase the prolast few years has supplanted Standard 8mm, was developed to increase the proportion of the film area that could be devoted to image rather than perforation, and to make room for an optical sound track. Of course, current practices favor Super 8 with magnetic sound, but this exciting film gauge is still very much under active development, and competition between Super 8 and the various electronic recording and image disc systems which recording and image disc systems which are soon to emerge from research labora-tories should make the new few years live-

May I close on a personal note? This is the last column I'll be writing as a mem-ber of Blackhawk's management. I am reper of Blackhawk's management. I am returning to California as Director of Special Projects for the Directors Guild of America. I am grateful for the enthusiams and the kind thoughts so many of you have shared with me these past three years, and like you, I'll continue to look to Blackhawk for guidance and leadership in the collector hobby. Sir James Barrie's adaptation, while consistent in time and place with Shakespear's, departs from the original in the somewhat whimsical characterizations, particularly noticeable in Rosalind. Elisabeth Bergner starts out as a sty, gentle young malden, wide eved and breathlessly eager but when she is banished and assumes the guise of a young man, not only her costume changes but also her entire personality. The sheer energy of her Rosalind is certainly equal to the vigor with which Olivier portrays Orlando.

A dog that didn't bark, a curry dinner, a telegram from a small village, and a man who isn't interested in football are the clues used by the amazing Sherlock Holmes to foil his old foe Professor Moriarity in this film based on the short story "Silver Blaze" by Sir Arthur Canan Doyle.

Arthur Wontner, a Basil Rafihone look-alike, portrays Holmes with a mixture of wry humbr, camplete confidence, and cool aloofness. Professor Moriarity, as characterized by Lyn Harding, is reminiscent of Sidney Greenstreet, but is hymotless and more sinister than Greenstreet ever was. Ian Fleming's Dr. Watson is an adequate foil for the restrained and brilliant Holmes — bafiled by what Holmes calls "telementary" and appreciative of Holmes' occasional sarcasms.

The story begins with Dr. Watson advising Halmes to take a vacation. It happens that Holmes has received an invitation to visit Sir Henry Baskervilles at his estate. Holmes fans will recall Sir Henry from an earlier adventure, THE HOUND OF THE BASKERVILLES. The vacation is short-lived as Baskervilles' daughter's fiance Jack Trevor is accused of stealing Silver Blaze, a race horse, and murdering the horse's keeper. Holmes steps in to investigate at the Baskerville's request. The moster sleuth proves Trevor's innocence and discovers that his arch-enemy, Professor Moriarity, is involved. The horse is recovered in time for the big race, but there are more surprises in store in this suspenseful mystery from the files of fiction's greatest defective.
