Greetings! Among the exciting vintage releases and re-releases in this supplement, we are especially happy to present two editions of LIMOUSINE LOVE, a brilliant Charley Chase comedy from 1928, described as "his best film" by Leonard Maltin. Our silent copy was restored from the original camera negative, and although it has small quirks, it is the most complete version seen in many decades. Our sound edition is quite a slick abridgement prepared by Robert Youngson in 1958 for "The Golden Age of Comedy" but not released in that pioneering compilation. (Youngson included a much shorter abridgement of LIMOUSINE LOVE in his later anthology, "Four Clowns", but this one is rather different).

Here for the first time in 16mm is one of the most unusual films ever produced, THE LOG OF THE U-35. It is an amazing, authentic record of torpedo attacks and sinkings by a German U-Boat during the First World War. Abridgements of this captured film were released in 1919 both in England and in the United States; we assembled material from several sources to bring you a more complete version than any other to be found.

Also described in this supplement and never previously released by Blackhawk are complete versions of NIGHT MAIL and NORTH SEA, two superb British films of the 1930s which mix documentary, re-enactment, poetry and music in ways which were completely fresh then and are still exciting today; the 1917 Swedish comedy THOMAS GRAAL'S BEST CHILD, directed by Mauritz Stiller and starring Victor Sjostrom; and a new collection of early travel films from Pathe Freres including a fine example of the Pathechrome stencil color process.

Not only have we restored original main titles to THE BOHEMIAN GIRL, but with every copy sold we will also include the original script, reproduced from Antonio Moreno's personal copy. ANGORA LOVE is here with the original Vitaphone score, which greatly enhances this lovely comedy and is surprisingly well-recorded.

Hal Roach's craftsmen create two reels of brilliant comedy out of Charley's desperate effort to get her out of the way, while Edgar is out of the way, while the innocent bride is out of the way! The silent version is substantially complete and is restored from the original negative, with most of the titles extended from flashframes, a few of them replaced, and some decomposed scenes edited back in from the abridged version. The excellent abridgement is taken from Robert Youngson's 35mm negative and adds narration, music and sound effects.

The very funny plot is too complicated to explain, but nothing deters our hero from cluding the police, capturing jewel thieves, and winning fair Ethelyn Gibson's hand. Quality is very good. Wrote the trade paper Film Daily, 'Here is a short comedy, just sizzling over with rapid-fire laughter-stirring situations, that click equally well with youths and adults. Laurel and Hardy are an unctious pair of funsters that always boom along on a current of rippling merriment. True, they are the very incarnation of acrobatic famble bugs and ludicrous what-nots that defy the straight line of analysis; but oh, boy, who cares about the proprieties of cinema construction when two big ginks are pulling off stunts that would shake all the sugar out of a chronic diabetic all tied up in knots of laughter." The last silent Laurel & Hardy short, this film was released with a synchronized music score on Vitaphone discs, here re-recorded to film. BIRTHDAY BLUES *

The flint-hearted father of Spanky and Dickie Moore not only forgets his wife's birthday two years in a row but is proud of the accomplishment. While she lies sobbing, Dickie depletes his savings to buy her a "pip" of a dress — a late 1922 model — but he's still short of the \$1.98 required, so with the help of Stymie and Dorothy, the boys decides to sell bites o chance in a homemade cake to be filled with such "valuable prizes" as suspenders, a hairbrush, a mousetrap, soap, an old shoe, and a co-neob pipe. The cake resembles a volcano in the oven and looks like a cornerstone when it emerges, except for the bulge that quakes, making a sound gradually intelligible as insanely reassuring words from a talking doll, "sleep well, sleep well, sleep well, sleep well..." CAVALCADE OF GIRLS

And the daredevils: ten-year-old Mildred Unger doing the charleston atop a plane, Gladys Ingle in a plane-to-plane mid-air transfer... Amelia Earhart, Texas Guinan, Ruth Elder and many more -- all from the now-amusing perspective of 1949 ("curves are really back"). (10 minutes)

I REMEMBER WHEN

In this fond glimpse of the decade before 1914, fire-horses and trolley-cars move through the urban scene. GO TO THE MOVIES AND SEE THE WORLD

CINEMATOGRAPHE SOUVENIRS OF AMERICA (1896-97) \$85

About two months after the first projection of Edison films at Koster & Bial's Music Hall in New York, two Lumiere operators began showings with their French "Cinematographe" at a theater only one block from the brownstone where D. W. Griffith was to begin making films a dozen years later. Once its success had been proved, new Cinematographers arrived from France until finally, twenty-four operators toured the United States performing Lumiere films in cities large and small. "I earn six dollars a day," one of them wrote, "though it is true that the existence at hand is rather tiring. At the same time I must arrange the scenes, take the views, and operate the projector." Cinematographe Souventrs of America presents American Lumiere subjects restored from excellent 35mm prints. Scenes include the inauguration of President McKinley, a parade of the Chicago police, street and harbor scenes in Manhattan and Brooklyn, and a cavalry review of the U.S. Army. This compilation of thirteen films is about the same length as an original Cinematographe exhibition. In the words of a contemporary reviewer, "one has never seen animated views until one has seen this apparatus." (13.5 minutes at 18 fps, silent)

PANORAMIC IMPRESSIONS OF OLD NEW YORK (1903-1905) \$85

Taken a few years after the amalgamation of Brooklyn, Queens. Richmond, the Bronx and Manhattan into Greater New York, this film shows the growing city in scenes taken from the top of the newly-erected New York Times building, in a boat capturing the skyline from the Hudson and East rivers, the new Brooklyn Bridge, Blackwell's (now Welfare) Island, and other sites "around the town." Rephotographed by Blackhawk from 35mm paper prints in the Library of Congress, the picture quality is variable but is mostly OK; a plano score is recorded for reproduction at 18 frames per second. [15 minutes]

PATHE FRERES PRESENTS THE WORLD (1908 and later, part color) \$85

After Charles and Emile Pathe bought the Lumiere motion picture patents in 1901, they undertook (with a great deal of success) to industrialize world cinema by establishing offices for the sale of films and equipment in remote corners of civilization. Often, Pathe Freres also began local film production, always to high technical and photographic standards. The beautiful Moscow Clad in Snow (1908) from the series "Picturesque Russia" offers painterly winter scenes unchanged from the century before; Rice Culture in Indo-China takes us to that distant French colony, now Vietnam; while Playground of Kings, reproduced in Eastman color, visits Brighton and other English locations while also providing an outstanding example of the Pathechrome improved stencil-coloring process which was introduced in 1910. Prints are fine; the color segment constitutes approximately 5.5 minutes of the 14-minute running time. (silent, 18 fps)

GAUMONT GRAPHIC (1918-19)

A popular weekly newsreel which was issued every Thursday on a States Rights basis, this "Gaumont Graphic" was released just weeks after the Armistice of November 11, 1918 and pictures the aftermath of war in Europe, the first movements of U. S. troops from Europe back to the United States, and early stages of demobilization. While basically a complete original issue, one or two stories have been replaced with others of greater interest from the following weeks. [15 minutes at 18 fps, silent]

MEMORIES OF STEAM ON WESTERN RAILROADS (late 1940s) \$160

Photographed when steam locomotives were still widely used on major assignments, this assortment of action shots including the last generation of steam power on six western railroads recalls fond 'memories of steam.' Represented are the Great Northern, Union Pacific, Denver & Salt Lake, Rio Grande, Western Pacific and Southern Pacific. Nineteen locomotive types are pictured, as are such named trains as the Coast Daylight and the California Zephyr. [22 minutes, silent]

CINTEMA MAGIC BY MELIES

THE SUPERNATURAL OF MELIES (1903) \$75

Without question the cinema's first creative artist, Georges Melies, a professional stage illusionist in Paris, proved film a media suited to the fantastic and bizarre. Using miraculous appearances and disappearances, superimpositions and other tricks, Melies filled the two films on this reci. The Infernal Caultiron and The Damnation of Faust, with exuberant activity and impressive imagination lineluding forced perspective to create a great plaster hell in Faust, even though the stage on which he worked was very small). Copied by Blackhawk in 1964 from 35mm paper positives in the Library of Congress. (9 minutes at 18 fps, silent)

THOSE SMASHING, SENSATIONAL, SUPER SERIALS

CLIFF-HANGING MOMENTS FROM THE SERIALS \$8

When "Continued Next Week" flashed on theater screens in the early 1920s, it generally left the hero or heroine of some popular serial of the day in danger of losing life or limb (or both) — and the audience eager for next week's installment when one breathtaking crisis was passed and another immediately encountered. Some of the flavor of these "chill hangers" and their thrill-packed episodes is found in excerpts from three popular serials of the era — The Steel Trail (1923), which featured William Duncan and Edith Johnston, and is represented by its trailer; A Woman in Gray (1920) with Arline Pretty and Henry G. Sell, with an edge-of-the-seat climax to Chapter 9, "Burning Strands;" and Captain Kidd (1922) with Eddie Polo in a desperate battle on shipboard. (15 minutes at 18 fps, silent)

THE PURPLE DAGGER (Chapter Two of THE TRAIL OF THE OCTOPUS)

Subjects dealing with the supernatural were in vogue after World War I and The Truit of the Octobus leans quite heavily in that direction perhaps accounting for the 1920s French surrealists' rapturous acclaim of this senal. As the noted criminologist Carter Holmes, Ben Wilson attempted to foil the evil plot of the mysterious "Monsteur X" on Seal Island, which, of course, deeply involved costar Neva Gerber. Chapters one and two left the hero in deadly peril. But Blackhawk added the opening sequences from Chapter three, Face to Face, to bring this excellent example of the silent "cliff-hanger" to its conclusion. [37 minutes at 18 fps, silent)



SILENT FEATURE FILMS

THOMAS GRAAL'S BEST FILM

1917) \$35

The two great names of Swedish cinema's first golden age collaborate in this charming romantic comedy. Mauritz Stiller directs Victor Sjostrom as Thomas Graal, a successful screen scenarist subject to bouts of indolence and romantic mooning. The present object of his yearning is Karin Molander's Bessie, a wealthy free spirit who has run away from her long-suffering parents. She works for Graal until one day she is driven away by his over-exuberant — though, as it turns out, not entirely unwelcome — affections. The balance of the action describes his elaborate efforts to find her and, once having done so, to win her. Between the two lovers a there is a spirited spontaniety and a mutual understanding that is completely beguiling. Thomas Graal's Best Film is also a robust satire on cinema, and the ham, sham and exaggeration that sometimes take reality's place. The satire is enhanced by a sophisticated structure, featuring flashbacks within flashbacks and subjective visualizations of the characters' changing impressions. Because our prints carry British titles, the film is called Wanted: A Film Actress and character names are anglicized. (68 minutes at 18 fps, silent)

THE NARROW TRAIL

(1917)

In his first production for Paramount-Arteraft, William S. Hart plays Ice Harding, who finally captures and tames the wild pinto that captured his attention, but the outlaw's gang isn't too happy—the horse's distinctive markings make him easy to identify. Ice breaks with his cohorts rather than part with his new friend and sets out to locate an old girl friend (Sylvia Bremer). He finds her on San Francisco's Barbary Coast and for a short time, happiness returns. But the truth will out—she's become a "dance hall girl" (that is, worse). This final blow is more than the ex-outlaw can take and mounting Fritz, he heads back to the mountains. Joseph August's beautiful photography is nicely-displayed in this (ine print, to which an orchestral score has been added. (56 minutes)

EYES OF YOUTH

(1919)

Clara Kimball Young, then a great lady of the screen, heads a remarkable silent-era cast including Edmund Lowe, Gareth Hughes, Milton Sills, Ralph Lewis, Pauline Starke, Lionel Belmore, and Rudolph Valentino in a fine adaptation of Max Marcin's 1917 stage play, Mrs. Young portrays Gina Ashling, who believes she could enjoy a successful operatic career, but she feels a sense of responsibility to her family, and her slippery and impecunious father urges her to marry a wealthy man. A wise man from the East shows her in his crystal what her future will be if she follows the paths of Duty, Ambition, and Wealth, All lead to desperate unhappiness, disgrace and destruction of character, as a result, Gina decides to marry the man she loves. This lovely film was directed by Albert Parker, best known for helming John Barrymore in Sherlock Holmes and Douglas Fairbanks in The Black Pirate. Prints are excellent. (100 minutes at 18 fps, silent)

END OF ST. PETERSBURG

(1927)

The revolution in October-November, 1917, transformed Tsarist Russia into the Soviet Union, when communist-led troops deposed the coalition government in the old imperial capital of St. Petersburg inow Leningrad, but apparently soon to become St. Petersburg again!). In 1927, to commemorate the tenth anniversary of these events, the Soviet government commissioned a film by each of its two most famous directors, Sergei Eisenstein and Vsevolod Pudovkin. October, Eisenstein's film, became a theoretician's brilliant demonstration of ideas on the nature of cinema. Full of spectacular scenes, it is, nonetheless, cold and intellectualized. End of St. Petersburg, Pudovkin's film, is built around the problems of an individual family in which the characters also stand for broader concepts. It functions both on the story level and on the symbolic level, and is exciting and emotionally stirring. Both directors

filmed in actual locations where events of the revolution occurred, and as their deadlines grew close, the two production crews converged. One night, while Eisenstein shelled the Winter Palace from the river, breaking three hundred windows, Pudovkin's crew bombarded the building from the land, severely damaging the cornice! In any case, both of the resulting films have become classics, documenting both in form and content one of the most significant events in modern history.

Altogether Pudovkin mace fifteen feature films before his death in 1953, three in association with the famous Soviet co-director, Dmitri Vasillev. Long after Pudovkin's death, Vasillev, working with the film's original cameraman Anatoli Golovnia, supervised the reconstruction and avoring of the version presented here. Our release, taken from a 35mm master print imported directly from the Soviet Union, is the best-looking and most complete version available in North America. Blackhawk's English inter-titles were translated by Professor Steven P. Hill, a leading authority on Soviet film history; the synchronized score is performed by a full orchestra. (76 minutes)

DISNEY ANDVATION

ALICE ON THE FARM

(1925)

Disney's "Alice" was inspired by the then-popular "Out of the Inkwell" series which Max and Dave Fleischer were producing. In this series, Fleischer's Koko the Clown would pop off the drawing board and find adventure and mischief in a live action world. Disney reversed the process and put a real little girl into an animated world. He used a number of neighborhood children as actors, first photographing the simple actions of "Alice" against a white backdrop, then superimposing this image over an animated story in which "Alice" interacted with the animal characters. This eighteenth film in Disney's "Alice in Cartoonland" series was scored with an orchestra for reissue in the early years of sound. (10 min.)



THE LOG OF THE U-35

(1919)

\$175

This captured German film documents the submarine command of Lothar von Arnauld de la Periere, who sank 194 ships between 1915 and the end of World War I. As Kevin Brownlow writes in The War, The West and The Wilderness, it "is devoted mainly to the last moments of Allied shipping in the Mediterranean, and it contains some sobering shots. In one of them, the camera is set up on the comning tower, looking forward, as a torpedo is fired directly amidships at an ore-carrying ship, S.S. Maplewood. The torpedo splashes into the water, churns a white path to the squat merchantman, which erupts with a tall pillar of smoke and water and sinks in less than two minutes. The S. S. Parkgate is badly holed after a running fight, and the crew abandons her in lifeboats. A destruction party from the submarine rows across in a small boat, opens safety valves, and places explosive charges in the hold. The submartne's guns fire and ... Fer boilers explode at the moment she sinks beneath the surface." Many other such scenes are also included in this edition, which was assembled from fragmentary English-titled versions preserved by the Imperial War Museum and in Blackhawk's archives. All of the source material was rather blanched and grainy, having first been copied in the teens from projection prints, and some nitrate deteriorisation is visible. However, we worked hard to balance the various sources and the film is most impressive despite its technical deficiencies. (34 minutes at 18 fps. stlent)

GREAT BRITISH DOCUMENTARIES

NIGHT MAIL * (1936)

This account of the overnight journey of the Postal Special — an express mail train from London to Glasgow — is one of the most renowned of all documentaries. The train carries no passengers and is manned entirely by Post Office workers who sort the mail and drop it off en route as they speed through the heart of England and Scotland. The workers and the importance of their tasks are presented with much more than surface description; they are the film's dominant elements. But the style of the film explains its fame: a mix of studio and location filming directed by Harry Watt, a beautifully layered sound track by Cavalcanti which makes poetry of sound effects, music by Benjamin Britten, and verse by W. H. Auden, Prints are from an authentic British negative and are quite good. [23 minutes] Restricted to United States.

NORTH SEA * (1938)

Paul Rotha maintains in his book Rotha on the Film that "historically the realist tradition of the story documentary later associated with Ealing Films stems from North Sea. as also did some of the major war films by the Crown Film Unit." Certainly, this film stands today as one of the great British documentaries, with its real-life drama, superbohotography, acting, editing and sound work. "The guts ... are simple enough," writes Rotha. "The crew of a trawler at home in Aberdeen in the early morning ... Out to sea. A storm, just the biggest ever, all unfaked .. For 48 hours they hang on like grim death... and back to Aberdeen. No commentary, Just plain speech and a wonderful soundtrack by Cavalcanti." Written and Directed by Harry Watt. Prints are from an authentic British negative. (30 minutes) Restricted to United States.
