

Dear Friends,

Welcome to the wonderful world of Gene Autry! Beginning with this issue we bring the first four of our coming Autry westerns to you. We are still working through the remaining elements that exist on the full length versions so I cannot tell you at this time what, for sure will be coming in the next months and year in this fine collection. At your request, we are searching to find the best material of the full length Autry's. Tom Voss notes that the sound tracks on some of these films are not as "clean" as latter day films, but we have worked to get the best possible from known materials at this time.

In further response to your many requests, pages 75 and 77 bring back the first of SALE PRICES in the Digest. We hope these are helpful to all on a fixed film budget and all of those of us who like to save money!

As you probably know by now, Kodak[®] has raised the price of black and white film stock by 22% and color stock by 14%. While this drastically affects us, we are studying the facts and do not plan any price increases before our June Digest.

As this Digest goes to press, we are deeply involved in the laboratory change you have come to know and hate. By way of explanation, the re-

tirement of our lab of many years caused us to have to remake our negatives, about 1000 of them. It takes about 3 weeks to get an acceptable negative, when everything goes right. Needless to say, everything does not go all right when making 1000 negatives at one time and trying to stay in business also. In addition the cost to date has been well over \$50,000 and still growing. Carl and Tom believe with me that this was the right thing to do for all our good customers. We appreciate your patience during this extreme situation. I should comment that in a good week we can get about 20 negatives so it has been a long as well as costly undertaking.

Thank you for thinking of Blackhawk.

BACK IN THE SADDLE AGAIN

by John Wilch

Instead of tapping on the telegraph, the twenty one year old relief operator named Gene Autry sat with his feet on the Frisco Line counter top, leaned back and strummed his guitar. It was nearly midnight when a customer interrupted Autry's Chelsea Oklahoma Blues. The visitor motioned for Autry to continue playing. When he was finished with his copy, Will Rogers peered across the counter and said to Autry, "You know, with some hard work, young man, you might have something. You ought to think about going to New York and get yourself a job on radio."

*Where the Longhorn cattle feed,
on the lonely jimson weed.*

A year later, when his railroad job seemed less secure, young Autry took a leave of absence from the Frisco Line and travelled to New York City, riding free on his railroad pass. After several weeks in recording company anterooms, Autry hadn't even auditioned. The sun shone on his guitar the day two executives overheard him singing for the receptionist at Victor. They advised Autry to learn to work in front of a microphone. He was given a To Whom It May Concern letter to help him find a radio job.

*I'm Back in the Saddle Again
Ridin' the range once more
Totin' my old forty-four*

In 1929 Autry returned to New York, ready to record. He cut a record for Victor and a test record for Columbia. Arthur Satherly, the top executive at American Record Corporation, a division of Columbia, told Autry, "Victor is big, but they have lots of stars. You can get lost over there. With us, you can be Number One." The next day he signed a contract with ARC.

American was producing records under separate labels for Sears-Roebuck, Kresge's and W.T. Grant. Sears was impressed by Autry's strong sales on their Conqueror label. In 1930 Satherly sent Autry to Chicago, where Sears contracted him to appear on their radio station WLS (World's Largest Store). For four years Sears presented "The Gene Autry Program" on WLS. Autry also headlined the famed "National Barn Dance" show on WLS during this time.

Autry had a solid job, a happy marriage and a hit record, "That Silver-Haired Daddy of Mine." He co-wrote "Daddy" with Jimmy Long, his wife's uncle.

Ultimately, he would be involved in writing over one hundred songs, many of them

smash hits. "Daddy" became the first gold record in the history of the recording business. Autry followed "Daddy" with six other gold records, including "Rudolph" and, of course, "Back in the Saddle Again."

Out where a friend is a friend

"Well, hell," boasted John Wayne to Autry at a party, "if I'd kept on singing, and worked at it, you wouldn't have stood a chance."

"Duke," cracked Autry, "it wasn't my singing that put me over. It was my acting."

Where the only law is right

The B Western code of right was outlined in Gene Autry's Ten Commandments.

1. Never take unfair advantage.
2. Be trustworthy.
3. Be truthful.
4. Be kind to kids, elderly, animals.
5. Have no racial/religious prejudices.
6. Help people in distress.
7. Be industrious.
8. Be clean in thought/speech/ action.
9. Respect women, parents and the law.
10. Be patriotic.

"The old days were not necessarily better. I only know they were slower and less cynical. You could talk about setting an example for young people without blushing." — Autry

*I'm Back in the Saddle Again
Whoo pi ti yi yo
Rockin' to and fro*

Autry's musical efforts rank with the finest country music. The songs were basic country with touches of Mexican blues, Western Swing and hillbilly. The lyrics were simple, yet Autry conveyed a quality a country fan might find only in early Ernest Tubbs recordings, an emotional truthfulness that comes from and goes to the heart.

*I'm Back in the Saddle Again
Whoo pi ti yi ya
I go my way*

In 1934, the Legion of Decency condemned "immoral" Hollywood movies. The Legion was powerful and the ensuing ballyhoo caused all studios to conform to the edicts to some degree. Mascot Pictures was reacting to the Legion and hoping, like Sears, to cash in on Autry's popularity when they introduced him to the movie-going public in a Ken Maynard vehicle, IN OLD SANTE FE. This was followed immediately by a part in a Maynard serial, MYSTERY MOUNTAIN. Be-

cause the response to Autry was favorable, he was top-billed in the unforgettable serial, THE PHANTOM EMPIRE, in 1935. PHANTOM, a delicious blend of cowboy and sci-fi, was enormously profitable for Mascot.

In 1935 the horse opera was born with TUMBLING TUMBLEWEEDS. As the gag went, "Them bandits have beaten mah mother, ravished mah girl, burned down mah house, killed mah best friend and stolen all mah prize cattle. Ah'm gonna get em if'n it's the last thing ah do — but first folks, ah'm agonna sing ya a little song."

TUMBLEWEEDS was followed by 89 Autry features. The casts generally included a comic relief sidekick, a background choral, Champion, "World's Wonder Horse", the lovely leading lady, the victims and the villains. Autry always kept his gloves and hat on as he brandished these modernistic outlaws and their machine guns, airplanes, cbs and other technology with Champion (the horse that outran cars), six guns and fists.

Some dismissed Autry as a lousy actor, but the public continued to patronize. As Alva Johnston wrote in The Saturday Evening Post, 9-2-39, "Like Gary Cooper and Jimmy Stewart, Autry has a kind of awkwardness and embarrassment that audiences like."

From 1937 to 1942 Autry was on the top ten moneymakers' list of Hollywood stars, with Flynn and Gable. In 1939, his fan mail peaked at 50,000 letters a week.

I'm Back in the Saddle Again

When was Autry ever really out of the saddle? As a child in Tioga, interrupting his movie career at its apex to fly C-109s for the Air Transport Command in World War Two, immediately after the war when Roy Rogers was the number one screen cowboy...? The latter "crises" time has disproven with Autry entertainment and business successes. As for the former, Autry left his childhood behind, but presented a child's West to the movie-going public. Although he observed, "Growing up is simply one of the debts we must pay to society," he had to admit, "about Westerns and the people who were a part of them... that it was a great way to not grow up."

Melody Ranch is not only the title of this movie, it is also the title of the radio show that Gene and the boys star on in New York City every week. There is also a ranch named Melody Ranch that Gene has decided to return to when he retires. Ann Miller has the role of "Rosie", his on-mike sweetheart. Off-mike, this is really a case of her chasing him until he catches her. Gene is visited by George "Gabby" Hayes who invites him and his companions to Gene Autry Day in Torpedo. Once there, Gene is forced to defend not only his honor but that of "Rosie" and all of the decent folks of the town. Gene finally runs for the job of sheriff and is elected. As Sheriff, he handily cleans up the town. There is plenty of music throughout. It is easy to understand why Gene Autry is so popular. He means good entertainment.

B **MELODY TRAIL**² (1935)

The delightful wild west of 1935. Great riding, roping, bronc riding, and steer wrestling in a rodeo where Gene wins the one thousand dollar prize. Gene loses his winnings to a gypsy thief and seeks a job at a ranch owned by the father of a pretty girl Gene had spied in the stands at the rodeo. The father, T. T. Thomas, is having rustler problems, his crew has left and he now runs the spread with a crew of cowgirls. On top of this he is burdened with his daughter's dog, a thief named Souvenir!

Gene and Smiley get the job as cooks, and the fun begins when Souvenir takes the cookbook and the dinner starts with one tablespoon of baking powder, three tablespoons of red pepper . . . Then in rapid succession, the cattle are rustled, a baby seems kidnapped and Gene captures the kidnapper (with Souvenir's help) and the cattle rustlers single handed.

Robinhood of Texas is a wonderful, old fashioned western in which the good guys wear white and triumph over the bad guys in black. Gene Autry, with the magnificent Champion Junior and also the Cass County Boys maintain their flawless reputation of always being the good guys by helping the local Sheriff round up a team of bank robbers along with all of their loot. At the same time, they salvage an almost defunct ranch by fixing it up and turning it into a fancy dude ranch. We are treated to the enjoyable singing style of Autry and the Cass County Boys. Along with the music we are treated to several good chases in classic horse opera style as well as the triumph of all of the good guys putting out a fire that threatens to consume the barn at the ranch. This is a not to be missed movie for western lovers both young and old.

A ranch owning gangster comes to town, with the sheriff hot on his heels, to see his partner, the storekeeper. He's double crossed by the storekeeper and is killed in a shoot-out, but first exacts a promise from Gene. Gene agrees to become the guardian of his three boys, the sons of the gangster Gene once befriended in the east, Chicago. After Gene and Frog bring the boys to the ranch they fall into the hands of a gang of cattle rustlers. The boys learn about and then help the rustlers hide their rustled cattle behind a waterfall on the ranch property. The local Sheriff is called in to help solve the mystery of the disappearing cattle. He deputizes Gene so that he can help apprehend the criminals. As always we are treated to several songs including, "He's In The Jailhouse Now." Smiley Burnette, as Frog Millhouse, sings "The Story of Trigger Joe." There is a good chase with Champion showing us his beautiful form plus a fight or two. This is definitely superb entertainment.

A Blackhawk Biography

Charles Spencer Chaplin was born on April 16, 1889, in London, England to vaudevillians. Charles was taught to jig and sing as soon as he could toddle. He was barely two years old when his mother was boasting about his acting. At parties, after their own performances, his parents would pull Charles out of bed, stand him on the table and have him recite for the group. He could mimic everyone he saw and sing all the songs. At five, Charles had his stage premiere, replacing his mother who was suddenly taken ill. His father pushed him onto the stage and ordered him to sing an old coster song, "Jack Jones." Charlie overcame his terror and sang with all his might. He was showered with coins and had to be pulled from the stage. At ten while playing "Casey's Court Circus" in the Channel Islands, he found that his jokes were not getting over because the natives knew little English. He resorted to pantomime and got the desired laughs. From this he learned the power of pantomime which became the major element in his art.



In 1926 Stan Laurel was fed up with vaudeville and welcomed a job at Roach Studios. He was most welcome there as a gagman and director as well as a performer. Oliver Hardy was a performer there and loved it. Stan was directing GET 'EM YOUNG, and Hardy was playing the butler. One evening Ollie scalded himself severely while preparing a leg of lamb and the studio asked Stan to step in. Stan resisted. He wanted to be behind the camera, but he was persuaded by an increase in salary. Stan was reconciled to being a comedian although he certainly never gave up his function as a gagman. Stan and Ollie got larger parts while the other players' grew smaller. They fit so well together not only because they were such contrasting figures but because they understood the "reality" underlining a gag. This was the evolution of the team of Laurel and Hardy.

A Blackhawk Biography

More than half a century ago a pioneer film producer named Hal Roach conceived a comedy that captured the innocence and spontaneity of "just plain kids". In 1922 OUR GANG was born and for the next twenty-three years America watched with relish, the antics of the Little Rascals.

The Rascals were a rag-tag, mischievous bunch of kids pitted against rich kids, sissy kids, and the regulating class conscious world of grown-ups who would stand in the way of the only thing they were interested in — making their own fun. These kids had imagination, inventiveness, and common sense (plus an occasional neighborhood Grandma) on their side, and for the delightful Little Rascals, that was enough. The series was often copied, but never matched. OUR GANG films are as fresh today as the day they were born.

A Blackhawk History

In the beginning there were many pioneers: the Frenchmen Lumiere and Melies plus the American Edison were among them.

Compared to the films these men produced, the earlier magic lantern shows and shadow plays were undynamic, one dimensional and mundane.

In 1895 all that changed. That year French audiences were astonished to see a train move toward the camera in a production by Lumiere.

After Lumiere refused to sell Georges Melies a camera or explain how his worked, Melies set out to create one himself.

Melies succeeded and used his machine as a showman's tool, emphasizing both movement and magic. He had grasped the fantastic possibilities of film. His sets, effects and techniques were remarkable achievements then . . . and today remain spectacular.

Eventually Melies produced 4,000 or so films which did not merely record events . . . they told stories.

In America the Edison Co. had begun making "pictures" using their Kinetoscope, a peephole contraption used in penny arcades.

Edison director Edwin S. Porter, agreed with Melies that movies should tell stories and so shot THE GREAT TRAIN ROBBERY, one of the classic "primitive" films.

There were, of course, other film pioneers (Pathe, Lubin, Morrison, etc.) which later filmmakers built on. But from 1895 to 1915, Lumiere, Melies and Edison's Porter were the most influential.

Darla Hood: HEARTS ARE THUMPS

Her mother made up the name Darla, then somebody at the studio misspelled it Darla; everyone liked the name, and it stuck. Since then lots of parents have liked "Darla," too, and named their daughters for Our Gang's heartthrob. It's a household name today. So much for spelling lessons.


In 1936 Darla Hood had signed a seven year contract with Hal Roach Studios. Her beginning salary was \$75 per week. She soon learned to be terrified of the prankish Alfalfa, but had a mild crush on Spanky. Around the lot she'd been officially christened "Cookie, Our Gang's Sweetheart." Only nobody would call her that — most everyone naturally enough preferring "Darla." So much for nicknames.

The studio casting director had discovered the youngster performing quite by accident at the Edison Hotel in Times Square, and she was hastily written into a film then already in production, *OUR GANG FOLLIES OF 1936*. Not surprisingly, Darla clicked in her *Little Rascals* debut, working as the billboard girl who also sings "I'll Never Say 'Never Again' Again." It was the first of fifty *Our Gang* Comedies she would make over the next six years, and this happily unpretentious musical is also the film she most enjoys viewing today.

Darla Hood was too young to remember much about the production details of making *FOLLIES*, but she has some clear observations on the series itself: "Our films were based on the kinds of activities kids would normally be involved in anyway; the only thing is that the studio provided us with the sets, props, costumes, and everything else to go with it all. For the longest time, I wasn't even aware that I was being photographed. I was so young it was like living in a dream world, and I hardly remember the first few pictures I did, and I wasn't even aware that they were movies. Even when I was making my screen test, they just kept telling me, well do this and that, and I thought I was sort of performing just for them. I didn't understand what a motion picture camera was, or what it was doing in the way of recording my actions."

Within her first year at Roach she was eagerly snapped up for jobs in other units around the lot: Charley Chase used her in *NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSE* (originally shot as a feature entitled *BANK NIGHT*), and Stan Laurel liked her radiant innocence and cast her in the title role for *THE BOHEMIAN GIRL*.

When in 1941 she was graduated from a career as *Our Gang's* femme fatale, there came a difficult period of adjustment. "I had trouble associating with people not in show business," she explains. Like most *Little*

Rascals alumni she found it hard to understand why the world had stopped worshipping her at twelve. She was well able to cope with her plunge from the limelight, however, and while never regaining full-flung stardom, she has been quietly successful over the past two decades as a behind-the-scenes performer in the entertainment business. "Quietly," though, is perhaps a misnomer.

Gifted with an unusual three-octave range voice, for some thirty years Darla Hood has been specializing in trick voices for cartoons and commercials. Noisy ones. Tons of them. Listen for her. Darla's career as a vocal impressionist has brought her jobs in vital films like *BILL AND COO*, *AIRPORT*, and *A LETTER TO THREE WIVES*. Recently she completed the dubbing for an animated *Little Rascals*

television special to be aired on CBS next season. Incredibly, she plays the schoolteacher, Miss Crabtree. So much for type casting.

While long married, and having lived for many years in North Hollywood, she still goes "on the road" for club dates, singing engagements, and personal appearances, such as the *SONS OF THE DESERT* convention in Chicago last summer, where admirers found her delightful, and delightfully unmistakable... as the Darla Hood of *Our Gang*.

CHAPLIN, POET OF MOVEMENT

This is a very curious world.
So many things are happ'nin'.
For all the girls
Wear Pickford curls,
And boys play Charlie Chaplin.

— *Motion Picture World*, 1916

Looking at the Chaplin Keystones in living rooms, it can seem puzzling to a modern viewer that they had such tremendous impact



on audiences in 1914, vaulting Chaplin to unprecedented fame. Characters and plots seem rudimentary and full of clichés. The comedy depends largely on outrageous behavior such as hitting people over the head with bricks, or of women acting in tomboy-ish ways — sure laughs, no doubt, in that polite society, but uninteresting today.

The key to this popularity lies in Chaplin's extraordinary physical communication with his vast public. To best understand that communication, we will isolate the movement in each part of his body.

Chaplin's head is proportionally large for his body, and appears even more so when framed by his shock of curly hair. Often he holds it directly over his trunk, more upright than the average person — Keaton, by contrast, cranes his forward. A certain self-containment is implied by this head position, consistent with Chaplin's comic attempts to alter the world to meet his needs.

A convention of the period was for actors to address the camera and audience directly. Chaplin made this device peculiarly his own, glancing at and laughing into the lens. He often does this with such subtlety it is scarcely perceptible that he is engaged directly in a dialogue with the audience — in effect extending an invitation to share his feeling about the scene.

Chaplin established his intimate relationship with the camera explicitly in *KID'S AUTO RACE*, his first Tramp film, by addressing his glances and poses at a prop camera, even when not looking directly into the lens, he orients his face frontally towards the camera, inviting clear inspection of his reactions. The make-up itself is a strong, compelling pattern: clown-white as a background to enlarged eyebrows, outlined eyes, and square moustache clearly defining nose and mouth position. His face becomes in effect a bulls-eye drawing audience attention. The derby recapitulates the shape of the moustache. Chaplin's face on screen is almost invariably much whiter than that of the other actors. This aspect of his "magnetism" is far from accidental.

If Chaplin uses his head and face to invite the audience into the scene, it is with his trunk that he ensures emotional involvement. Sympathy is, of course, aroused by his small 5'4" stature, and Chaplin has described how he draws his shoulders in and back to look even smaller. He further exaggerates his smallness by his too-small coat, which also serves to outline clearly his trunk position, critical since subtle changes communicate Charlie's depression, bluffs and other feelings. Like his head, his trunk is presented frontally to the camera. Chaplin turns it to face the audience even when he is addressing characters at his sides. Further, he consistently presents his trunk openly, never crossing his arms over it. He invites trust by being so physically open. This emotional clarity and openness is extended to his physicality with the other screen

characters. He touches people to an extraordinary degree. His flirtations with women — slinging his leg onto their laps, "accidentally" lifting their skirts with the cane that is often an extension of his arm — are startling even today. In 1914 it was to many people downright obscene.

Chaplin's positioning of his pelvis is a clue to his success with such "risque" material. He holds it tilted backward under him, in effect withdrawing his sexuality. This has the effect of making his touching more sensual than sexual. In profile or with his back turned, this also presents his posterior, the "arse" being a prime comic object in his films, as the least dignified portion of the anatomy. Thus Charlie examines it anxiously after falls or gunshots, and rubs it solicitously. In other people it is something to kick, brush off, sit on as they bend over to unlock doors, or move casually out of the way as he passes.

Taken as a whole, Chaplin's posture and costume make an image of cartoon like simplicity on the screen. The strongly patterned face, dark small jacket, baggy pants and splayed oversize shoes together make a distinctive silhouette commanding attention. The posture suggests both the image of a child, with large head and back-tilted pelvis — another "character" within Charlie, whose innocence and exuberance softens his bolder gags; and a parody of a ballet dancer, the earth-bound feet, and baggy pants a comic contrast to the dance-like precision and choreography of his movements.

Chaplin's famous walk is more complex than is generally realized. Rather than the "waddle" it is often imitated as, it is in fact firmly anchored; though Chaplin can appear light for comic effect, most of the time he appears firm and earth-bound. The walk proceeds from his knees, each foot drawn up flat and advanced forward — a peculiar stride made necessary by the size of his shoes and his splayed feet. On occasion he alters the walk, emphasizing its earth-bound qualities to indicate fatigue or depression, notably in *THE NEW JANITOR* (1914). Chaplin reports one of the actresses on the set breaking into tears at his acting in this film, cuing him as to the serious dimensions of his character. In *THE TRAMP* (1915) he first exits down the road at the end, transforming his depressed walk into an elated one with a shrug, his knees and shoulders pumping up and down, his head inclining from side to side.

DAN KAMIN is a professional mime who performs his original comedy pantomime shows at theatres and colleges throughout the U.S. He has made several specials currently circulating on PBS.

His inspiration for getting into mime was seeing Chaplin for the first time at age nineteen, and he is currently taking time off from his performance schedule to write *CHAPLIN MOVES*, an analysis of Chaplin's films from the central focus of his mime skills.






