
The Novascope technical staff have continued their endeavours to provide optimum print quality. Additional equipment has been installed and processing is now contracted to the Kodak Laboratory where the prints receive the same carefully controlled treatment required for microfilm stock. Although these improvements are costly, we are holding existing film prices for the time being. A large number of interesting films of every kind has now been acquired for 9.5 mm release over the next two years but we would like to know what subjects appeal most to readers. As a final haven of peace they escape in a dinghy to a quiet spot in the middle of a lake, but unfortunately the boat sinks.
