PAUL'S FIRST KISS

Our hero Paul is a "wild mountain flower" not much interested in girls who is nevertheless ardently courted by Grace O'Reilly, operator of a nice little illicit still. One day Grace is apprehended by "The Duchess" — a strong-arm Excise officer as well as the leader of the Cohens — who for long has had her beady eye on Paul. She forces the hapless youth into an assignation by threatening to arrest Grace and then engages Paul in a laughable seduction scene.
