Please review these instructions carefully before submitting an abstract.

1. With regard to research using human subjects, The Protein Society endorses the protections embodied in the Basic Principles of the Declaration of Helsinki and their expansion in the regulations governing research supported by the U.S. Government (45 CFR Part 46; 56 FR 28003). The Protein Society does not endorse and will not publish the results of research that was not conducted in accordance with these Principles. Investigations involving animals reported in abstracts must have been conducted in conformance with the FASEB Statement of Principles for the use of animals in research and education (<http://www.faseb.org/Policyand-Government-Affairs/Science-Policy-Issues/Animals-in-Research-and-Education.aspx>).

2. While it is rare for a submission not to be programmed, The Protein Society reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to decline any abstract viewed as inappropriate.

3. **Software Required:** Be sure to have most recent versions of the browser – Safari, IE, Firefox, Chrome.

- Click the payment option link in your confirmation email to complete payment for abstract submission.
- Have your credit card number to pay the nonrefundable submission fee. Your credit card will be charged once you complete the payment process. **The fee is nonrefundable and is not refunded for withdrawn submissions.**
- Have your abstract number ready (abstract number is given to you in your abstract confirmation email).
- If you are not Protein Society member, you will be asked for your sponsor's full name, and member ID # again.

Abstract Guidelines

1. Each abstract should contain:

- A sentence stating the study objective (unless given in the title);
- A brief statement of methods, if pertinent;
- A summary of the results obtained;
- A statement of the conclusions. It is not satisfactory to say "the results will be discussed."

2. Abstract Title and Body:

- Enter the title of your abstract in Title Case (i.e. cap the first letter of each word, except prepositions). Do not put a period at the end of the abstract title.
- Capitalize initial letters of trade names.
- Use standard abbreviations for units of measure.
- Other abbreviations should be spelled out in full at first mention, followed by the abbreviation in parentheses. Exceptions: DNA, RNA, etc.
- Cut and paste the body of your abstract from a Word doc or text file into the Abstract body area of the form. Be sure to Save your abstract. You will be able to proofread your complete abstract before submitting it as final. The abstract body of the abstract should not exceed 260 words. You will not be permitted to proceed if you do not meet the character guidelines.
- DO NOT enter the title or authors again in the body of the abstract. The title, author and co-authors will automatically be included in the final abstract.
- If your abstract contains tables, graphics or figures, upload them on the "Charts, Tables, Figures" section. All Figures and/or tables will be placed at the end of the abstract text.
- You will be able to Proofread before final submission.

3. Abstract Revisions:

- DO NOT submit the abstract more than once. The abstract submission site allows for revisions.
- Go to the login page and enter the account holder's Username and Password and make edits on next screen.

4. Late Breaking Abstracts:

- Late-breaking abstracts will not be considered for travel awards, young investigator talks, undergraduate research session, and/or contributed talks.

2. **Hans Neurath Outstanding Promise (HNOPTA):** Sponsored by the Hans Neurath Foundation, HNOPTA recognizes exceptional research results of early-career scientists with outstanding promise and provides them with the opportunity to present their research at the annual symposium.
 - Eligibility: Graduate students, post-doctorate students, and very early-career scientists within two years of an independent research position, excluding assistant professors at US academic institutions and other positions with start-up funds.
 - Applicant or reference of applicant must be a member.
 - Submission: Explain your role in the presented research (maximum 100 words), publications list (maximum 500 words), list of awards/honors (maximum 500 words), and 1 letter of recommendation (*must be a Society member if applicant is not*).
3. **Finn Wold Travel Award and Protein Science:** Under the strong belief that attendance at our Symposia presents an invaluable opportunity for future protein scientists, TPS is committed to making it possible for young scientists to participate and benefit from our Annual Meeting.
 - Eligibility: Undergraduate students, graduate students, and post-doctorate students.
 - Applicant must be (or become) a member of The Protein Society.
 - Submission: Explain your role in the presented research (maximum 100 words)

1. **Contributed Talks:** We strongly encourage the submission of abstracts to be considered for the Contributed Talks sessions. The Protein Society is proud to have selected 25% of its speakers from this category, in 2016.
 - Eligibility: Open to all
2. **Protein Science Young Investigator Talks:** A hallmark of The Protein Society Symposium is the special emphasis placed upon fostering the growth and development of young scientists. 1-2 Young Investigator speaking slots are reserved in each session.
 - Eligibility: Post-PhD researchers in either academics or industry or any independent research position and within eight years of getting their Ph.D. degree. (Membership *not* required).
