



PS36 GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

Travel Grants and Talks Abstract Submission Deadline: April 7

Abstracts Submission Deadline for Posters & Poster Competition: May 30

OVERVIEW

Regarding research using human subjects, The Protein Society endorses the protections embodied in the Basic Principles of the Declaration of Helsinki and their expansion in the regulations governing research supported by the U.S. Government (45 CFR Part 46; 56 FR 28003). The Protein Society does not endorse and will not publish the results of research that was not conducted in accordance with these Principles.

The Protein Society reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to decline any Poster/Abstract viewed as inappropriate.

The abstract submission fee is nonrefundable and is not refunded for withdrawn submissions.

All approved abstracts that are presented at the 2022 Annual Symposium will be published in a special online edition of *Protein Science* in the Fall of 2022.

POSTER / ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

Each Abstract Should Contain:

- A sentence stating the study objective (unless given in the title);
- A brief statement of methods, if pertinent;
- A summary of the results obtained;
- A statement of the conclusions. It is not satisfactory to say "the results will be discussed."

Abstract Title and Body:

- Enter the title of your abstract in Title Case (i.e. cap the first letter of each word, except prepositions). Do not put a period at the end of the abstract title.
- Capitalize initial letters of trade names.
- Use standard abbreviations for units of measure.

- Other abbreviations should be spelled out in full at first mention, followed by the abbreviation in parentheses. Exceptions: DNA, RNA, etc.
- Cut and paste the body of your abstract from a Word doc or text file into the Abstract body area of the form. Be sure to Save your abstract. You will be able to proofread your complete abstract before submitting it as final.
- The abstract body should not exceed 300 words. You will not be permitted to proceed if you do not meet the character guidelines.
- DO NOT enter the title or authors again in the body of the abstract. The title, author and co-authors will automatically be included in the final abstract.
- If your abstract contains tables, graphics or figures, upload them on the “Charts, Tables, Figures” section. All Figures and/or tables will be placed at the end of the abstract text.

Abstract Revisions:

- DO NOT submit the abstract more than once. The abstract submission site allows for revisions. Go to the login page and enter the account holder’s Username and Password and make edits on next screen.

Poster Size:

- Posters are displayed on a standard poster board with the dimensions of 4ft x 8ft. We encourage the use of the standard landscape scientific poster dimensions: 48” X 36” .

Tracks:

- Choose two tracks that closest match your research.

 - Integrating Techniques to Address Challenges in Protein Structural Biology
 - Machine Learning in Protein Science

 - High Throughput Protein Science
 - Celebrating 100 Antibody Drugs
 - Structure and Dynamics Perspectives on Enzyme Function
 - Seeing 3D Structures in Cells: Cryo-electron Tomography Blazes the Trail
 - Miniproteins: Are There Really That Many Additional Genes That We Have Been Missing?
 - Protein and Ligand - A New Marriage Between an Old Couple

Notifications:

- Abstract submitters will be notified within 10 days if their abstract has been accepted.

Schedule:

- Abstracts will be scheduled on July 7, 8 or 9, between (tentative) 4:30 p.m. – 7 p.m. EST. The poster presentations occur during the mix and mingle receptions. The schedule will be confirmed in June 2022.

Types of submission

- POSTER only
- FLASH TALK (2 min; included in scientific session)
- SENIOR Contributed Talk (30 min; senior investigators; included in scientific session)
- YOUNG INVESTIGATOR Contributed Talk (15 min; graduate students and scientists within 8 years of receiving their Ph.D.; included in scientific session)
- UNDERGRADUATE Contributed Talk (10 min; undergraduates only; presented in the undergraduate research session)
- UNDERGRADUATE Poster Competition
- GRADUATE Poster Competition
- Finn Wold & Protein Science Travel grant (membership required to receive award)
 - Eligibility: Undergraduate students, post-baccalaureate students/research assistants, graduate students, and postdocs.
The award includes reimbursement of up to \$400 (U.S. and Canada) and up to \$800 (international) for travel and accommodations expenses, symposium registration and/or abstract submission fees. Protein Science awards are sponsored by Wiley.

- Diversity Travel grant (membership required to receive award)
 - Eligibility: Undergraduate students, post-baccalaureate students/research assistants, graduate students, and postdocs from any institution; junior faculty from minority-serving institutions.
The award includes a 2-year membership with the Protein Society, reimbursement of up to \$400 (US & Canada) and up to \$800 (international) for travel accommodations expenses, symposium registration and/or abstract submission fees."

Poster competitions:

- The 36th Annual Symposium will feature a graduate and undergraduate poster competitions. A panel of judges (who will remain anonymous) will review the posters, as well as participate in the poster sessions for students who are enrolled in the competitions. Winners for both the graduate and undergraduate competitions will be announced during the plenary session on July 9, 2022. Each winner will receive a check in the amount of \$250.

By submitting an abstract, authors and co-authors authorize publication of their abstracts on The Protein Society website, the official program and other related publications.

Abstract Submission Fees

The abstract submission fee can be paid via the links below, or when registering for the Symposium. [Register](#) to take advantage of the discounted (early) Symposium registration rates, ending May 30th.

Note: The abstract submission fee is non-refundable and separate from the registration fee. The abstract submission fee for regular submissions is due April 7, and May 30 for late-breaking abstract submissions. Abstracts without a submission fee by the respective deadlines will not be considered or included in the annual Symposium.
