The Tatanic was a ship which sank April 15 , 1912, on her maiden voyage from Southamp. York City. 1,517 lost their lives and 706 persons were rescued. Its sinking was the greatest peacetime maritime disaster.
There were no formal newsreel organizations in 1912, but many production companies did offer special events on an in-
