The Verb	The Meaning	An example
To back <i>Translate:</i>	To support physically or verbally someone	I had the backing of everyone.
To back away <i>Translate:</i>	To move away from something backwards.	He back away and left them to it.
To back down <i>Translate:</i>	To admit that you were wrong or that you have been defeated.	Eventually, he backed down and apologised.
To back off <i>Translate:</i>	To retreat and leave someone or something alone.	Back off will you!
To back out <i>Translate:</i>	To decide not to do something that you had said you would do:	He backed out of the agreed investment.
To back up <i>Translate:</i>	To save something on a computer to safe place.	I feel better now that all of my work is backed up.
To break <i>Translate:</i>	To break a something, into two or more pieces.	She fell and broke her arm.
To eye <i>Translate:</i>	To look at someone or something with interest.	Martin eyed my cake until I'd finished.
To eye up <i>Translate:</i>	To look at something or someone with special interest.	He eyed her up, but didn't dare say hello.
To finger <i>Translate:</i>	To touch or feel something with your fingers:	She fingered all the material to find the best.
To head <i>Translate:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To hit a ball with your head. • To lead a group of people. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Paul headed the ball and scored. • Rajoy is the head of the government.
To head away <i>Translate:</i>	To move in / off to / another location.	It's time to head away to another place.
To head off To head out <i>Translate:</i>	See 'to head away'	
To mouth <i>Translate:</i>	Forming words with your lips without making any sound.	The singers only mouthed the words.
To mouth off <i>Translate:</i>	To speak badly about something/one.	Jane is always mouthing off!
To neck <i>Translate:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To kiss and hold a person in an amorous way. • To strangle something or someone until it has no life 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They necked in the back of the cinema. • My brother necked the chickens quickly.
