The Verb	The Meaning	An example
To attire Translate:	To dress (especially in fine elegant clothes).	(Rarely used in conversation)
To buckle Translate:	To fasten an item of clothing with a buckle.	She buckled up her daughters shoes.
<b>To button</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To fasten an item of clothing with buttons.	She buttoned up her cardigan before she went outside.
To clothe Translate:	To dress (yourself or someone else).	(Rarely used in conversation)
<b>To do up</b> Translate:	To fasten an item of clothing.	She did his jacket up for him before he left the house.
To dress Translate:	To put clothes on (yourself or someone else).	She dressed before she went to work.
To dress up Translate:	<ul><li>To wear your best clothes.</li><li>To wear a costume / disguise.</li></ul>	<ul><li>She enjoyed dressing up to go out.</li><li>He dressed up as a Vampire.</li></ul>
<b>To fasten</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To secure an item of clothing, using zips, buttons or buckles.	She fastened his jacket to make sure he didn't get cold.
To hang out	<ul><li>To dry clothes outside after washing.</li><li>To spend time with friends.</li></ul>	<ul><li> It was a nice, so she hung the washing out.</li><li>We just hung out and chatted.</li></ul>
<b>To hang up</b> Translate:	• To put something on a hook or a hanger.	• She hung her clothes up every night.
To have on Translate:	<ul> <li>To end a phone call.</li> <li>To wear an item of clothing on one's person.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>I was furious and hung up!</li> <li>She had a red t-shirt on when he saw her.</li> </ul>
To kick off Translate:	<ul> <li>To remove your shoes quickly.</li> <li>To start a football match.</li> <li>To start trouble.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>He kicked his shoes off and sat down.</li> <li>The match kicked off at 2,00pm.</li> <li>It kicked off and we had to call the police.</li> </ul>
To put on Translate:	See To dress	He put his shoes on before he went out.
To slip on Translate:	To put on an item of clothing easily.	She slipped her sandals on before she went into the sea.
To take off Translate:	To remove any item of clothing.	He took his shoes off before he went to bed.
To throw on Translate:	To put on an item of clothing quickly and without thought.	She was in such a hurry she just threw on a few clothes before she left the house.
To try on Translate:	<ul> <li>To put on an item of clothing to find out whether it fits or is suitable.</li> <li>To trick or lie about something/one</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>She always <u>tried</u> shoes <u>on</u> before she bought them.</li> <li>I'm not one to try it on.</li> </ul>



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<b>To turn up</b> Translate:	To shorten trousers, a dress or a skirt so that they fit better.	Her jeans were too long, so she turned them up.
To undress Translate:	To take off clothes	He undressed before having shower.
To unfasten Translate:	To undo or open an item of clothing.	He unfastened his tie before he took it off.
<b>To unzip</b> Translate:	To unfasten an item of clothing using a zip.	She unzipped her jacket when she got too warm.
<b>To wear</b> Translate:	To have an item of clothing on your body.	He wore her best suit for the interview.
<b>To wear in</b> Translate:	To put something on so that you can make them comfortable.	I had to wear in my new boots before the match on Saturday.
<b>To wear out</b> Translate:	To wear / use something so much that it becomes old and useless.	I wore my boots out after only one season.
<b>To wrap up</b> Translate:	To put on warm clothes.	His mother told him to wrap himself up warm because it was so cold outside.
<b>To zip</b> Translate:	To fasten an item of clothing using a zip.	She zipped up her jacket before she went outside.
<b>To zip it</b> Translate:	To be quiet and not make a noise.	The teacher told me to zip it because I was talking too much in class.
<b>To zip up</b> Translate:	To fasten an item of clothing using a zip.	It was cold outside, so he zipped his jacket up.
