The Verb	The Meaning	An example
To attire <i>Translate:</i>	To dress (especially in fine elegant clothes).	(Rarely used in conversation)
To buckle <i>Translate:</i>	To fasten an item of clothing with a buckle.	She buckled up her daughters shoes.
To button <i>Translate:</i>	To fasten an item of clothing with buttons.	She buttoned up her cardigan before she went outside.
To clothe <i>Translate:</i>	To dress (yourself or someone else).	(Rarely used in conversation)
To do up <i>Translate:</i>	To fasten an item of clothing.	She did his jacket up for him before he left the house.
To dress <i>Translate:</i>	To put clothes on (yourself or someone else).	She dressed before she went to work.
To dress up <i>Translate:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To wear your best clothes. • To wear a costume / disguise. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • She enjoyed dressing up to go out. • He dressed up as a Vampire.
To fasten <i>Translate:</i>	To secure an item of clothing, using zips, buttons or buckles.	She fastened his jacket to make sure he didn't get cold.
To hang out	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To dry clothes outside after washing. • To spend time with friends. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It was a nice, so she hung the washing out. • We just hung out and chatted.
To hang up <i>Translate:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To put something on a hook or a hanger. • To end a phone call. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • She hung her clothes up every night. • I was furious and hung up!
To have on <i>Translate:</i>	To wear an item of clothing on one's person.	She had a red t-shirt on when he saw her.
To kick off <i>Translate:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To remove your shoes quickly. • To start a football match. • To start trouble. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He kicked his shoes off and sat down. • The match kicked off at 2,00pm. • It kicked off and we had to call the police.
To put on <i>Translate:</i>	See To dress	He put his shoes on before he went out.
To slip on <i>Translate:</i>	To put on an item of clothing easily.	She slipped her sandals on before she went into the sea.
To take off <i>Translate:</i>	To remove any item of clothing.	He took his shoes off before he went to bed.
To throw on <i>Translate:</i>	To put on an item of clothing quickly and without thought.	She was in such a hurry she just threw on a few clothes before she left the house.
To try on <i>Translate:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To put on an item of clothing to find out whether it fits or is suitable. • To trick or lie about something/one 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • She always <u>tried</u> shoes <u>on</u> before she bought them. • I'm not one to try it on.

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To turn up <i>Translate:</i>	To shorten trousers, a dress or a skirt so that they fit better.	Her jeans were too long, so she turned them up.
To undress <i>Translate:</i>	To take off clothes	He undressed before having shower.
To unfasten <i>Translate:</i>	To undo or open an item of clothing.	He unfastened his tie before he took it off.
To unzip <i>Translate:</i>	To unfasten an item of clothing using a zip.	She unzipped her jacket when she got too warm.
To wear <i>Translate:</i>	To have an item of clothing on your body.	He wore her best suit for the interview.
To wear in <i>Translate:</i>	To put something on so that you can make them comfortable.	I had to wear in my new boots before the match on Saturday.
To wear out <i>Translate:</i>	To wear / use something so much that it becomes old and useless.	I wore my boots out after only one season.
To wrap up <i>Translate:</i>	To put on warm clothes.	His mother told him to wrap himself up warm because it was so cold outside.
To zip <i>Translate:</i>	To fasten an item of clothing using a zip.	She zipped up her jacket before she went outside.
To zip it <i>Translate:</i>	To be quiet and not make a noise.	The teacher told me to zip it because I was talking too much in class.
To zip up <i>Translate:</i>	To fasten an item of clothing using a zip.	It was cold outside, so he zipped his jacket up.
