| Be after Translate: | To try to obtain or find | What's he <i>after</i> ? = What's he looking for ? |
| Be against Translate: | To be opposed to | I must say I'm <i>against</i> the idea. |
| Be along Translate: | To arrive | Jack will <i>be along</i> soon. He's on his way. |
| Be away Translate: | To be elsewhere | She is <i>away</i> today. She has gone to London. |
| Be down Translate: | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To be depressed or sad. • To decrease | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The news is bad so John is a bit <i>down</i> today. • Oil prices were <i>down</i> today. |
| Be down with Translate: | To be ill or have caught a disease. | My mother is <i>down with</i> a bad cold. |
| Be in Translate: | To be present (at work/at home) | I'll <i>be in</i> all day so you can call me anytime. |
| Be in for Translate: | To have reason to expect something. | I think we are <i>in for</i> snow today. |
| Be in on Translate: | To be involved with or participate in something. | Alex is <i>in on</i> the project too. |
| Be into Translate: | To be interested or involved in something | He's <i>into</i> sports and she's <i>into</i> politics. |
| Be off Translate: | To leave to go somewhere | <i>I'm off!</i> I've got a plane to catch. |
| Be on Translate: | To be functioning | The television <i>is on</i> . |
| Be on Translate: | To take medication or drugs | The driver <i>was on</i> drugs at the time of the accident. |
| Be on about Translate: | To mean, try to say | What are you <i>on</i> about? I don't understand. |
| Be on to/Be onto Translate: | To make a discovery | My colleague is excited. He must <i>be on to</i> something |
