Phrasal Verb	Meaning	Example
Look after Translate:	To take care of.	A babysitter <i>looks after</i> the children when we go out.
Look at Translate:	<ul> <li>To pay attention to something you see.</li> <li>To read in order to give an opinion.</li> <li>To examine closely.</li> <li>To consider or study carefully.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Look at this picture of my grandfather when he was young.</li> <li>Have you got time to <i>look at</i> my business plan?</li> <li>That's a bad bruise. You should ask a doctor to <i>look at</i> it.</li> <li>We're going to <i>look at</i> all possible options.</li> </ul>
Look ahead Translate:	To think of the future.	It's time to forget the past and <i>look ahead</i> .
Look away Translate:	To turn your head away.	The scene was so horrible that I had to <i>look away</i> .
Look back on Translate:	To remember the past.	Older people tend to <i>look back on</i> the « good old days ».
Look down on Translate:	To consider as inferior.	He looks down on anyone who is not successful.
Look for Translate:	To try to find something.	Jane went shopping to <i>look for</i> a pair of shoes.
Look forward to Translate:	To await with pleasure.	I look forward to seeing you next week.
Look in Translate:	To visit for a short time.	Sue promised her mother she'd <i>look in</i> on her way home.
Look into Translate:	To examine or investigate.	I'll <i>look into</i> the matter and call you back.
Look on Translate:	To be a spectator at an event.	Bill didn't take part in the fight. He just <i>looked on</i> .
Look out Translate:	To be careful, pay attention.	Look out! There's a car coming!
Look over Translate:	To examine, review	The editor will <i>look over</i> the article before it is published.
Look through Translate:	To examine, usually quickly	I'll <i>look through</i> my mail to see if I can find your message.
Look up Translate:	To find information.	I had to look up the number in the phonebook.
Look up to Translate:	To respect or to admire.	He was a great teacher. The students <i>looked up</i> to him.
