<b>To bowl</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To throw a ball in a certain way.	He bowled ten fast balls.
<b>To catch</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To grab hold of something, especially something that is moving through the air.	Luckily he caught the ball before it crossed the line.
<b>To cheat</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To break the rules in order to win.	He cheated by taking steroids.
<b>To compete</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To take part in a race or competition.	She has competed in all the London marathons.
<b>To dribble</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To move a ball along the ground with repeated small kicks or hits.	She dribbled the ball into the goal.
<b>To draw</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To equal the score in a contest sport.	They drew 1 all
<b>To draw on</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To use knowledge or experience gained.	He drew on his experience to solve the problem and explain how it was done.
<b>To draw up</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To write a formal contract or agreement.	A new contract was drawn up for another 10 year lease.
<b>To head</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To hit a ball with your head.	Owen headed the ball into the back of the net.
<b>To head back</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To return to a place.	After the game they head back home.
<b>To head of</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To go to a place	They headed of to the pub after work for a well-deserved drink.
<b>To head out</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To leave a place and go to another.	They headed out early in the morning.
<b>To hit</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To swing your hand or an object onto something so that it touches it, usually with force.	He hit the ball over the wall.
<b>To hit out</b> <i>Translate:</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To hit a ball in a game so someone loses.</li> <li>To lose your temper and become violent.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>They were hit out after <math>\frac{3}{4}</math>'s of the game (Cricket)</li> <li>He hit out at everyone when they caught him stealing.</li> </ul>
<b>To jog</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To move along at a slow, steady, jolting pace as a form of exercise.	He jogs to work every morning.
<b>To lose</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To fail to win a game.	They have lost every match this season.
<b>To play</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To take active part in a game or sport.	He couldn't play because of an injury.

<b>To race</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To attempt to be first.	Michael Schumaker had been racing for many years before he retired.
<b>To ride</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To sit on a horse or a bicycle and travel along on it controlling its movements.	She rode very well.
<b>To run</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To move along alot faster than walking.	They ran together for a mile.
<b>To score</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To obtain a point, goal etc. in a competitive activity.	When he scored the crowd went wild.
<b>To skate</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To move, or make a particular movement on a surface, using skates,	They skated past the finish line.
<b>To ski</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To move over snow on skis.	She was only happy when she was skiing.
<b>To sprint</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To run as fast as you can over a short distance.	He sprinted over the finish line.
<b>To swim</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To move through water by moving the body or parts of the body,	He swam as fast as he could.

<b>To knock out</b> <i>Translate:</i>	To hit someone so hard they become unconscious.	He was knocked out in the first round.
