The Verb	The Meaning	An example
To buy Translate:	To acquire something by paying a sum of money.	He bought me some beautiful flowers
To pay Translate:	To make payment (for) goods or services.	He paid with his credit card.
To pay back Translate:	To return money borrowed.	He said that he'd pay me back next week.
To purchase Translate:	To obtain goods by payment (often used in business).	The company purchased 200 new computers.
To sell Translate:	To give or hand over (something) in exchange for money.	The company sells a huge range of items.
To sell of Translate:	The sell at a reduced price.	They're selling off all of their old TV's.
To shop Translate:	To visit the shops in search for goods.	Yesterday I shopped all over town for a new dress but couldn't find anything I liked.
To shop around Translate:	To go to different shops looking for the cheapest price or best deal.	We're shopping around for a new fridge freezer, the old has broken.
To spend Translate:	To pay out money for something.	I spent far too much on clothes last week.
	To pass time doing something.	<ul> <li>You spend far too much time on your mobile!</li> </ul>
To pay for Translate:	The act of giving money for something.	He paid for the newspaper with cash.
To sell off Translate:	To dispose of supplies by selling them (usually cheaply).	The cordorouy trousers weren't selling so the manager sold them off cheaply.
To sell out Translate:	To dispose of supplies by selling them completely.	The jeans were so popular that they sold out in 10 minutes.
To try on Translate:	Put on an article of clothing to see if it fits.	I tried a nice dress on yesterday, but it didn't fit.
To try out Translate:	To test to see if something is OK (normally an item)	I'm trying out these new trainers to see if their OK for the running.
