| Go along (with)<br><i>Translate:</i>  | To agree with, to accept   | Alex tends to <i>go along with</i> anything his wife says.  |
| Go away<br><i>Translate:</i>          | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To leave a place.</li> <li>To disappear.</li> </ul>   | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We decided to <i>go away</i> for a few days.</li> <li>I still can't get the stain to <i>go away</i>.</li> </ul>  |
| Go back<br><i>Translate:</i>          | To return.   | Children <i>go back</i> to school after the holidays.   |
| Go by<br><i>Translate:</i>            | To pass.   | Time <i>goes by</i> so quickly!   |
| Go down<br><i>Translate:</i>          | To decrease, reduce.   | The price of property has <i>gone down</i> a bit lately.  |
| Go down with<br><i>Translate:</i>     | To become ill with a disease.  | Half the team has <i>gone down with</i> the 'flu.   |
| Go for<br><i>Translate:</i>           | To try to achieve or attain.   | Jack trained hard and decided to <i>go for</i> the gold medal.  |
| Go in<br><i>Translate:</i>            | To enter.  | There's a hotel. Let's <i>go in</i> and book a room.  |
| Go into (+noun)<br><i>Translate:</i>  | To enter.  | <i>Go into</i> the bakery and see if they sell croissants.  |
| Go into (+ noun)<br><i>Translate:</i> | To join or enter a profession.   | Tom decided to <i>go into</i> the army when he left school.   |
| Go off<br><i>Translate:</i>           | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To explode.</li> <li>To ring/make a loud noise.</li> <li>To stop working.</li> <li>To no longer good to eat or drink.</li> <li>To no longer like or enjoy.</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A bomb <i>went off</i> in the High Street.</li> <li>The alarm clock was set to <i>go off</i> at 6 am.</li> <li>The heating has <i>gone off</i>. | Go out<br><i>Translate:</i>           | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To leave one's home to attend an event.</li> <li>To stop burning; be extinguished.</li> <li>To be sent.</li> </ul>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Many young people <i>go out</i> a lot.</li> <li>The lights <i>went out</i> before we got to the door.</li> <li>The letter <i>went out</i> yesterday.</li> </ul>  |
| Go out with<br><i>Translate:</i>      | To have someone as a boyfriend / girlfriend.   | Is Julie <i>going out with</i> Tom?   |
