Go after Translate:	To pursue (an object or a goal)	Emma <i>went after</i> her dreams and now she is an actress.
Go along (with) ^{Translate:}	To agree with, to accept	Alex tends to go along with anything his wife says.
Go away Translate:	To leave a place.To disappear.	 We decided to go away for a few days. I still can't get the stain to go away.
Go back Translate:	To return.	Children <i>go back</i> to school after the holidays.
Go by Translate:	To pass.	Time goes by so quickly!
Go down Translate:	To decrease, reduce.	The price of property has gone down a bit lately.
Go down with Translate:	To become ill with a disease.	Half the team has gone down with the 'flu.
Go for Translate:	To try to achieve or attain.	Jack trained hard and decided to <i>go for</i> the gold medal.
Go in Translate:	To enter.	There's a hotel. Let's <i>go in</i> and book a room.
Go into (+noun) Translate:	To enter.	Go into the bakery and see if they sell croissants.
Go into (+ noun) Translate:	To join or enter a profession.	Tom decided to <i>go into</i> the army when he left school.
Go off Translate:	 To explode. To ring/make a loud noise. To stop working. To no longer good to eat or drink. To no longer like or enjoy. 	 A bomb <i>went off</i> in the High Street. The alarm clock was set to <i>go off</i> at 6 am. The heating has <i>gone off</i>. It's freezing in here! The milk has <i>gone off</i>. Don't drink it. My grandmother has <i>gone off</i> doing crosswords.
Go on Translate:	To continue.	Sorry for interrupting. Please <i>go on</i> .
Go out Translate:	 To leave one's home to attend an event. To stop burning; be extinguished. To be sent. 	 Many young people go out a lot. The lights went out before we got to the door. The letter went out yesterday.
Go out with Translate:	To have someone as a boyfriend / girlfriend.	Is Julie going out with Tom?
Go over Translate:	To review.To cross (something).	 Please go over your answers. Go over the road and turn right and it's in front.
