Floor cleaning tips for wooden floors

Wooden floors can make the home more beautiful but can also cost a lot of money to put in. Cleaning a wooden floor is also different from cleaning ordinary floors of tile or linoleum. Wooden floors look fantastic if properly maintained and cleaned, and it is important to use the right detergent and tools to keep your fine wood floors stain-free.

To protect your investment, you can either hire a professional cleaning company to clean your hardwood floors, or you can do it yourself. If you do it yourself, it is important that you know which cleaning agent you should use and which tools are the best. Some cleaners can damage and scratch your hardwood floors while the wrong cleaners can grind off the floor paint or leave permanent white stains.

Here are some floor cleaning tips for wood floors. Buy a high quality sweep with soft bristles. Use this to regularly sweep away loose dirt and particles that your shoes bring in from the street. If you leave dust and dirt on your wood flooring for too long, it can cause grief to lie between the floorboards or make your wooden floors look muddy.

You can also use a vacuum cleaner without a turbo nozzle to remove the dirt between the floorboards. A terry mop and cloth can be handy for those hard-to-reach places, like under tables and chairs. Use the cloth for corners where a lot of dust accumulates. You can use a cleaning agent with your mop or cloth after sweeping away any loose dirt from the floor. Use detergents recommended by your wood flooring vendor.

Use detergents that are not alkaline or contain ammonia as they can dull the surface. Avoid oil-based soaps and sprays, such as the ones you use on your furniture. The oil that the floor absorbs can make it difficult to repaint the floor later. Oil can also make the floors slippery and dangerous. Use detergents that do not leave residue on the floor or fold as a film over the surface.

If you need some moisture to clean your floors, use minimal amounts, just enough to moisten the mop and floor surface. Moping your wooden floors with too much water can cause the floor to expand and cause cracks. You should remove stubborn stains and heavy dirt with a damp cloth, not a soaked and dripping cloth. If you accidentally spill liquid on your wooden floor, dry it at once.

To remove heel marks and scratches, use a professional, high-quality wood floor cleaner on a cloth. Many people claim that they clean their wooden floors with a vinegar and water mixture. The tip on cleaning wooden floors with vinegar and water is a hard-to-kill myth. Vinegar contains acid and can remove the natural shine in your wooden floor. Vinegar is also not as effective in floor cleaning as many people think.

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
